11-disc Bowie box set to be released

David Bowie's Berlin Trilogy and other albums from that era will be the focus of the late singer's upcoming collection "A New Career in a New Town", a massive 11-CD box set that spans Bowie's catalog from 1977 to 1982.

Like its predecessors – 2015's "Five Years" and 2016's "Who Can I Be Now?" the set features remastered albums – "Low", "Heroes", "Lodger", "Scary Monsters (and Super Creeps)" and the live LP "Stage" – alongside some hard-to-find and unreleased material.

Due out September 29th, the new box set also features a disc dedicated



to producer Tony Visconti's 2017 mix for "Lodger", a 2017 version of "Stage" with two unreleased live tracks from the performance and the previously unavailable "Heroes" EP, which houses Bowie's French and German language versions of his landmark single.

The box set will be available as both an 11-CD, 13-LP or digital release. The physical releases are accompanied by a hardcover book featuring unseen Bowie photographs; unearthed Duffy photos from that session and more.

"Yeti Obhijan" will hit the big screen on Durga Puja. The Bangladesh-India joint venture will feature Mim alongside Prosenjit. The final scenes of the movie were filmed in Switzerland.

The actor also paired up with Moushumi and Bappi in "Dulabhai Zindabaad", for which filming and dubbing has been completed recently. Mim will also be seen alongside Indian actor Om in "Pashan".

"All four films have very different storylines, which will offer viewers diversity in my work. It has also given me the opportunity to showcase many sides of myself, which was immensely enjoyable," said the actor.

Mim's last big screen venture was the Valentine's Day release "Bhalobasha Emoni Hoy".

New TV drama series "Lamppost", that premiered on Banglavision this past Thursday, continues to air tonight on the channel at 9:45pm. Written and directed by veteran television director Sagar Jahan, the series boasts a powerhouse cast including Mamunur Rashid, Rahmat Ali, Mosharraf Kaim, Tareen, Badhon, Sabila, Marzuk Rassel, Saberi Alam, Kochi Khondokar and others.

The story is set in the '90s Dhaka, where a group of people come to the city with big dreams in their hearts. These people – poets, actors, writers and artists – all come together under a lamppost, and their journeys takes the story forward.

The play airs Thursday through Saturday at 9:45pm on Banglavision.

SNL, Westworld lead 2017 Emmy nominations

HBO's "Westworld" and NBC's "Saturday Night Live" (SNL) tied for the most nominations for the 2017 Emmy Awards, earning the most with 22 each.

HBO's drama scored with viewers, averaging 12 million per episode across all its platforms — the most ever for a freshman series on the cable. It's been renewed for a second season, though no premiere date has been announced.

NBC's veteran sketch show "SNL" similarly enjoyed a ratings surge this season, fueled by the swirl of headlines from the election and the Trump Administration, and star turns from Alec Baldwin as Donald Trump and Melissa McCarthy as Sean Spicer (both were nominated). This past season ranked as its most-watched in 23 years.

Netflix's freshman hit "Stranger Things" landed 19 nominations, including for best drama, supporting actress Millie Bobby Brown, and supporting actor David Harbour, among others. "Feud: Bette and Joan" also nabbed 18 nods, thanks to lead actresses Jessica Lange and Susan Sarandon and its supporting cast

(Judy Davis, Jackie Hoffman, Alfred Molina and Stanley Tucci).

HBO topped the list of networks with 111 nominations, followed by Netflix in second at 91, powered by "Stranger Things" and "The Crown" - which got 13 nominations including best drama. NBC jumped to third place with 64, thanks to the freshman drama "This Is Us" and "Saturday Night Live," while FX dropped to fourth place at 55.

FX's critically adored "Atlanta" was the only new comedy to break into that series race. The acting races on the comedy side got an infusion of new nominees, with FX stars Pamela Adlon ("Better Things") and Zach Galifianakis ("Baskets") joining otherwise stable slates.

Stephen Colbert, host of CBS' "Late Show", will host the Emmy Awards live from the Microsoft Theater in Los Angeles on September 17. The ceremony will air live on CBS.

Actor Annu Kapoor plays the title role in the film, written and directed by Om Puri's first wife Seema Kapoor.



Om Puri, a Padma Shri award winner, died of a heart attack in January at his residence here. He was 66.
