

ROOPUR NUCLEAR POWER PLANT Under-construction structure damaged in storm

A portion of under-construction infrastructures of 'Roopur Nuclear Power Plant' site in Ishwardi upazila was damaged when a storm swept through different areas of the district on Wednesday night.

The incident occurred as a part of a 32-tonne capacity crane broke down and fell on an under-construction workshop at the site during a storm around 10:00pm, said Ruhul Kuddus, in-charge of Roopur Site Office.

None was, however, injured in the incident, Ruhul said, adding that all the construction work at the site remained closed yesterday for removing wreckage from the spot.

A high official at the site, seeking anonymity, said they were trying to find out whether there was any technical fault behind the crane fall, apart from the storm.

The Russian company, which is constructing the nuclear power plant site in Pabna, has not handed over the wreckage of the damaged equipment yet, the officer added.

Meanwhile, the damage in a moderate storm raised question among the local people about the security measures at the plant site.

"Compared to the previous years, Wednesday's storm was not that massive and that makes us a bit worried," said Rahenul Islam, a resident of Roopur village.

Women's broom procession to arrest rapists

Over 100 women brought out a broom procession at Samudabad bazar yesterday, demanding arrest of two alleged rapists.

The alleged rapists are Sumon and Sirajul Chowkider of Samudabad village.

The processionists said Sumon raped a madrasa girl on April 14 when she went out of her house to respond to the call of nature. The victim filed a case with Rangabali Police Station the next day, accusing Sumon.

On October 3 in 2016, Sirajul attempted to rape a mother of two children when she went out of her house to respond to the call of nature. Hearing the screams of the woman, neighbours rushed to the spot and rescued her, while Sirajul fled the scene.

The victim filed a case with Patuakhali Women and Children Repression Prevention Tribunal in Patuakhali the next day.

Although cases were filed against Sirajul and Sumon, they are moving freely in the area, locals said.

Demand for bridge over Kharia river

Thousands of people of six villages in Phulpur upazila have been suffering for long due to lack of a concrete bridge over the Kharia river.

The villages are Guptergaon, Payari, Grah Payari, Mulakandi, Sutia Payari and Dargi Payari.

"We have been using a bamboo bridge to go to the upazila headquarters and the district town as well," said Khorsheda Akhter, a high school teacher in Guptergaon.

The 160-foot-long bamboo bridge over the Kharia river at Guptergaon Kalighat was constructed eight years ago at the initiative of the villagers at a cost of around Tk 2 lakh, said Payari Union Parishad member Abdul Mazid.

Local people contribute around Tk 50,000 every year for its maintenance costs, he added.

"I and some other people of the area manage the maintenance work through a committee," Mazid said.

Headmaster of Payari High School Ayub Ali Khokon said there are three schools and a madrasa on both sides of the bridge and hundreds of students have to use the

road to reach their institutions.

"Before we made the bamboo bridge, we arranged boat facilities in the rainy season for some 100 children who studied at my school. Hundreds of students studying at different schools and colleges at upazila and district headquarters also use the bridge," said the headmaster.

The area is also famous for rice and vegetable production but the farmers have to sell their produce at cheap rates for lack of easy communication, said farmer Nazmul Haque of Guptergaon village.

Abdul Hamid, another farmer of the same village, said the vegetables produced in the villages are supplied to district headquarters and Dhaka, but they are deprived of fair prices due to lack of a concrete bridge.

Payari Union Parishad Chairman Mafizul Islam said the local people maintain the bridge with bamboos and cash and the union parishad sometimes give support.

If a concrete bridge is built there, the comparatively neglected area will see massive economic development in a short time, the chairman added.

18 date-expired ferries run in Barisal

As many as 18 ferries are running on different routes in all six districts of Barisal division although they have crossed expiry date, causing immense sufferings to passengers.

Of the ferries, six are plying in Barisal district, five in Patuakhali, three in Pirojpur and two in Barguna and Khalakathi each, according to the Roads and Highways Department in Barisal region.

Vehicles on busy Patuakhali-Barisal, Barisal-Pirojpur and Patuakhali-Barguna roads are crossing the ferries round the clock.

Of the ferries, some are running with 315-horse power machines and others with 200-horse power machines at different ghats in the region.

The ferries often come to halt in mid river as the machines go out of order.

Made in England in 1980, expiry date of the machines is already over, said Azam Sheikh, sub-deputy engineer of Patuakhali Road division.

Horse power of each machine is being reduced slowly after 25 years, he said.

Md. Ashraf Ali, a bus driver of Barisal-Kuakata via Patuakhali road, said they have to suffer as Lebukhali ferry service often disrupted due to mechanical problem.

Abul Hossain, a tourist from Dhaka, said "I visited Kuakata by road with my family of four and we had to stay three hours at the ghat as ferry machine went out of order."

Banana trading hampered for lack of market

Commuters of nine northern districts suffer as the growers pile up the fruits on Rangpur-Dhaka highway

The absence of a suitable marketplace for trading of bananas is causing problems for the farmers in the district, although banana cultivation has increased over the years.

Growers pile up bananas at different points on both sides of Rangpur-Dhaka highway, mostly in Chandihara area under Shibganj upazila of the district, on Wednesday and Saturday every week.

Smooth movement of vehicles is hampered due to the traffic jam created by crowds of growers, vendors and purchasing agents, and piling up of bananas on the roadside stretching over two to three kilometres.

Deputy Assistant Agriculture Officer of the Department of Agriculture Extension (DAE) Farid Ahmed said banana cultivation is increasing in 12 upazilas of the district as it is more profitable than other crops like paddy, wheat, jute and vegetables.

Cultivation on 400 hectares of land in summer and 600 hectares in winter was fixed for this year, but over 1,100 hectares of land have been taken under cultivation, he added.

Abdul Wahed, 65, said he cultivated 130 banana trees on 15 decimals of land at a cost of Tk 5,000 and hopes to

get at least 100 bunches of banana, which he can sell for around Tk 20,000.

Banana trader Tarek Ali, 45, of Dubaria village, said they buy bananas from the roadside market and send them to Bogra and other districts.

Bachchu Mia, 76, of Chandihara village, said the government tried to set up a separate market for banana trading on three bighas of land a few

years ago, but the then union parishad chairman did not cooperate.

Firoz Ahmed Rijju said he has leased his land for the temporary market alongside the highway at Chandihara and hoped that a proper marketplace will be set up soon.

Deputy Director (horticulture) of DAE Abdur Rahim agreed that a proper marketplace for bananas is needed.
