The High Court yesterday withdrew its earlier order that stayed the functions of 469 committees formed for scrutinising freedom fight-

ers across the country. The HC passed the order following a prayer moved by Deputy Attorney

General Amatul Karim for withdrawing the stay order. DAG Amatul said the

HC on January 23 following a writ petition announced that it stayed the functions of a freedom fighter scrutiny committee.

But, in the order it was mistakenly written that the functions of 470 such committees have been stayed, she said.

Yesterday, the HC modified the order and withdrew the stay orders from 469 committees except for one upazila committee, Amatul added.



Water supply resumes at CU dorms following student protest

Water supply finally resumed at Chittagong University's dormitories yesterday, a day after residential students demonstrated on the campus demanding that the management takes steps to tackle the acute water shortage lingering for at least one week.

The dormitories are getting good flow of water from the afternoon but the water is bearing patches of rubbish, complained students.

With summer hitting hard, the water supply at the dormitories got intermittent. But for the last one week, there was almost no water at most of the hostels.

As a result, some 400 students of Shahjalal Hall who have been struggling in this scorching heat for last

some blocks of the three-storey building padlocked the hall office for 11:00am to 12:00pm on Monday demanding immediate water supply.

Meanwhile, agitating students of the three female dormitories --Pritilota, Khaleda Zia and Shamsunnahar halls -- locked the university's main entrance on Monday night, brought out a procession and staged demonstration in Zero Point area on the campus.

Mirazul Islam, a residential student of Alaol Hall, neither could bathe nor could wash his clothes for the last five days due to water scarcity. He had to buy water for his daily needs.

Like him, around 3,500 residen-

On the other hand, frequent power cuts and summer heat made their daily life even harder, alleged students and teachers.

"For last one month, I had to go outside every morning to freshen up myself", said Imtiaz Ovi, residential student of Shahjalal hall.

"In this hot summer, it is impossible to pass even a day without water. But we had not got water for the last one week even though we submitted a complaint to the authorities concerned", said Syeda Airin Sultana, residential student of Pritilota Hall.

the DMCH are very low," Chong said, adding that "No matter how good the doctors are, burn surgeons will not be able to provide quality service if resources are low."

First phase of Rab launches book interpreting Islam

Rapid Action Battalion yesterday launched a book containing actual explanations of some of the verses from the Holy Quran, which the militants usually use to radicalise youths.

Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal launched the book titled "Misinterpretation of verses from the Quran and Hadith and the correct explanation of those" at a programme in the capital.

In the book launch ceremony, speakers said militancy can be eradicated by rehabilitating and de-motivating the militants, and developing counter-narratives to challenge militant ideology.

The elite force has discovered some documents having false interpretations of the Quran and Hadith from some militant hideouts they have recently busted. With the help of Islamic scholars, the book has been prepared keeping both false and actual interpre-

tations so the people can see the difference. In the book, actual explanation of around 60 verses from the Quran and Hadith has been incorporated. For instance,

5 of Surah (chapter) Taubah of the Quran, says: "Kill the atheists wherever you find

them, once the forbidden months are over." The scholars in the book, however, say the Ayat was actually bestowed centering a special incident -- when infidels in Mecca cancelling peace deal carried out an attack on Banu Khuza community that was in peace agreement with the Prophet Muhammad (SM). The community sought help from the prophet who gave four months time to the attackers to restore peace.

This verse refers to those who would continue to fight after the period of peace. It clearly commands the Muslims to protect those who seek peace and are non-combatants. It is a specific verse with a specific ruling and can in no way be applied to general situations.

Benazir Ahmed, director general of Rab, said the book will soon be translated into English, and it will be available on Rab and police websites so people can be aware of the false interpretations.
