killing farmer

A court here yesterday sentenced 15 people to life imprisonment for killing a farmer in Mirzapur upazila in 2006.

Judge Waheduzzaman Shikder of Special District and Sessions Judge's Court in Tangail delivered the verdict in a crowded courtroom, Court Inspector Anwarul Islam said.

The court also fined the convicts Tk 10,000 each, in default, they will have to suffer two years more in jail.

The convicts are Illias Miah, 33, Shabaz Khan, 37, Dulal Mia, 56, Babul Mia, 37, Innochh Ali alias Yunus, 51, Mohammad Ferdous, 33, Parvez Mia, 41, Liton Mia, 37, Shahadat Hossain, 39, Noni Mia, 61, Bishu Mia, 61, Delwar Hossain, 46, Babu Mia, 33, Mamun Mia, 36, and Ashraf Ali, 52.

Babu Mia and Mamun Mia were tried in absentia, The convicts Anwarul said.

The court acquitted five beat farmer other accused of the case as the allegations brought Tofazzal proved. They are Tota Mia, Hossain with Jharna Akter alias sticks to death Shamsunnahar, Monakka Bibi, Munsub Ali and Anwar on May 22 in Hossain, he added.

They all hail from Hilora 2006. village under Mirzapur upazila of the district.

According to the prosecution, the convicts beat farmer Tofazzal Hossain, 35, of the village with sticks and sharp weapons on May 22 in 2006 as a sequel to a dispute over a piece of land. Tofazzal died at Kumudini Hospital the same day.

Golam Kibria, younger brother of Tofazzal, filed a murder case accusing 21 people with Mirzapur Police Station the same day.

Police later submitted a charge sheet against 23 people. Three of the accused -- Rafigul Islam, Moni Mia and Akkas Ali -- died during the trial process.

Special Public Prosecutor in Tangail Multan Uddin appeared for the state while advocate Mohammad Shamsuddin defended the accused.

At present, there are a total of 10.2 million women labourers who are directly contributing to the economic development of Bangladesh.

Of them, 77% are from the rural areas. They are playing a vital role in developing agriculture sector and ensuring food security

while staying involved with farming, forestry, livestock rearing, poultry and fishery etc.

There is also the issue of climate

Demise of rare species mole

The authorities have taken initiative to preserve the body of the rare species black mole that succumbed to its injuries on Friday, foiling efforts to save it at Bangladesh Wildlife Service Foundation in Sreemangal upazila of the district.

The mole was injured when locals captured it at Phulcherra village in the upazila on Thursday. The mole's body is being pre-

served in formalin to be displayed at Lawachara forest department office, said Mihir Kumar Doe, divisional forest officer of wildlife and conservation department of the forest department.

The mole is classified as vulnerable on the Red List of International Union for

Conservation of Nature (IUCN) and their population is on the decline, he said.

"The English name of the mole is Himalayan mole or Eastern



mole and its scientific name is

euroscaptor micrura.

"This species, found in Nepal, Bhutan, India and Bangladesh, is very secretive, nocturnal and fossorial. It is purely a forest floor dwelling mammal," he added. Swapon Deb Sajal, director of

Bangladesh Wildlife Service Foundation, said as locals of Phulcherra village in Sreemangal upazila tried to dig into a hole in the earthen wall of one Thomas Nafak's house on Thursday, the animal came out and scuttled across the yard. The mole got injured while being captured by the villagers.

"The mole weighs 100 gram and around 4.5 inches long. It has cylindrical body with a short neck. The mole is black and completely covered by velvety fur, Sajal said.

"It is found in the central and eastern Himalayas usually between an elevation of 1,500 metres and 2,400 metres. It mostly eats earthworms and insects and their larvae," he added.

A housewife was allegedly murdered in her in-law's house at Sadar upazila of the district yesterday.

The deceased was Ruma Akter Meem, 22, wife of Raju Karigor, 25, of Deborkathi village in the upazila. Ruma's maternal uncle Jahangir said his

niece got married with Raju, son of Siddique Karigor, around five years ago. Three years later, Raju got involved in a love affair with another girl. As Meem came to know about the matter a conflict was created between them.

Jahangir also claimed that Raju, a motorbike driver, and his mother Eliza Begum made Meem abort her baby before birth.

Meem's relatives that she had hanged herself from the ceiling of the kitchen. They rushed to the house and found Meem lying on the floor.

Jahangir alleged that Meem's in-laws murdered her. Police from Pirojpur Sadar Police Station

(PS) sent the body to the morgue for autopsy. They also arrested Raju and his parents. Jahangir filed a case with the police sta-

tion yesterday, accusing Raju and his parents, Officer- in-Charge (OC) Md Masumur Rahman Biswas said.

The arrestees will be produced before a court in Pirojpur on Monday, the OC said.






