HAZARIBAGH TANNERIES SC stays HC's compensation order on factory owners

The Supreme Court yesterday stayed until Thursday a High Court order that directed the tannery owners to pay Tk 30.85 crore compensation for polluting the environment and failing to relocate their factories to Savar Tannery Industrial

Chamber judge of the Appellate Division Justice Syed Mahmud Hossein gave the order following a petition filed by the tannery owners seeking stay on the HC order.

The chamber judge also sent the stay petition to the full bench of the Appellate Division for its hearing on Thursday, Barrister Mehedi Hasan Chowdhury, a lawyer for the tannery owners, told The Daily Star.


On March 2, the HC directed 154 Hazaribagh tannery owners to pay the government Tk 30.85 crore within two weeks for polluting the environment, and ruled that the tannery owners will face serious consequence if they don't deposit the money to the state fund in line with its directive.

Earlier in July last year, the Appellate Division ordered that every tannery owner must pay Tk 10,000 a day for damaging and polluting the environment in the area and also ordered the owners to shift their businesses to Savar.

Three people were killed and five others injured in road

accidents in three districts yesterday and the day before. In Brahmanbaria, a day labourer was killed and four others injured as a brick-carrying truck plunged into a ditch beside Comilla-Sylhet highway in Darkhar area of Akhaura upazila in Brahmanbaria yesterday morning.

The deceased was Muktar Miah, 25, of Shahbazpur village under Sarail upazila.

Police said the incident occurred as the driver lost his control over the vehicle.

In Dinajpur, a person was killed and another injured as two goods-carrying trucks collided head-on on Parbatipur bypass road at Britiparamor in Parbatipur upazila early yesterday.

The deceased was Hanif Sheikh, 35, of Kapasia Paschimpara in Rajshahi. He was the helper of one of the trucks.

In Jamalpur, a local journalist was killed as a picnic bus ran him over on Tarakandi-Jamalpur road at Tarakandi intersection in Sarishabari upazila on Saturday night.

The deceased Hafizur Rahman, 32, of Kandarpara village, was a staff reporter of the daily Nobotan, a Jamalpur-based newspaper. He died on the spot, said police.

8 militant suspects held said, adding that they tried to flee after

Police arrested eight suspected militants, including four alleged members of banned militant outfit Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) in Patuakhali, Jessore, and Sylhet yesterday and the day before.

Four suspected JMB men were arrested in Patuakhali's Kalapara upazila, said GM Shah Newaz, officerin-charge of Kalapara Police Station. "The gang might have planned sabotage activities. We are interrogating them for more information," he said.

They were identified as Milon Sikder, 28, and Kamal Hossain, 30, of Pirojpur's Mothbaria upazila, and Babul Khan, 45, and Pappu, 28, of Jhalakathi's Kathalia upazila.

The OC said they came to know that Milon Sikder was a Hindu, and was interrogating him to be confirmed whether he was involved in militant activities.

Police challenged the gang after seeing their "suspicious movement" about 50 yards from the police station, the OC seeing police.

In Jessore's Shankhapur area, three siblings were arrested with Jihadi books on Saturday evening for their suspected links to militancy.

They were indented as Rabiul Islam, 35, and his sisters Maisha Bilkis 40, and Nusrat Parveen, 35. A case was filed.

Meanwhile, the Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) detained a member of banned radical organisation Hizb-ut-Tahrir at his residence in Sylhet city's Khasdabir area.

The detainee is Ashraful Karim Khan,

A press note signed by JM Imran, assistant director (media) of Rab 9 claimed to have seized a huge number of leaflets containing anti-state statements.

The detainee was handed over to In Lalmonirhat's Kaliganj upazila,

police arrested an Islami Chhatra Shibir leader, who is wanted in a sabotage case.

He was identified as Hasanul Haque Banna, 28, president of the Hatibandha upazila unit of Shibir.
