Felicity Jones is attached to star in an untitled pitch that's inspired by the classic ballet "Swan Lake."

"A Bigger Splash" helmer Luca Guadagnino is on board to direct with Kristina Lauren Anderson penning the script. Several major studios, including Paramount and Universal, are among the bidders for the property, which went on the market right before the Fourth of the July week-



end.

Mandeville Films is producing, and WME is representing the hot film package.

"Swan Lake" follows Odette, a princess that is turned into a swan by an evil sorcerer's curse. The new take will not involve any ballet but will instead use the story as the centerpiece for a major studio tentpole.

Jones starred in "Star Wars" spinoff "Rogue One" and "A Monster Calls" this past fall. Guadagnino's latest film, "Call Me by Your Name", starring Armie Hammer, was a breakout at Sundance and is set to be released by Sony Pictures Classics on November 24.

Abu Sayeed completes
"Ekjon Kobi'r Mrittu"
A crowd-funded film about
a man's love for nature

Abid Haider is a nature-loving poet with an existential crisis: he cannot do stargazing due to a thick grey coating caused by air pollution that covers the night sky over Dhaka. He feels it is his right not only as an individual but that of his generation to enjoy the hilt a star-studded sky.

Haider wants nature free from pollution but his desire goes beyond that: he wants unhindered communication with the stars and the universe. This is a non-negotiable demand for the poet who sticks to it even after his death.

This, in short, is the story of award-winning director Abu Sayeed's crowd-funded feature film "Ekjon Kobi'r Mrittu" that stars veteran actor Jayanta Chattopadhyay in the role of the poet, and Irina Sultana in the role of 'Death'.

The work on the country's first crowd-funded feature film is over, and will soon be submitted to the Censor Board for clearance, Sayeed tells The Daily Star. He adds that he also has plans to send it to the international festival circuit along with the release in Bangladesh.

Chipping in with money ranging from Taka 100 to Taka 300,000, more than four thousand people from different strata of society have

contributed to the making of the film since October 2015.

The filmis "slightly surrealistic and experimental in nature," says Sayeed, who earlier made six feature films and short films. Some of them, like "Kittonkhola" and "Nirontor" have won win national and international awards.

"Ekjon Kobi'r Mrittu", whose story and script is written by the director himself, was extensively shot in Dhaka and its adjoining areas, Sirajganj, on the highway from Sirajganj to Bhandabari village in Bogra.

Asked if concerns over environmental pollution inspired him to make the movie, Sayeed says it was one of the reasons but the bigger motivation was to explore a person's intimate links with the universe and how he or she communicates with it.

"That is why my film shows the poet trying to communicate directly or indirectly with the nature and the universe even after his death," said the director, adding "I have attempted a new manner of presentation."

Sayeed said one-fourth of the shooting of another of his crowd-funded films, "Sanjog", that began in the year 2016 is also completed, and the rest would be completed soon. The director is also working another feature film "Dressing Table".

The band shared the latest track off the forthcoming "Kaleidoscope" EP on Thursday, announcing that all proceeds will go to Migrant Offshore Aid Station (MOAS), an international non-governmental organization that rescues migrants and refugees at sea in the Mediterranean.

The new song was co-written by Brian Eno and co-produced by Eno and Markus Dravs. The accompanying lyric video was directed by Diane Martel and Ben Jones and acts as an apt metaphor for migrants around the world who have been forced to flee their homelands.

"Kaleidoscope" is set to be released digitally on July 14.
