Lanka signals arrests over war killings

Sri Lankan President Maithripala Sirisena said Wednesday he would not protect anyone guilty of murder during the civil war, flagging arrests for a spate of high-profile crimes allegedly perpetrated by security forces. Sirisena said he would not stand by murderers but would defend "war heroes".

Three arrested over Venice terror plot

Three men from Kosovo and an unidentified minor have been arrested in Venice on suspicion of plotting to blow up the city's celebrated Rialto Bridge, Italian police said yesterday. The suspects were detained in an overnight sweep carried out after it was established that they had undergone "religious radicalisation".

Nicaragua restores ties with Israel

Nicaragua has restored diplomatic ties with Israel suspended nearly seven years ago when the Jewish state sent commandos to attack a flotilla carrying humanitarian aid to the Gaza Strip. Nicaragua, which is led by former leftist guerrilla-turned-president Daniel Ortega, also recognizes Palestine as a state.

Amnesty slams Fiji paper seditious case

Seditious charges brought against executives at Fiji's oldest newspaper are "absolutely outrageous", Amnesty International said yesterday, while accusing the government of trying to intimidate the media. Three staff members at the Fiji Times are facing up to seven years in jail for publishing a letter containing inflammatory comments about Muslims.

Xi to meet Trump in Florida

Two leaders will discuss pressing issues including North Korea, South China Sea, trade disputes during April 6-7 summit

Chinese President Xi Jinping will travel to the United States to meet President Donald Trump at his Mar-a-Lago retreat in Florida on April 6-7, China's Foreign Ministry said yesterday, its first official confirmation of the highly anticipated summit.

It will be Xi's first meeting with Trump, whose presidency began on Jan. 20, and comes as the two sides face pressing issues, ranging from North Korea and the South China Sea to trade disputes.

Ministry spokesman Lu Kang made the announcement at a daily news briefing.

He did not give any more details of the meeting agenda, but spoke of the need to see the big picture while fostering mutual interests in trade relations.

"The market dictates that interests between our two countries are structured so that you will always have me and I will always have you," Lu said.

"Both sides should work together to make the cake of mutual interest bigger

and not simply seek fairer distribution," he said in response to a question about trade frictions.

Beijing had previously said that preparatory work for the meeting was underway. But it had not yet confirmed the trip, despite western media reports on a scheduled meeting and an



announcement by the Finnish government that Xi would make a brief stop in Finland on April 5.

The summit will follow a string of other recent US-China meetings and conversations aimed at mending ties after strong criticism of China by Trump during his election campaign.

US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson ended a trip to Asia this month in Beijing, agreeing to work together with China on North Korea and stressing Trump's desire to enhance understanding.

China has been irritated at being repeatedly told by Washington to rein in North Korea's nuclear and missile programmes and by the US decision to base an advanced missile defense system in South Korea.

Beijing is also deeply suspicious of US intentions towards self-ruled Taiwan, which China claims as its own.

During his election campaign, Trump accused China of unfair trade policies, criticised its island-building in the strategic South China Sea, and accused it of doing too little to constrain North Korea.

Trump also incensed Beijing in December by taking a phone call from Taiwanese President Tsai Ing-wen and later saying the United States did not have to stick to the so-called "one China" policy.

Duterte faces impeachment

Philippines MP files charges over allegation of 'defeatist' China stance

A Philippines lawmaker filed supplementary charges yesterday to an impeachment complaint against President Rodrigo Duterte, accusing him of taking a "defeatist stance" by doing nothing to challenge Beijing's activities in the South China Sea.

Opposition congressman Gary Alejano said Duterte had made a slew of remarks that proved he had no intention to protect Philippine sovereignty and had alienated key allies like the



United States through "rants and unstoppable outbursts".

The complaint adds to a laundry list of what Alejano says are impeachable offences that amount to high crimes, abuse of power and betrayal of public trust.

He submitted the initial complaint two weeks ago, just as Congress went into a recess, a move aimed at keeping it in the public spotlight and preventing Congress from dismissing it right away. It reconvenes on May 2.

Duterte is frequently accused of abuse of power, though none of the allegations have so far stuck. The populist former city mayor commands a legislative majority and enjoys huge public support. Presidential Legal Counsel Salvador Panelo said Alejano's additional complaint was groundless propaganda and part of a coordinated conspiracy by Duterte's opponents.

Africans being attacked by mobs in India

Africans living in northern India are locking themselves into their homes after a spate of mob attacks left several people hospitalised.

Five Nigerian students were attacked by crowds and another was beaten unconscious by a mob inside a shopping mall in the district of Noida, near Delhi.

Film of the attack prompted a social media outcry and the victim told local media no one had helped or called the police as he was beaten unconscious with knives and bricks.

Two more African students were assaulted in a separate incident by masked men.

The attacks began after the parents of a local teenager blamed Nigerian students for supplying him with the drugs that caused him to die of an overdose.

Police detained five local Nigerian men on suspicion of drug dealing, abduction and murder, but they were later released after a post mortem failed to confirm an overdose was the cause of death.

Tibetan lama abandons monkhood to marry friend

A senior Tibetan lama at the centre of a long-running row over one of Buddhism's most important titles has abandoned the monkhood altogether after marrying a childhood friend in India, his office said yesterday.

Thaye Dorje, 33, has claimed since childhood to be the reincarnation of the Karmapa Lama, the leader of one of the four major schools of Tibetan Buddhism.

But many adherents of the Karma Kagyu school of Buddhism follow another monk with a rival claim to the title, Urgyen Trinley, who is recognised by the Dalai Lama.

The disagreement has long split Tibetan Buddhists, but yesterday Thaye Dorje's office made the surprise announcement that he had married in a private ceremony in New Delhi on

March 25, and abandoned the monkhood.

"I have a strong feeling, deep within my heart, that my decision to marry will have a positive impact not only for me, but also for the lineage," the statement quoted Thaye Dorje as saying.

"Something beautiful, something beneficial will emerge, for all of us."

Thaye Dorje will continue to fulfil the role of the Karmapa, including by offering teachings and blessings to students around the world, his office said.

His new wife, 36-year-old Rinchen Yangzom, was born in Bhutan and educated in India and Europe.

South Korea's Park arrested over graft

South Korea's ousted president Park Geun-hye was arrested early today over the corruption and abuse of power scandal that brought her down.

The Seoul Central District Court issued a warrant to arrest Park on charges of bribery, abuse of authority, coercion, and leaking government secrets, after a marathon court hearing the previous day.

"It is justifiable and necessary to arrest [Park] as key charges were justified and there is risk of evidence being destroyed," the court said in a statement.

Park will immediately be taken from the prosecutor's office where she has been awaiting the decision into custody in a detention centre near Seoul.

The former leader was grilled for nearly nine hours in court yesterday as a judge deliberated whether she should be arrested.

Looking grim-faced and pale, Park ignored a barrage of press flashbulbs and did not speak when she arrived at the court earlier in the day, nor when she left.

Being taken into custody will be a dramatic step in the disgrace of South Korea's first woman president, and is a key demand of the millions of people who took to the streets to protest against her as the scandal engulfed her leadership last year.

The former president was stripped of her immunity when she was dismissed from office by the country's top court earlier this month. Park, 65, has denied the accusations against her.
