**CHINESE REFS SNEAK ATTACKED**

A group of at least 10 people attacked a team of match officials following a controversial draw in China's League One, the Chinese Football Association (CFA) has said. The referee and his assistants were assaulted in their hotel room shortly after the power to the room had been cut off. The CFA says they were left with injuries to their heads, waists and legs. A police investigation has reportedly been launched. A spokeswoman for the CFA said: "At about 22:30 [local time] after the match, the electricity of the room where the referees were resting was cut off. At about 23:10, at least 10 people broke into the room and started beating up the four referees, who were left with injuries to their heads, waists and legs." The incident comes in the wake of a controversial match between Baoding Rongda and Wuhan Zall, which was played out last Saturday.

## Federer, Djokovic get free passes

Roger Federer and Novak Djokovic barely had to break sweat to make winning starts at Wimbledon as their injury-hit opponents retired hurt from their first round

matches on Tuesday.

Federer is chasing a record eighth Wimbledon title and he was already well on top at the start of his 19th All England Club campaign when Alexandre Dolgopolov was forced to quit with an ankle injury.

The world number three raced into a 6-3, 3-0 in 43 minutes on Centre Court before the Ukrainian limped off.

Federer, who hit his 10,000th career ace in the eighth game of the first set, will face either Dusan Lajovic of Serbia or Greek qualifier Stefanos Tsitsipas for a place in the last 32.

"It feels great to be back on Centre Court," said Federer, who recorded his 85th match win at Wimbledon, passing the mark he shared with Jimmy Connors.

Djokovic, a three-time Wimbledon champion, was leading 6-3, 2-0 when Slovakian world number 47 Martin Klizan retired after just 40 minutes on Centre Court due to a calf problem.

The 30-year-old Serb will face Adam Pavlasek of the Czech Republic for a place in the last 32.

It was the kind of trouble-free first round Djokovic would have been hoping for after the most turbulent period of his career, the 12-time major winner losing in the Australian Open second round and the French Open quarter-finals.

With defending champion Serena Williams sidelined while she prepares to give birth to her first child, the race to win the women's title is the most wide open in a generation.

World number one Angelique Kerber, the 2016 Australian and US Open winner, is

among the favourites after reaching last year's final, which she lost to Serena.

The German has failed to maintain that form this season and her poor run culminated in an embarrassing French Open first round loss to Ekaterina Makarova last month.

But the top seed showed glimpses of her best form as she saw off American qualifier Irina Falconi 6-4, 6-4 in 87 minutes on

Australia's Bernard Tomic said he had lost his "respect" for tennis following his lack-lustre 6-4, 6-3, 6-4 loss to Mischa Zverev.

French 22nd seed Richard Gasquet slumped to a 6-3, 6-4, 5-7, 6-2 loss against Spain's David Ferrer.

Former French Open champion Garbine Muguruza, the 14th seed, defeated Russia's Ekaterina Alexandrova 6-2, 6-4.

## BFF ramps up training

The Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) has sped up its plans to prepare for the upcoming SAFF U-15 Championship and will begin training from Friday after holding a one-day trial today at the Birsreshtha Shaheed Mostafa Kamal Stadium.

BFF president Kazi Salahuddin instructed technical director Paul Smalley and coaches' education coordinator BA Jubair Nipu to immediately arrange a training camp on Monday, the day The Daily Star ran a story titled 'BFF struggles to break old habits'.

The article focused on how the BFF failed to maintain a four-year plan on training schedules ahead of tournaments such as the SAFF U-16 Championship, which has been revised to the U-15 Championship this year.

The game's governing body's initial plan was to start training the team in late July, leaving them with only two weeks to prepare for the championship, scheduled to begin in Nepal on August 18. However, the revised schedule will see the boys get at least five weeks time to prepare their title defence.

"As per the instructions from the BFF president, we are going to conduct a one-day trial tomorrow [Wednesday] with over 50 players who have been selected earlier from the ongoing Pioneer Football League, Development Cup and Mokh Cup and around 10 players will come from outside those tournaments," said Nipu yesterday.

"We will pick up some 25 to 30 players from the trial and later some selected players from the NSC talent Hunt programme will join the final training starting from Friday," continued Nipu, adding that the BFF president would decide the final venue, which will likely be Khulna BKSP, for preparation.

Europa League holders United depart for their pre-season tour of the United States on July 9, where they will face Real in Santa Clara before taking on the Champions League winners in the UEFA Super Cup on August 8.

Former Juventus forward Morata netted 20 times in all competitions last season in 17 starts, giving him the best goals to games ratio of Real's forwards.

He also developed a knack for grabbing vital goals.

## Venus sobs over fatal car crash

Venus Williams broke down in tears during a Wimbledon press conference on Monday when she was asked about her involvement in a fatal car crash.

Williams is being sued by the estate of an elderly Florida man who died last month after his vehicle was hit by a car driven by the American star.

The 37-year-old is accused of running a red light, inattentive driving and negligent operation of a vehicle, leaving Jerome Barson with a fractured spine and numerous internal injuries before his death several weeks later.

After her 7-6 (9/7), 6-4 victory over Elise Mertens in the Wimbledon first round, world number 11 Williams was repeatedly asked about the incident by the media and eventually became so emotional she began to cry.

"There are really no words to describe, like, how devastating and -- yeah. I'm completely speechless. It's just..." Williams said.

The five-time Wimbledon champion held her head for several moments and asked to leave the room before returning, still visibly shaken, to finish the interview

## Mezbah to carry Bangladesh flag

Bangladesh's fastest man Mezbah Ahmed will carry the national flag during the inaugural ceremony of the 22nd Asian Athletics Championships, which gets underway today at the Kalinga Stadium in Bhubaneswar, India.

The Bangladeshi athletes were afforded a rare opportunity to properly prepare for the meet in India over the past two weeks as the Indian Athletic Federation provided training facilities to neighbouring athletes. Approximately 18 athletes will compete in 13 different events which includes four events in the women's section. Despite there being hardly any hope of winning a medal from the four-day tournament, the athletes are focused on simply improving their individual bests.

The Bangladesh contingent consists of Mezbah, Shah Imran (100m sprint), Shariful Islam and Masud Rana (200m sprint), Ismail Hossain and Al Amin (Long Jump), Masud Khan (110m hurdles), Khandakar Kibria and Kamrul Islam (800m sprint), Sajjad Hossain (Javelin Throw), Mahfuzur Rahman (High Jump), Hedayet Hossain (Hammer Throw), Alamgir Hossain (800m run), Sohagi Akter and Susmita Ghosh (100m sprint), Sumi Akter (800m run), Jesmin Akter (100m hurdles) and Sumi, Sohagi, Susmita and Jesmin (4X100m Relay).

**Ginter switches to M'gladbach**
