Two more sued under section 57

Two persons including a journalist were sued under section 57 of ICT act on Thursday night in Pirojpur. They are Ajmol Haque Helal, senior reporter of daily Shokaler Khobor and former vice president of Dhaka Reporters' Unity, and Nurul Amin Rasel, a local from Mathbaria upazila of the district. They were sued over making comments on Facebook about a local lawmaker, said Bikash Chandra Dey, sub-inspector of Mathbaria Police Station. On Thursday night, Faruk Hossain, a lecturer of Dr Rustom Ali Farazi College, founded by Pirojpur-3 constituency lawmaker Rustom Ali Farazi, filed the case with the police station. Bikash, also the investigation officer of the case, said on Wednesday, Helal and Rasel made unpleasant comments on their Facebook accounts against Rustom Ali. So, Faruk Hossain filed the case, he said. On Tuesday, locals brought out a procession against Rustom Ali Farazi for allegedly embezzling Tk 30 crore of the LGED without doing any development work in the constituency. Both Helal and Rasel commented about the allegation and posted photographs of the procession on Facebook. Contacted, Helal said the news on the procession against Rustom Ali was published in different media. "I just made a comment over the issue as a citizen of a free nation." "I pray for the intervention of the prime minister to scrap section 57 to save journalists and others from harassment," he said. The IO said they were investigating the matter.



NEGLECT UNFATHOMABLE

As if the development of Jatrabari, the eastern gateway of the capital, has been traded off against the construction of Mayor Hanif Flyover in the area. Over Tk 200 crores of taka had been spent on the modern flyover. But the authorities appear to have turned a blind eye to its due maintenance through developing and managing infrastructures around it. (1) In the absence of any functional waste management system, shopkeepers from the nearby wholesale kitchen market have turned the void beneath the ramp of the flyover into a garbage dump. (2) People cross knee-deep murky water on the dilapidated road between the flyover and the market. (3) More than half of the road remains unusable with waste from the market, large ditches and parked trucks. (4) The free-moving exit ramp of the flyover (on right) and the congested portion of the road that is virtually a truck stand now.

Bibir Pukur lies neglected

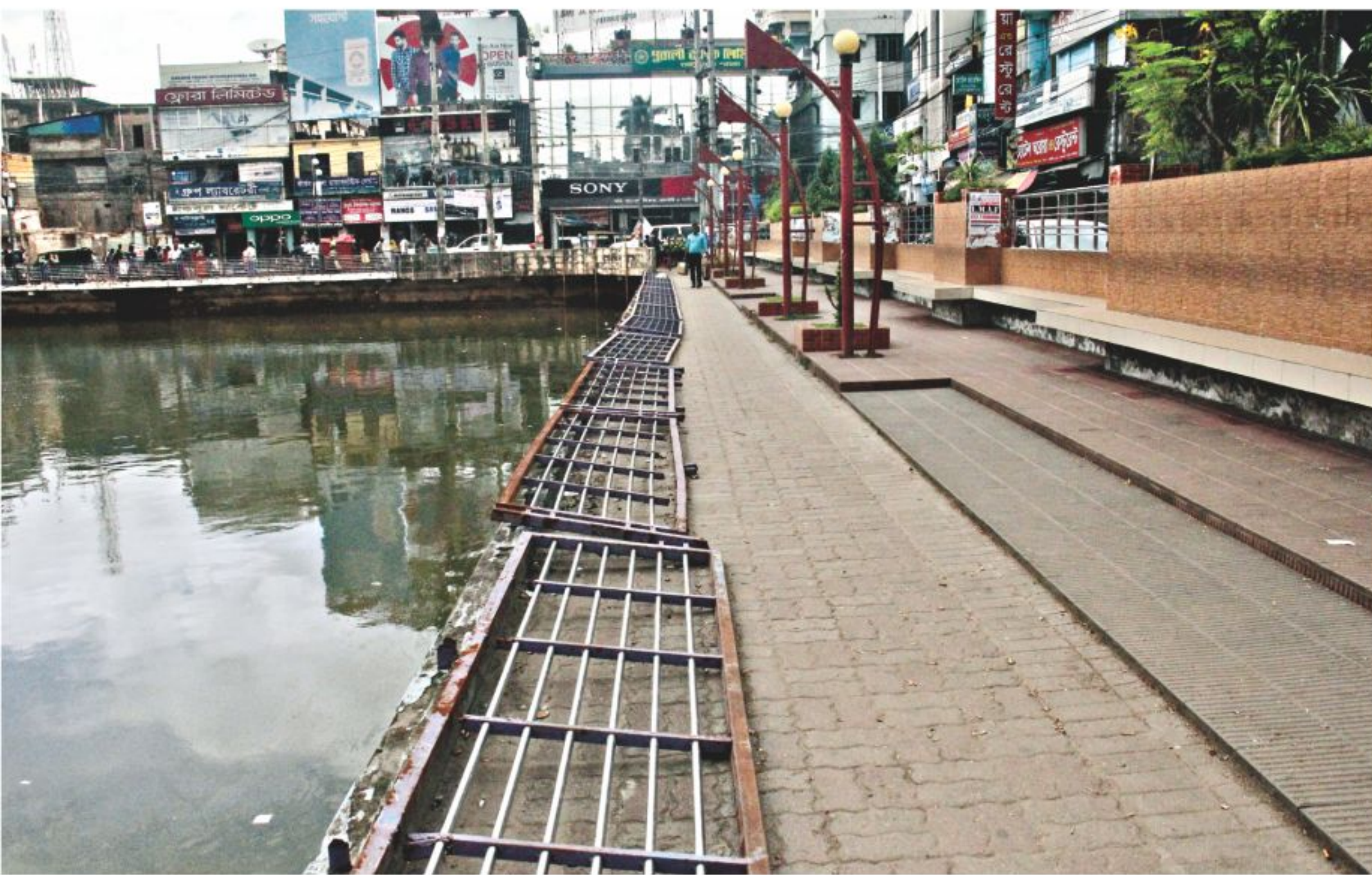
Located in the heart of Barisal city, the 200-year-old Bibir Pukur remains in an awful state due to negligence of the authorities concerned. Even a portion of the boundary grille of the pond had collapsed around a year ago, but the authorities are yet to start its repair work. While visiting the area recently, it was seen that most of the fountains beside the reservoir have been damaged and the collapsed grille remained unfixed. "Due to the damaged grille, we don't use the walkway anymore," said Rebeka Sultana, a resident of the area. Nurul Alam Farid, an elderly resident, echoed her. Back in August 2016, a heavy billboard was set up near the banks, which fell on the grille due to heavy wind. The billboard ultimately blocked the walkway and ruined the beauty of the pond owned by the Barisal City Corporation (BCC). Though the billboard was eventually removed, the fence is yet to be repaired. In 2012, a beautification project for the reservoir was undertaken at a cost

of Tk 1.1 crore. Fountains, fences and walkways were built surrounding the pond for the city dwellers and for its protection. The pond, located near the Sadar Road (Ward-17), is not just a recre-

ational place for city dwellers, it is also a part of their heritage, said many of the locals. The legend goes that during the middle of the 18th century, Jannat Bibi, adopted daughter of missionary William Carey, one of the scholars who tirelessly worked for the improvement

of Bangla prose, took the initiative to dig up the reservoir. Jannat wanted people of the city to have a source of drinking water. But due to a lack of proper maintenance, the over two-acre pond is now in death throes. Akkas Hossain, a freedom fighter, said, "The water has become toxic as people continue to dump waste in it." Linkon Bayen, Barisal district unit co-coordinator of Bangladesh Environmental Lawyers Association, said, "Except for monsoon, the pond remains a dirty water body. The water also emits bad odour." Aktaruzzaman Hiru, councillor of Ward-17, said the BCC is working to restore the pond. They have already stopped leasing out the water body for fish cultivation. Contacted, BCC Mayor Ahsan Habib Kamal said, "A project has been finalised to revive the water body. We are awaiting approval of the department of local government in this regard." When asked about removing or repairing the damaged grille fence, the mayor reiterated his previous statement.

Govt to train over 500 IT managers to boost sector

The government is going to launch a programme, "Advanced Certification for Management Professionals (ACMP)", to train over 500 mid-level managers of IT firms to boost the country's ICT sector.

Officials said the government has engaged UK-based Ernst and Young (EY) to launch ACMP on August 10 in partnership with leading academic institutions of Bangladesh. The World Bank-financed Leveraging ICT for Growth, Employment Governance (LICT) Project of Bangladesh Computer Council (BCC) of ICT Division has appointed the EY in this regard, the officials said.

State Minister for ICT Zunaïd Ahmed Palak said the EY has been asked to make a partnership with leading academic institutions of the country to launch the ACMP for enhancing skills of the managers. "Reputed academic institutions' partnership with their international counterparts will be a quick win for the industry," the ICT state minister said. The training will be held on social, mobile, analytics and cloud (SMAC), networking and security, big data analytics, enterprise resource planning (ERP), customer relationship management, robotics, artificial intelligence (AI) and internet of things, project management, customer management, people management skills, said Bidyut Thakur, EY project director of business advisory services.

LICT Project Director Md Rezaul Karim said the ACMP programme will cover 200-hour training for each batch.

Dr Humayun KMA Hye, a language movement veteran and a freedom fighter, died from cancer in a UK hospital on Thursday night. He was 87.

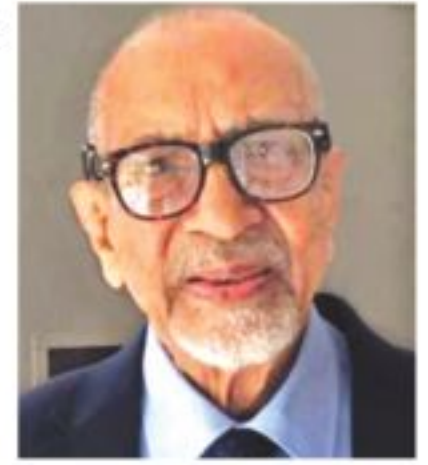
He breathed his last at 11:45pm at the hospital in Manchester, said a press release.

He left behind a daughter, a son and a host of relatives and admirers to mourn his death.

His body will be brought to the country soon and will be buried beside his wife's grave at Banani graveyard.

Huamyun played a significant role during the Language Movement in 1952, and later took part in the 1971 Liberation War as a medical officer of Z-Force, said the release.

All of his friends, relatives and well-wishers are requested to pray for the salvation of the departed soul.



Fire at Railway Bhaban doused
