17 Sylhet schools shut for flood

Academic activities at 17 primary schools in Guainghat and Jaintapur upazilas of Sylhet have remained suspended as the institutions are still under floodwater.

Of the schools, 15 are in Guainghat, said Upazila Education Officer Rafiqul Islam.

The institutions include Haidor Government Primary School, Dewgram Government Primary School, Purbo Gurukshi Government Primary School, Lakhinagar Government Primary School, Fatepur Government Primary School, Nijdorgram Government Primary School, Baurbagh Haor Government Primary School, Purnanagar Government Primary School, Shiripur Government Primary School, Kochuarpar Government Primary School, Ghuramara Government Primary School, Sitingbari Government Primary School, Jolurmukh Abadipara Government Primary School and Chutokhel Government Primary School.

Guainghat is yet to start receding as the Guain, Sary and Pyan rivers continued to swell, said the education officer.

Jaintapur Upazila Education Officer Abdul Jalil Talukder said they could not hold classes for the last couple of days as Dultirpar and Diraimara government primary schools were affected by flood triggered by water from the hills.

Upazila education officers have been asked to submit reports on the affected schools as early as possible, Md Nurul Islam, district education officer in Sylhet said.

Md Sirajul Islam, executive engineer of Water Development Board (WDB) in Sylhet, said thousands of people in the low-lying areas of the upazilas are marooned.

Dr Mamun-ur-Rashid, deputy director of the Department of Agriculture Extension (DAE) in Sylhet, said boro paddy and vegetables on over 73 thousand hectares of land in the upazilas have gone underwater.

Hill art camp begins in Rangamati

Illegal building on school land

An influential man building the structure violating court order

An influential man is constructing a two-storied building on a land of government primary school at Saidpur upazila in the district, violating a court order.

Police did not stop the alleged grabber from constructing the structure although Headmaster Profullo Chandra Roy of Choumuhuni Government Primary School gave a certified copy of the court order to them.

School Management Committee President Kamal Ahmed said Profullo donated 33 decimals of land inherited from his forefathers beside Saidpur-Parbotipur road in favour of the primary education directorate to set up a primary school. Profullo started the academic activities as headmaster of the school.

Of the land, the school committee built an academic building and a playground on 29 decimals of land and made a tree garden on four decimals, Kamal said.

One Azharuddin along with his goons started constructing the structure

occupying the garden, he said, adding that the goons felled around 20 trees of mango, jackfruit, mahogany and eucalyptus.

Profullo said he contacted local union parishad chairman in this regard, but he did nothing as Azhar played a vital role in last UP election to make him winner.

Later, on the advice of upazila nirbahi officer (UNO), Kamal filed a case with senior assistant judge's court in February seeking a permanent injunction to stop the work, Profullo said. The court, after hearing both the parties, issued a temporary injunction in favour of the school committee on March 23, he added.

Profullo alleged that Azhar continued construction despite the court order.

Admitting to getting the copy of the court order, UNO Abu Saleh Md Musa Jongi said he asked the OC to take action as per law.

Saidpur Police Station Officer-in-Charge Amirul Islam said he needed a separate court order directing him to take action.

Azhar said he is constructing the building not on school's land but on his own land that he purchased from a successor.

HSC girl dies as scarf gets entangled with wheel

A Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinee died as her scarf got entangled with the wheel of a battery-run auto-rickshaw in Noakhali Sadar municipality yesterday.

The deceased, Nazmun Nahar Raha, 18, was daughter of CNG auto-rickshaw driver Abu Hasan of Sonapur area in the municipality. Raha sat for HSC examination from Noakhali Government Women's College.

Quoting victim's family members, police said Raha was critically injured when her scarf got entangled with one of the rear wheels of the vehicle while she was going to take part in the examination at Noakhali Government College centre in the morning.

Local people rescued Raha and took her to Noakhali General Hospital where the doctors declared her dead, said Officer-in-Charge Md Anwar Hossain of Sudharam Model Police Station.

Hawker beaten dead

A man was beaten to death allegedly by his friends in Chapainawabganj town early yesterday.

The deceased, Yousuf Ali, 40, who used to live in Railbag area in town, was a hawker by profession.

Quoting deceased's family members, Sub-inspector Sirajuddin Sheikh of Sadar Police Station said Yousuf along with his few friends arranged a picnic at a tea stall owned by one Mohammad Manik in

School-College Road area on Monday night.

Around 12:30am, Yousuf locked in an altercation with Manik and Abdul Bari Sanju over a trifling matter.

At one stage, the duo beat up Yousuf mercilessly, leaving him critically injured.

Locals took Yousuf to Sadar Hospital where the doctors declared him dead.

Police detained Manik, 50, and Sanju, 48, yesterday for their alleged involvement in the murder, the SI said.

Over 100 students face uncertainty

Classes are not held regularly in Lalmonirhat Institute of Science and Technology

The future of around 100 students of Lalmonirhat Institute of Science and Technology is now uncertain as their regular classes are not being held for the last few months.

Protesting the matter, the agitating students on Sunday staged demonstration in Batrish Hazar area of the town.

The institution has 165 students and nine teachers. There are two trades -- textile and garments.

Obaidul Islam, a student of textile trade, said they are facing uncertainty regarding completing the course as their classes are not being held regularly for the last few months.

Habibur Rahman, a student of garments trade, said there are some instruments for practical classes but

they have become inoperative as they are not used.

Shafiqul Islam of textile trade said they pay tuition fees regularly but they are deprived of getting proper learning.

Mahbub Hossain, a teacher of the institution, said they are not getting salaries for the last three months, so they do not want to take classes.

"However, the institution's director has assured us that he will pay the dues very soon," he said.

Director SM Sohag Islam said the students are not paying their tuition fees regularly, which makes it difficult to run the institution.

Theoretical and practical classes are being held here regularly, but many students are irregular, he said.

This privately-run institution was established in 2009 and got academic approval in 2012.

Tk 1.64 crore banned drug seized

Members of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) seized contraband drugs worth Tk 1.64 crore in Hakimpur upazila of the district yesterday.

Nobody was arrested during the raid, BGB officials said.

Acting on a tip-off, a BGB team of Joypurhat-20 Battalion raided Basudevpur village in the upazila and recovered 7.20 lakh pieces of different contraband Indian drugs.

A gang of smugglers brought those into Bangladesh from India.

Mostafizur Rahman, commanding officer of Joypurhat BGB-20 Battalion, said the market value of the drugs would be around Tk 1.64 crore.
