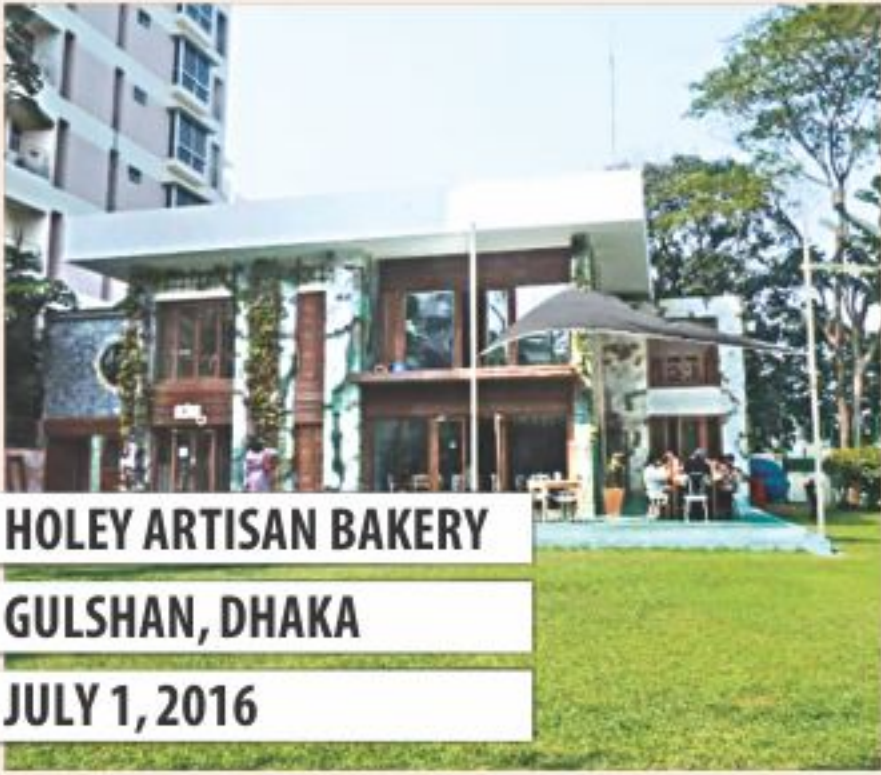




## THE UNFOLDING OF TERROR



**THE VICTIMS**

- 20 hostages, including 17 foreigners killed
- 2 police officers shot dead by militants
- One chef killed and a hotel staffer died later
- 29 police officials injured



**THE ATTACK**

- Attack began around 8:40pm
- There were 5 attackers
- They were equipped with heavy arms, machete and knives

**RECOVERY**

- 3 AK-22 rifles, 79 bullets, 7 magazines, 5 pistols
- 50 bullets, one machete, 3 knives, 200 bullet shells



**OPERATION THUNDERBOLT**

- Army-led operation began at 7:40am (July 2)
- 5 militants, one chef killed
- Operation ends at 8:30am (July 2)

**INVESTIGATION**

- Yet to be completed
- Hunt on for 5 suspects
- 8 more militants who played 'key role' killed in raids later

## Not lullabies, gunshots filled baby's night

Shakhawat and Shaila were about to go home with their newborn from the clinic on July 1. But they decided to prolong their stay at Lake View Clinic to let the new mother and her baby have the nursing care given by the clinic for another day.

But what happened that night was beyond their worst nightmare.

Shakhawat's brother, sister-in-law and one of his friends came to visit them at the hospital with Iftar and Sehri. After breaking the Ramadan fast in the evening, Shaila was feeding the baby and Shakhawat and his brother were chatting on the veranda when the first few explosions in

# Education a mirage for them

Bangladesh has nearly 10m children, adolescents and youths who are not enrolled at school

There are about 10 million out-of-school children, adolescents and youths in Bangladesh, says a new Unesco policy paper.

The country has the fifth highest number of out-of-school adolescents and the third largest number of out-of-school youths in the world.

The total number of out-of-school children (6-11), adolescents (12-14) and youths (15-17) across the globe is nearly 264 million, says the paper, titled "Reducing global poverty through universal primary and secondary education".

It was released last week ahead of the UN High Level Political Forum starting on July 10 in New York. The forum would focus on poverty eradication in pursuit of the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The out-of-school population includes children who were in school but have since dropped out, who were never in school but are expected to enter at a later period and also those who were never in school and are not expected to enroll ever.

The global primary out-of-school rate has remained static for eight years in a row, said the paper, adding that global poverty could be more than halved almost within a generation if all adults completed secondary school.

Data compiled by the Unesco Institute for Statistics (UIS) shows that Bangladesh has 7.1 million out-of-school youths, the third highest in the world after India (46.8 million) and Pakistan (9.8 million).

There are two million out-of-school adolescents in Bangladesh, fifth highest in the world with India (11.1m), Pakistan (5.4m), Ethiopia (4.6m) and Indonesia (2.2m) topping the first four slots in the category.

With 0.8 million children (primary age-level) out-of-school in the country, Bangladesh fared comparatively better in this category compared to higher numbers in the adolescent and youth categories.

## ONE YEAR OF GULSHAN ATTACK

# Successful crackdowns, incomplete probes

Though law enforcers could eliminate a number of militants through counterterrorism operations over the last one year, they are yet to complete probe into any of the incidents.

A massive crackdown on militant networks was launched following the deadly terror attack at Holey Artisan Bakery in the capital's Gulshan on July 1 last year.

In at least 20 anti-terror drives since then,

67 militants either died in police shooting or blew themselves up by detonating suicide vests. Besides, 128 suspected militants were arrested.

Officials say the investigations could not be completed as identities of many of the dead are still unknown.

The unidentified militants include one of the nine killed in the Kalyanpur raid on July 26 last year and four out of the seven killed in Gazipur's Patartek on October 8 last year.
