Navy coloured khakis also look very classy when paired with a button-down shirt or sports coat.

FLANNEL SHIRTS

Flannel shirts are yet another wardrobe staple available in different colours. Traditionally, flannel shirts existed in the checkered patterns so the rest of the outfit should be kept minimal so that your shirt continues to be the highlight of your outfit.
