

# Ex-judge Joynal gets anticipatory bail

The High Court yesterday granted an anticipatory bail to Justice Joynal Abedin, a retired judge of the Appellate Division, for six weeks in connection with a notice issued by the Anti Corruption Commission in 2010 seeking his bank statements.

Yesterday, the HC also issued a rule asking the government and the ACC to explain in four weeks why Justice Joynal should not be granted regular bail in connection with the ACC notice. The HC came up with the order after hearing a petition filed by Joynal seeking anticipatory bail fearing arrest by the ACC.

## 100 FFs to get free treatment in India

Hospitals in India will provide free medical treatment to 100 freedom fighters of Bangladesh each year.

Harsh Vardhan Shringla, high commissioner of India, said this in Khulna yesterday at "Muktijoddha Scholarship Award Ceremony" organised by the Indian high commission and Muktijuddho Academy.

During the programme, he also announced that the freedom fighters wishing to travel to India from now on will be eligible for five years' multiple entry Indian visa. An assistant high commission of India will be opened in Khulna soon, he added.

A total of 30 students from Khulna region received scholarship cheques from the high commissioner yesterday.

The Indian high commissioner said India is constructing a railway line between Khulna and Mongla and it wishes to develop the Mongla port.

Dr Mashirul Rahman, economic affairs adviser to the Bangladesh prime minister also spoke.

are becoming increasingly unreliable.

The country's plan to increase reliance on subsidised coal-fired generation is almost entirely dependent on imported coal and would increase energy security risk, reads the study.

If Bangladesh were to concentrate instead on utility-scale solar development (which means sending the solar power to the national grid) and energy efficiency, complemented by some imported coal-fired power and hydro-electricity, problems with over-reliance on gas and imported coal supply can be minimised, the study finds.

Regarding the space constraint, Simon said notwithstanding the challenges of limited land, utility-scale solar power had considerable scope so long as it was pursued with sensible planning policies.

If Bangladesh were to set an ambitious target of 10,000 megawatts of utility solar power by 2025, it would require only 20,000 hectares of land, he added.

Columnist Syed Abul Mokuds yesterday urged the government to adopt a people oriented and environment friendly energy policy.

"The state is not a business organisation. We don't want that they will make profits from electricity," he said.

There is a relationship of environment with electricity; if increasing the capacity of electricity destroys the environment, there will be an imbalance in the society, he said.

Architect Mobashwer Hossain and joint secretary of Bapa Sharif Jamil addressed the programme, which was presided over by Badrul Imam, a geology professor at Dhaka University.

another 16 countries before heading back home after a year and a half on the trail.

"I was missing my son and there was a big festival in Nepal; therefore, we could not resist heading back home," said Ajit.

He resumed the journey in June this year with support from a Nepalese NGO named "Dirghayu Nepal". But Amrit withdrew himself from it to continue his education, said Ajit, adding that three others -- Surendra, Saroj and Yam -- had joined him in the meantime.

With the motto "Save the environment to save the world & awareness against drug addiction", the four-member cyclist team entered Bangladesh through Benapole border and had travelled through Madaripur, Pabna, among other places. They reached the capital via Gabtoli.

In Dhaka, the team participated in a clean-up programme at Osmani Uddyan and took part in a human chain programme against chikungunya -- a viral disease that is being spread by Aedes mosquitoes.

While talking with this correspondent, Ajit never forgot to deliver the message they are up to.

"...Bangladesh and Nepal are connected. If the snowcaps of the Himalayas melt due to rising temperature, many parts of Bangladesh will go under water," he said. "Try and ride a bicycle once a week and you will see what a big change you can bring. Burn fat and not fuel!"

The group will leave Bangladesh for Myanmar tomorrow.






