## Life-saving drug to get pricier

15pc VAT imposed on albumin in addition to 4pc AIT, 5pc advance trade VAT

It's a life-saving drug often prescribed by doctors for patients with serious kidney and liver problems and also for newborns with a blood-related disease.

But to get this already pricey drug called albumin, patients will have to pay more, thanks to the imposition of 15 percent value added tax (VAT) on it on top of a 4 percent advance income tax (AIT) and 5 percent advance trade VAT (ATV).

While proposing a uniform 15 percent VAT in his June 1 budget speech, Finance Minister AMA Muhith said the government would exempt 93 life-saving drugs from 15 percent VAT.

albumin is going to get pricier due to the imposition of 15 percent VAT.

Albumin belongs to the group of medicines known as plasma substitutes. It helps increase the volume of blood in blood vessels by drawing fluid from the body into the vessels.

## May or Corbyn?

Britain votes in shadow of terror, looming Brexit talks; Conservatives seen as retaining power

Britons streamed to the polls for the third time in two years yesterday after a campaign overshadowed by terror attacks and the uncertainty of Brexit.

Prime Minister Theresa May called the vote in April, when opinion poll ratings for her and her centre-right Conservative party were sky high, presenting herself as the strong leader to steer the country through tough negotiations to leave the EU.

Although she is strong favourite to keep her job, Islamist attacks in London and Manchester have put her under pressure over her six years as interior minister, while campaign missteps have dented her reputation as a safe pair of hands.

Labour opponent Jeremy Corbyn, an anti-war campaigner deemed unelectable by a majority of his own lawmakers, has run an energetic campaign, promising change and an end to austerity.
