Relief still scarce

*Complain flood victims,
situation mostly unchanged
in north districts*

With the flood situations unchanged in most of the northern districts and the central region being inundated, many affected people from Bogra, Sylhet and Kurigram complain about insufficient relief.

Different chars under three upazilas of Faridpur were inundated yesterday as the Padma was flowing 21 centimetres over the danger level at Goalanda point. Reports from Manikganj say the water level in all rivers is rising.

The overall flood situation improved a little in Jamalpur and Kurigram and remained static in Sirajganj, Gaibandha, Lalmonirhat and Bogra, report our district correspondents.

According to the latest bulletin of Flood Forecasting and Warning Centre of Bangladesh Water Development Board, the Padma and Kusiyara rivers were rising yesterday and the water levels of the Brahmaputra, Jamuna and Surma were falling.

The bulletin said the Padma might continue rising for the next 48 hours and the Kusiyara for next 24 hours. The Surma might remain steady and the Brahmaputra and Jamuna might witness decline in the next 72 hours, added the bulletin issued at 9:00am yesterday.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said she would not hand over the country's assets to others for greed of power.

She was addressing a darbar of the Special Security Force (SSF) marking its 31st founding anniversary at the Prime Minister's Office.

Referring to formation of the government after the 2001 parliamentary elections, she said there was a notion that Bangladesh was floating on natural gas and it would have to be sold.

Rail links with north, south cut off for 7 hrs
Derailment at Ishwardi caused the snapping

Rail communications between the capital and the country's north and south were suspended for about seven and a half hours after an express train derailed at Muladuli of Pabna's Ishwardi yesterday.

Nearly 3,500 passengers were stranded in eight trains at different places before communications were restored at 8:55pm last night.

"All the trains have left stations," Ashim Kumar, divisional manager in railway's west zone, told The Daily Star at 9:10pm.

Earlier, at about 1:22pm, Chitra Express derailed at Muladuli due to a "wrong overshoot" of the intercity train.

Rail communications between Dhaka and the northern and southern districts are routed through Ishwardi junction.

The derailment occurred when Chitra

Fresh acid attack hits London

It comes less than 24hrs after 5 similar incidents; 2 held over Thursday's incident

Another suspected acid attack has been launched in London, less than 24 hours after a spate of five similar incidents.

The Metropolitan Police said they were called at around 5:00pm on Friday to reports of an attempted robbery of a moped in Dagenham.

The rider, in his 20s, was approached by two men on another moped who squirted what was described as a "noxious substance" at him.

They attempted to steal his moped but were unsuccessful, and the man was taken to hospital.

"He does not have lasting injuries and has been discharged," a spokesperson for Scotland Yard said. "There have been no arrests and enquiries continue."

It came a day after five separate victims were targeted by two moped-riding attackers in the north and the east of the capital.

Two of the assaults saw mopeds stolen, while another victim was left with "life-changing" injuries inflicted after being sprayed.

Detectives have made two arrests relating to Thursday's rampage, with boys aged 15 and 16 in custody.

Chief Inspector Ben Clark appealed for help from the public for information over the five attacks known to be linked.

"Each of these offences took place in busy locations and we know there may be witnesses who have not yet contacted us," he said.

In this era of digital screens and the internet, a visit to Bogra's four-storied Woodburn Government Public Library comes as a pleasant surprise to any book lover. From ages eight to eighty the library is busy with patrons reading novels, texts and newspapers, making the most of the ample seating available on the lower floors. It's proof that traditional libraries remain popular in the modern world. But the Woodburn library has indeed been a well-patronised public centre of learning for the past 163 years.
