Nothing found in massive raid

More than 300 houses in Rajshahi searched for militants

A large team of Rajshahi Metropolitan Police conducted a block raid on some 350 houses in the city's Haragram Purbopara yesterday on suspicion of militant activities.

The raid ended around 7:00pm without any arrests being made and explosives seized.

Ifte Khayer Alam, assistant commissioner of Rajshahi Metropolitan Police (RMP), said the raid was part of their regular anti-militancy drives in the city.

houses in the area, especially those rented out to tenants, he said, adding that they conducted the raid based on tenants' information provided to local police stations by the house owners.

Police said a joint team of Counter-Terrorism and Transnational Crime

unit (CTTC) and Special Weapon and Tactics (SWAT) reached the area around 9:30am and stayed there for about an hour.

Another team of Rapid Action Battalion were also present in the area for an hour, said witnesses.

Cops barred journalists from entering the area and gave some local residents limited access to the area. Law enforcers asked people to stay indoors and not to come out unless there was urgency.

Police set up check posts at every entry points in the area which was virtually made off-limits to outsiders.

Plainclothes policemen kept a close watch on the area since 11:00pm on Tuesday. Around 9:30am yesterday, a large number of cops cordoned off the

CHILD MARRIAGE ACT Spl provision may prove disastrous

Says NHRC chairman

The provision of Child Marriage Restraint Act 2017 allowing underage marriage in "special circumstances" may give rise to an increase in child marriages in the country, said National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) Chairman Kazi Reazul Hoque yesterday.

The government must formulate strict rules to prevent misuse of the section-19 of the law to protect child rights. If rules fail to discourage child marriages, the act has to be amended by omitting the special provision, the NHRC chief said.

He was speaking at a conference on "Regional Action Plan to Combat Child Marriage" jointly organised by NHRC and National Action and Coordinating Group (NACG) of South Asia Initiative to End Violence Against Children (SAIEVAC) at

maverick father Jean-Marie, the former FN leader, and in the election campaign has put neither her party's name nor its trademark flame logo on her posters.

She has repeatedly said the policy platform on which she has stood is hers and not reflective of the FN.

"Tonight, I am no longer the president of the National Front. I am the presidential candidate," Le Pen said on French public television news on Monday.

Le Pen had previously attempted to clean up the party's racist and anti-Semitic image as she tried to appeal to voters on both the left and the right.

Final results from the French presi-

dential election's first round showed that Macron got nearly one million more votes than Le Pen. Macron collected 8.66 million votes, or 24.01 percent, while Le Pen garnered 7.68 million votes, or 21.30 percent, according to the official final count published

For Le Pen, it is the best result ever achieved by her FN party in a French presidential election.

Fillon got 20.01 percent, and left-wing candidate Jean-Luc Melenchon, 19.58 percent of the vote. The other seven candidates were far behind.

French Presidency will take place on 7 May, and Macron is currently thought to be the favourite.

Opening the battle for secondround votes, Le Pen highlighted the continuing threat of Islamist militancy, which has claimed more than 230 lives in France since 2015, saying the 39-year-old Macron was "to say the least, weak" on the issue.

She also said she wanted to talk to Conservative candidate Francois sovereignist Nicolas Dupont-Aignan, who won nearly five percent of the first-round vote and has not said which side he would take in the next.

"His platform is extremely close to The final round of voting for the ours. Patriots should come together to

fight those who promote unbridled globalisation," she said.

Le Pen has promised to suspend the EU's open-border agreement on France's frontiers and expel foreigners who are on the watch lists of intelligence services.

Macron's internal security programme calls for 10,000 more police officers, and 15,000 new prison places, and he has recruited a number of security experts to his entourage.

However, opinion polls over the course of the campaign have consistently found voters were more concerned about the economy and the trustworthiness of politicians.

"Today we're announcing our first prototype of The Flyer, a personal flying machine that will become available for sale by the end of 2017."

Maoist rebels who killed 25 paramilitary troops in an ambush in central India used local villagers as human shields, a survivor said yesterday.

Fatal negligence

To make matters worse, the boilers are operated by people who get no official training.

A boiler is a closed tank in which water is heated. The main function of it is to generate steam for space heating, sterilisation, drying, humidification and power generation.

Boilers were used in the garments industry, auto-rice mills, power plants, paper mills, sugar mills, jute mills, pharmaceutical factories, sea-food processing industry, high-ended hotels, tannery industry and edible oil indus-

And the government's lack of inspection capabilities of this widely used equipment is evident in the string of fatal accidents. At least 17 lives were lost in three

incidents of boiler blasts this year. Thirteen of them died in a single incident in Dinajpur. The Office of the Chief Inspector of

Boilers, a government agency under the industries ministry, comprises one chief inspector, three deputy chief inspectors and only six inspectors -- three in Dhaka, two in Chittagong and the other one for Khulna, Rajshahi and Rangpur

Chief Inspector Mohammad Abdul Mannan told The Daily Star yesterday that, "Physically inspecting all the boilers is impossible. It takes a day to inspect a boiler properly. We have asked the industries ministry for more manpower.

He said apart from the manpower crisis, there was a lack of training institutions for boiler operators.

Usually a boiler lasts 30 years but it largely depends on how it is handled. Mishandling could result in damage to the boiler, significant reduction of its lifespan, and explosion.

The reasons for explosions of boilers include faulty pressure relief valves that releases extra steam pressure, drop of water level below, operational errors, and if the pressure parts of the boils became weak, said officials. An explosion could bring down the
