

## Govt hospitals need wheelchair access, sign language readers Roundtable told

Mainstream health services need to incorporate specialised service and facilities for the differently-abled to ensure health access to all, said speakers at a roundtable yesterday.

The entry and exit points of all medical facilities should have easily accessible wheelchair ramps for the physically-challenged and sufficient staff members of the facilities should understand sign language used by the speech-impaired, they also said.

Bangla daily Prothom Alo in association with Centre for Disability in Development (CDD) and the Netherlands-based Light for the World organised the roundtable at the newspaper's office in the capital.

Although many high government officials at the policy level appear cooperative and eager to address the

issues the differently-abled face at medical facilities, not much progress is visible at the grassroots level, complained a number of speakers.

Ibrahim Hossain, a physicallychallenged and a campaigner for people with disabilities in Pabna, said the doctors and other health staff at government hospitals are oblivious to the fact that the differently-abled require special support during treatment.

Head of ENT (ear, nose and throat) department at National Institute of ENT in Tejgaon of Dhaka, Associate Professor Manash Ranjan Chakrabarty, said he several times had difficulty treating persons with speech impairment as he did not have any means to communicate with such patients.

To ensure proper treatment, all hospitals should have adequate health staff with sign language training, he advised.

AHM Noman Khan, executive director of CDD, said, "Everybody wants the people with disabilities get their due rights." It is time to figure out why specialised service and facilities are still not available at medical facilities despite the government's willingness.

Disability rights specialist Lieke Scheewe of Light for the World stressed the need for improving rehabilitation services at hospitals treating the differently-abled.

Prof AHM Enayet Hossain, addi tional director general of Directorate General of Health Services, said a multisectoral initiative is required to ensure treatment of the people with disabilities.

The roundtable was moderated by Abdul Quaium, associate editor of Prothom Alo.

CCD Assistant Director Anika Rahman, among others, also spoke.

### ACC seeks FBI support for training its officials

ing training. At the meeting, Mahmud pointed out several activities of ACC and said they are keen to get FBI's cooperation.

Saying that human trafficking, drug trafficking, money laundering and terror financing are interlinked, he said ACC got allegations that money is being laundered into developed countries, including the US.

In reply to a query, the ACC chairman said the commission is working independently and there is no pressure from any quarters including the government, businessmen and politicians.

Praising the ACC's recent activities, Eaton said the FBI can help the commission by giving basic training to its officials.

salinity and change the temperature of the river water. From the rally, the committee announced that it would hold protest programmes in the districts adjacent to the Sundarbans from April 25 to June 25. On July 25, a human chain will be formed from Shamnagar upazila of Shatkhira

district to Sharonkhola upazila of Bagerhat district. In 2009, Bangladesh and India signed a deal to set up two power plants in Shapmari and Katakhali, nine kilometres

away from the Sundarbans. A total of 1,834 acres of land has already been acquired for the power plants with a capacity of 1,320 megawatt of

electricity. Despite the government's assurance that the plant would not harm the Sundarbans, the Unesco remains firm against the project and on October 20 again requested the government to cancel and relocate it to a more suitable place.



in Dhaka



Association, said the comments made by the secretary are disappointing as he wrongly explained the law. "There is no such provision in the law that states half of the inhabitants must die before

an area is declared a 'Distress Zone'. According to the law, the president can declare an area a 'Distress Zone' or can consult with the local administration in this regard," he said. Boro, the only crop of the haor areas in Sunamganj, has been destroyed due to

incessant rain and onrush of water from upstream rivers, around 15 to 20 days before harvest. Not just the farmers' dream of a good harvest

was shattered, they have been dealt a triple blow with the death of fish and ducks. At the same time, farmers are being forced to sell their cattle as they do not have any fodder to

feed the animals. Most of them are also in debt.
