

# fighting terrorism

Dhaka-Berlin joint declaration during Hasina's Germany visit

Dhaka and Berlin are expected to sign a joint declaration to fight terrorism and violent extremism at the summit meeting of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and German Chancellor Angela Merkel in Munich on Saturday.

The PM, who is scheduled to fly off to Germany tonight to attend the Munich Security Conference (MSC), will discuss with Merkel a host of bilateral, regional and international issues.

Foreign Minister AH Mahmood Ali yesterday said the PM and the German chancellor, on the sidelines of the 53rd MSC, will exchange views on development cooperation, trade and investment, mutual cooperation to achieve Sustainable Development Goals, reduction of climate change risk, current refugee and migration crisis in Europe, global terrorism and violent extremism.

The two leaders are also expected to discuss the sudden rise of extreme nationalism and right-wing political forces SEE PAGE 2 COL 4

## Lost in the maze of misfortunes

12-yr-old boy loses limbs falling from train roof; now stays abandoned at hospital

Wanting relief from torture of his stepfather and freedom, the teenage boy left his village in Kishoreganj and came to Dhaka six months ago. That freedom was short-lived as he lost his right limbs in a train accident and is now confined to hospital for having no one to take him home.

The 12-year-old, Robin probably had his

best days in the city playing with other street children and enjoying food and classes arranged by an NGO at Kamalapur Railway Station before the accident swept away all that from him.

On the fateful day nearly three months back, he was going to Gendaria from Kamalapur by train to meet his friends.

"Since I didn't have any ticket or money,
