## Griezmann plots Real upset

Antoine Griezmann believes Atletico Madrid can inflict the worst possible start to a season defining two-weeks for Real Madrid as Atletico go for a record fourth straight La Liga win at the Santiago Bernabeu.

Griezmann scored the winner last season as Atletico became the first side to ever win away to Real in the league for three consecutive seasons.

"I see us as favourites. I believe in my teammates and the coach," said a bullish Griezmann on Thursday.

Despite their triple assault on the Bernabeu, Atletico have still had to play second fiddle to Real after losing to their city rivals in the Champions League for each of the past three seasons - twice in the final.

Real were also the dominant force when the sides last met in November as Cristiano Ronaldo's hat-trick sealed a 3-0 win.

Zinedine Zidane's men lead Barcelona at the top of the table by two points and have a game in hand on their title rivals with Atletico 10 points back in third.

"We have to win more for the fans than for the points," added Griezmann.

"Madrid played great and caused us a lot

of damage. Now it is a different story. We know it is going to be difficult, but I believe in my teammates. We are more complete now."

Inflicting a damaging blow on Real's bid for the first league title in five years would be some measure of sweet revenge for Atletico.

However, Real have yet to taste defeat at home in La Liga this season.

That record will be put fully to the test over the next fortnight as Barcelona visit on March 23.

In between times Madrid also face old foes Bayern Munich for a place in the Champions League semifinals.

Real captain Sergio Ramos has been Atletico's bête noire in recent times, scoring in both the Champions League finals between the sides.

## Koke robbed at gunpoint

Atletico Madrid midfielder Koke was robbed at gunpoint in a Madrid car park on Thursday evening for a watch reportedly valued at 70,000 euros (\$77,000), police sources confirmed on Friday.

"Yesterday at seven in the evening in a car park in Chamberi (a central district of Madrid) he was in his car and an individual on a motorbike pointed a gun at him and stole his watch," the police source told AFP.

The Spanish international reported the robbery with an investigation now underway.

Widespread reports in the Spanish media valued the watch at 70,000 euros.

Koke has still been included in the Atletico squad for Saturday's Madrid derby against Real Madrid.

## BOA polls today

The elections of the Bangladesh Olympic Association (BOA) will be held today at the BOA House with some 80 councillors voting the office bearers. The polls will open at 9:00am.

The BOA polls have already lost attraction after some vital posts including the president's and secretary general's saw no contest.

Out of the 37 posts, three will remain vacant for the next four years as no fitting councillors for those posts have been found. The president [Army Chief General Abu Belal Muhammad Shafiq Huq], the secretary general [Syed Shahid Reza], two vice presidents [Anjan Chowdhury Pintu and Mahbub Ara Gini], one deputy secretary [Nazib Ahmed] and six executive members from different quotas have already been elected unopposed.

The councillors, however, will have the opportunity to cast their votes to elect three vice presidents, two deputy secretaries, a treasurer and 17 members.

Four candidates are contesting three vice president posts; three candidates will be competing in two deputy secretary posts while two candidates will be in the race for the treasurer's post.

In the executive member posts, 15 candidates will be competing for the 14 posts of Olympic disciplines while four candidates will fight it out for the three Regional Olympic body posts.

## Italian doctor rescues Messi

Lionel Messi "cried tears of frustration" in his battle to beat vomiting urges and muscle problems, says the Italian doctor who claims he revamped the Barcelona striker's lifestyle to maintain his superstar status.

Doctor Giuliano Poser, a sports nutritionist who specialises in optimising muscle performance through the use of specific foods, is credited with helping Messi control violent urges to be sick before games.

And using the principles of kinesiology -- muscle monitoring to access information about a person's well being -- he has also helped the five-time Ballon d'Or winner shake off the nagging muscle issues that had increasingly plagued him in recent seasons. Although the 29-year-old Argentine "struggled to adapt" at first, after regular visits to the clinic in Venice he is now reaping the benefits, says Poser.

"I think he even cried tears of frustration," Poser told Italian newspaper Corriere della Sera on Friday.

"But he's now accepted it. There is no unique formula in kinesiology, but through testing we can see how food intake affects each and every muscle in the body."

Poser says he introduced major changes to Messi's diet, bringing in organic and seasonal foods. Those were just the final touches to a "completely new lifestyle", he claims.

"It's not just a case of changing diet," said Poser, who has also worked with footballers from Serie A sides Udinese and Palermo during a 30-year career.

"We live in a time in which foods contain too many contaminants and that can be seen in energy levels when measuring resistance and recovery."

"You don't become a professional player, and even less a phenomenon like Messi, just for the things you eat."

"Messi can still be Messi. But he has been intelligent because he wants to maintain his current level. He's not happy to be one of the 10 best players in the world. He wants to be number one."

"I see myself as simply making fine adjustments to a powerful supercar by encouraging the use of organic food, raw grains, seasonal fruits and vegetables, extra virgin olive oil, eggs and fresh fish."

Messi began seeing Poser over two years ago, although it has taken time for him to benefit.

## 'Blues won't crack under pressure'

Cesc Fabregas insists Chelsea won't buckle under the strain of Tottenham's relentless pursuit as the Premier League title race ratchets up another notch this weekend.

With just eight games remaining Chelsea are clinging to a precious seven-point lead over second-placed Tottenham, but the Blues are showing a few glimpses of vulnerability.

Antonio Conte's side ground out a barely deserved 2-1 win over Manchester City on Wednesday just days after crashing to a shock 2-1 home defeat against struggling Crystal Palace.

Meanwhile Tottenham have reeled off five successive victories, including an incredible escape act at Swansea on Wednesday when they scored three times in the final minutes to clinch a 3-1 success.

With Chelsea playing on Saturday evening at Bournemouth, Tottenham have the chance to turn up the pressure again by temporarily trimming the lead to four points with a win against Watford at White Hart Lane a few

hours earlier.

Chelsea midfielder Fabregas admits his team have been feeling the heat lately, but he is confident the way they recovered from the Palace setback proved title nerves won't trigger a stunning meltdown in the final weeks of the season.

"The result on Saturday put a lot of pressure on us. We know we still have a good advantage, but this is the Premier League and you don't want to be giving points away, especially at home," Fabregas said.

"We have character. We can bounce back at anything that comes in front of us."

The Premier League era is littered with epic collapses from teams who thought the title was theirs and, with Chelsea needing 18 points to be certain of top spot, Fabregas isn't getting carried away yet.

"We've been saying it since the beginning of the season: it's one game at a time," he said.

"We have to worry about ourselves, not what the others are doing. As long as we keep winning then we don't have to worry."

Tottenham's title hopes looked over until Dele Alli equalised in the 88th minute and Son Heung-Min and Christian Eriksen struck in stoppage time to kill off Swansea.

The wild celebrations from boss Mauricio Pochettino, his coaching staff and Tottenham's players and fans underlined their relief at a result that allows them to continue dreaming of a first English title since 1961.

Having choked last season when they failed to catch champions Leicester in the closing weeks, Pochettino's side are back in the hunt and Tottenham defender Jan Vertonghen said: "Chelsea look very strong but we can't stop pushing and dreaming of the league."

## Sanchez wants to stay

Arsene Wenger believes Alexis Sanchez wants to stay at Arsenal, despite reports the striker could leave the London club if they fail to qualify for the Champions League.

Veteran French manager Wenger, in charge of Arsenal since September 1996, has yet to announce if he will stay with the club when his own contract expires at the end of the season and the Gunners boss was giving little away again on Friday.

But he was rather more forthcoming about the future of 28-year-old Chile forward Sanchez, whose own Arsenal deal expires at the end of next season.

"I believe that basically he wants to stay at the club and it's down to finding an agreement with his agent," said Wenger.

"I think the players first have to see are they happy to the club and after (that) most of the time it's down to finding an agreement, but the finances are involved in it, yes."

Wenger, speaking ahead of Arsenal's match against London rivals Crystal Palace on Monday, was again tight-lipped about his own prospects with the Gunners.


Arsenal last won the Premier League title in 2004 and the pressure on Wenger has intensified this season, with the club often looking as though they will miss out on a top four spot that secures Champions League qualification.

Wenger's side are currently fifth -- four points behind fourth-placed Manchester City but with a game in hand.

City will, however, go seven points clear if they beat struggling Hull on Saturday.

The 67-year-old Wenger has faced calls to quit from some fans' groups unhappy with what they see as Arsenal's repeated inability to sustain a title challenge.

But Wednesday's 3-0 win over West Ham ended with supporters staying behind to



chant his name in a gesture of support for Wenger.

Various attempts Friday to get further clarity from Wenger about his future proved largely fruitless.

Asked if an announcement would come from himself or the club, Wenger simply said: "From the club."

Meanwhile a question that sought to find out if Wenger had any pre-requisites when it came to a new contract deal, saw him say: "No, nothing to add to that."

Arsenal's pre-season plans were mentioned in an attempt to gain some indication that Wenger would indeed be staying on at Arsenal.

But in the manner of a diplomat, Wenger said: "Of course (plans are in place for pre-season). No (that does not indicate he will stay), it's just that I do my job to plan for the future of the club."

"I cannot tell you now (if a decision will be made before the end of the season) because I don't know, I am focused on our next game."
