India's Proposed Defence Pact

Leaving aside several bilateral issues, including the unresolved Teesta water-sharing deal, India has proposed a long-term comprehensive defence pact with Bangladesh that encompasses training, sale of military hardware and wide range of military to military cooperation.

Highly placed official sources said though discussions are still going on, India is expecting to sign a comprehensive, 25-year framework agreement on bilateral defence cooperation during

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's upcoming state visit to India on April 7-10. According to sources, India in its proposed agreement also wants coordinated operations against mutually perceived threats.

Prime Minister of Bangladesh will be visiting India on an invitation extended by Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi, according to a joint announcement made yesterday simultaneously in Dhaka and New Delhi.

Along with the military cooperation agreement, India has also offered a \$500 million line of credit to Bangladesh for the purchase of military hardware, including purchasing of fast patrol craft for the coastguards, radar, and other items for air defence.

Bangladesh, however, is still reluctant to sign such an agreement in the area of defence which India is pushing for. Dhaka is reluctant about such a long-term framework agreement, sources say. Instead it prefers to sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), which would be less formal and would have no time frame.

If history is any indicator, the following five days for Bangladesh are not likely to be particularly happy at the P Sara Oval in Colombo, where Bangladesh's 100th Test will start today from 10:30am Bangladesh time. 0-1 down in the two-match series against Sri Lanka following a 259-run defeat in the first Test in Galle last week, Bangladesh will have to win this match in a venue where they have only known innings defeats in three tries in the past.

The picturesque P Sara Oval was the site of Bangladesh's lowest Test score when they were bundled out for 62 in their last match here in 2007. After the reversal in Galle, a venue where Bangladesh have much happier memories having drawn their previous

## S Korean firm gets block-12

Bangladesh yesterday awarded an offshore block to Posco Daewoo Corporation of South Korea for gas exploration.

Senior officials of Posco Daewoo and Bangladesh's Petrobangla and energy ministry signed a production sharing contract for the deep-sea block-12 in the Bay of Bengal at the headquarters of Petrobangla in Dhaka.

As per the agreement, the two-dimensional seismic survey would begin this year, and based on the outcomes of the survey, the real picture of gas availability could be known by 2019, according to Petrobangla.

Posco Daewoo is also exploring gas at a block of neighbouring Myanmar and has discovered gas reserves last year. SEE PAGE 2 COL 1

### 4 'criminals' killed in 'shootout' with cops

ASK says at least 51 got killed in such 'shootouts' since January 1

With four people killed in a "shootout" with law enforcers in Meherpur yesterday, the number of victims of such extrajudicial killing reached 51 in the first two and half months of this year, amid growing concerns of rights organisations.

Thirty-two people had become victims of "gunfight" in the first three months of last year, according to Ain o Salish Kendra (ASK). The rights body says the total number of victims was 195 last year against 192

in 2015.

Yesterday's "shootout" in Meherpur Sadar took place a week after Law Minister Anisul Huq in a dialogue with UN Human Rights Committee in Geneva reiterated Bangladesh's commitment to make further efforts in realising the civil and political rights of its people.

Those killed in the "gunfight" were former cadres of Lal Pataka, a faction of outlawed Purbo Banglar Communist Party, said police. They are Saddam Hossain, 25, SEE PAGE 10 COL 1

The Supreme Court has once again expressed dissatisfaction at the government failure to issue the gazette notification on the rules determining the disciplines and code of conducts for lower court judges. "The judiciary has been

held hostage by not issuing the gazette," the SC said, noting that institutions are

larger than individuals and they must be protected.

The apex court came up with the observation when Attorney General Mahbubey Alam sought four more weeks to issue the gazette, saying Law Minister Anisul Huq was abroad now. The gazette requires the law minister's approval.
