## 64 die from road crashes every day

Survey shows 4 leading causes of injury-related deaths -- suicide, traffic accident, drowning, fall

On average, 64 people die every day from injuries suffered in traffic accidents, a

government-supervised survey reveals. The startling figure belies daily media reports of deaths caused by road crashes and shows that such fatalities go grossly underreported.

Findings of the Bangladesh Health Injury Survey (BHIS)-2016, only the second such survey conducted in the country, will be formally unveiled tomorrow.

## Life term means jail until death

Life imprisonment means jail sentence until natural death, Chief Justice Surendra

Kumar Sinha said yesterday. Under Section 57 of the Penal Code, life sentence refers to 30 years' prison

The CJ made the observation while delivering the verdict on the appeals of two convicts, who were sentenced to death by a lower court in a case filed over a 2001 murder in Savar.

the new Election Commission which would like to win public trust by holding free and fair polls. The political parties are looking forward to seeing how

the commission would conduct a series of elections scheduled in the coming weeks.

The first one is a municipal poll in the hill district Rangamati's Baghaichhari this Saturday.

Besides, by-elections to different chairmen and vice chairmen posts of 11 upazilas, by-polls to 4 municipalities and elections to three more upazilas are due on March 6.
