

9TH WAGE BOARD Info ministry announcement not new: BFUJ

Leaders of Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists (BFUJ) and Dhaka Union of Journalists (DUJ) yesterday said the statement of the information ministry over formation of the 9th Wage Board was not new.

The journalist community cannot accept it, they said. The ministry yesterday said it would form the 9th Wage Board for journalists as soon as it gets name of the newspaper owners' representative.

"The process for forming the 9th Wage Board will be completed and made effective immediately after getting the name of NOAB (Newspaper Owners Association of Bangladesh) representative," said a ministry release.

But, in a joint statement, BFUJ and DUJ said, "There is nothing new in the information ministry's statement. So the July 30 programme will remain unchanged."

BFUJ faction President Manjurul Ahasan Bulbul, Secretary General Omar Faruque, DUJ faction President Shaban Mahmud and General Secretary Sohail Haider Chowdhury signed the statement.

JU students not to appear before probe body today

A section of Jahangirnagar University (JU) students expressed no confidence in the probe committee formed to investigate the incident of vandalising the vice chancellor's residence on May 27.

Termining the six-member probe body biased, the students said even though they will not appear before it today, they will not come to as three members of the committee are not from the JU syndicate, said a press release sent by the accused students.

The probe body was formed on May 27 after the syndicate decided to file a case against the agitating students.

The students said they cannot expect a fair probe as three syndicate members are also in the probe body. Moreover, one of the members of the committee, also a syndicate member, was seen at a rally on Monday demanding punishment for the accused students.

Under these circumstances, the investigation cannot be fair, they alleged. The stu-

dents demanded reformation of the probe body without any syndicate members.

Asked, JU Pro-VC Prof Abul Hossain said, "We do not have any plan to change the body as it was formed by the JU syndicate. The syndicate formed it by selecting reliable persons."

Contacted, chief of the probe body Prof Asit Hossain said, "I have no comment about the matter as the JU authorities formed it. We are just doing our job."

Moreover, two students of Jahangirnagar University from Saturday went on a hunger strike unto death on the campus, demanding the case's withdrawal. They were joined by six more students afterwards.

The students ended their hunger strike on Monday night after Pro-VC Prof Amir Hussain assured them of reaching a seven-day ultimatum to the university authorities for starting a process to withdraw the case.

'Robber' killed in 'gunfight'

An alleged robber was killed in a 'gunfight' with Rapid Action Battalion in Pologround area of Chittagong city early yesterday.

According to a Rab-7 press release yesterday, deceased Abul Kalam alias Lengra Kalam was a listed robber in feni and stood accused in several cases, including murder and robbery.

A team of Rab-7 raided Pologround area around 3:00am, acting on a tip-off that some arms dealers were trading firearms there, said Mimitar Rahman, assistant director of Rab-7.

He said when the Rab team reached the spot, the criminals opened fire. The Rab members then returned fire, triggering the 'gunfight'.

It was pre-planned

AG Mahbubey Alam tells HC

Attorney General Mahbubey Alam yesterday told the High Court that the incident of killing seven people including Narayanangji City Corporation councillor Nazrul Islam and senior lawyer Chandan Sarkar was a pre-planned murder.

The intention of the accused Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) personnel was to kill Nazrul, not to arrest him, he said while placing arguments before the HC during a hearing on the death references and appeals in the sensational Narayanangji seven-murder case.

The attorney general (AG) said the four co-passengers of Nazrul's car and Advocate Chandan Sarkar and his driver Ibrahim would not be killed if their (Rab personnel) intention was not to kill Nazrul. They were killed as they witnessed that Rab personnel were taking Nazrul into their custody, Mahbubey Alam argued.

The AG is expected to continue placing argument on July 23. Assistant AG Bashir Ahmed told The Daily Star. He said the bench of Justice

Bhabani Prasad Singh and Justice Mustafiz Zaman Islam will resume hearing today.

The judges began the hearing with Deputy Attorney General Abdul Mannan Mohan reading out from the paper book of the case on May 22.

Defence counsels - Advocate Mustafizul Hoque Chowdhury, Advocate SM Shahjahan, Advocate SM Abdul Mohin and Advocate Ahsan Ullah - earlier placed arguments defending the accused.

Earlier on January 16, a Narayanangji court found 35 people, including 25 former Rab officials and expelled Awami League man Nur Hossain, guilty of abduction and murder of seven people and destroying evidence in April 2014.

The court handed down death penalty to 26 people, including 16 former Rab members, and jailed nine others for various terms.

The bodies of seven people, including Nazrul and Chandan, were found floating in the Shitalaksha river after they were abducted on April 27, 2014.

UNO gets bail in case over distorting Bangabandhu portrait

Tariq Salmaan, upazila nirbahi officer of Barguna Sadar, was released on bail Wednesday afternoon in a case filed for allegedly distorting the portrait of Bangabandhu.

The case was lodged against him after an invitation card, with the portrait of Bangabandhu painted by a child on the occasion of Independence Day last year at Agailhara upazila, was published by him.

Obaidullah Saju, religious affairs secretary of Barisal District Awami League and president of Barisal Lawyers' Association, filed the Tk 5 crore deformation case with the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's (CMM) Court in June.

After filling of the case, he was transferred to Barguna Sadar from Agailhara upazila.

The CMM court asked the UNO to appear before it by July 27. He surrendered to the court and applied for bail yesterday but his prayer was initially rejected because he did not have necessary documents, said Sakawat Hossain, bench officer of the CMM court.

However, two hours later he was granted bail when he produced the papers, he added. During the period, the officer was in the custody of the court.

After giving him bail, the court fixed July 23 for hearing the case.

The case triggered a social media outcry with many praising the UNO's move of placing Bangabandhu's portrait painted by a child on the invitation card.

On different occasions, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina used children's paintings on her formal greeting cards in the past. Last year, she used the artwork of children with autism.

Don't taint fish market

PM asks exporters, traders

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday asked exporters and traders who were involved in fish farming, processing and export not to take any unwise step just for their small gains that may ruin their own business as well as the country's image.

Hasina made the request at the inaugural session of the National Fisheries Week 2017 held at Krishibid Institution in the capital.

A section of people tend to mix adulterated items for making extra profits. "What is the necessity of this? With this, they simply destroy their businesses and the country's image as well," she said.

Ensuring quality and standard is a must for export of any product and therefore, the government has taken steps to ensure testing of fish products, she noted.

There should be testing labs in Sylhet, Rajshahi and Rangpur divisions. Around 24-41 percent of our agricultural production comes from this sector which contributes to about 3.61 percent in the gross domestic product," she mentioned.

ownership on vast maritime areas in the Bay of Bengal, which is a source of huge mineral and fisheries resources.

Hasina said Bangladesh can use maritime resources extensively for the country's faster economic growth. "We will have to use our maritime resources, there is a vast sanctuary of fish besides other resources. We have got a tremendous opportunity to use that," she added.

Referring to the ban imposed by the European Union on shrimp import from Bangladesh during the BNP government, Hasina said after returning to power in 1996, the Awami League government allocated Tk 40 crore to ensure the quality and standard of shrimp processing. "Such efforts have made it possible to reintroduce Bangladesh's shrimp market in different countries, including the European Union," she noted.

Around 1.82 crore people of Bangladesh are now involved in fish cultivation and business. Around 24-41 percent of our agricultural production comes from this sector which contributes to about 3.61 percent in the gross domestic product," she mentioned.

Sixty percent of the country's total demand for animal protein come from the fishery sector, said Hasina, adding that additional fish production might help meet the rest of the protein demand of people.

Earlier, Hasina distributed awards for their contributions to fish production in the country.

Of the recipients, four individuals and organisations got gold medals and Tk 50,000 while nine individuals and organisations got silver medals and Tk 30,000.

Later, Hasina marked fish fry at Gono Bhaban Lake marking the National Fisheries Week 2017.

Fisheries and Livestock Minister Muhammad Sayedul Hoque presided over the programme. Chairman of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Fisheries and Livestock Ministry Narayan Chandra Chandra, among others, spoke on the occasion.

MULTIBLATE POND

Around 20 years ago, the pond was filled up by its owner.

Monir, a resident of the area, said people used to swim and bathe in it on a regular basis. The pond was there since the British period.

Mohammad Nasir, general secretary of Shikhatuli Muslim Kuba Sangha, said, "I used to swim in it during my childhood."

Wafat Islam, one of the owners of the pond, said they wanted to keep it intact, but portions of it were getting encroached. So, he had to fill it up in the 80s.

Now, there are shed structures instead of the reservoir. Abul Kaseem, a resident of the area, said, "There was a time when we had three ponds in the area. We have so many fond memories of those. Now, one of them is filled up while the other two [Shikhatuli and Alubazar ponds] are not being maintained properly."

"We used to go to them as they are not just water bodies. They are an important part of the neighbourhood as well as us," said the 75-year-old.
