Geologist MA Zaher dies

BSS, Dhaka
MA Zaher, a geologist of international repute and former director general of Geological Survey of Bangladesh (GSB), died due to old age complications at his Gulbagh residence in Dhaka on Sunday night. He was 85.
Zaher, also a former teacher of Dhaka University's soil science department, left behind his wife, three sons and three daughters. He was buried in Shahjahanpur graveyard in the city. Zaher earned repute for him and the country particularly through his 1977 discovery of a mineral, Zaherite, which is unlikely to persist anywhere except in most arid environments. The International Mineralogical Association (IMA) named it after him.
Hailed from Banchharampur upazila of Brahmanbaria, he played a crucial role in providing technical and strategic supports to freedom fighters during the Liberation War.

CU introduces 'Bangabandhu Chair'

judge AHM Shamsuddin Choudhury Manik, and the ministers on the Supreme Court verdict that scrapped the 16th amendment to the constitution.

Advocate Zainul said it is very difficult to protect the judiciary when the government wants to damage it.

The people and lawyers of the country have to get united in order to protect the rule of law, democracy and the judiciary, he said. Through moving their income tax files, judges are put under pressure, he alleged.

The SCBA leader said he felt ashamed to make any comment about Justice Shamsuddin Choudhury Manik, as he was responsible for the death of a SC lawyer earlier.

He also requested Justice Manik to stop making "adverse" comments about the SC and its judges.

SCBA Secretary Barrister AM Mahub Uddin Khokon, among others, spoke.

UNB adds, criticising Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury for asking Chief Justice (CJ) Surendra Kumar Sinha to leave the country, BNP yesterday at a programme alleged that some ruling party leaders are exposing their "communal attitude" with their derogatory comments on SK Sinha.

"A senior minister of the government asked the chief justice to leave the country. We also smell communalism in the words of one or two more ministers... They're trying to bring communalism and spread its odor very carefully," said BNP Senior Joint Secretary General Ruhul Kabir Rizvi.

Jatiyatabadi Tanti Dal arranged the programme at BNP's Nayapaltan central office seeking early recovery of the party Chairperson Khaleda Zia who underwent a surgery on her right eye in London recently.

Speaking at a human chain programme in front of the Jatiya Press Club on Sunday, Matia Chowdhury slammed the CJ over some of the observations in the Supreme Court verdict on the 16th amendment case.

Opposing her comments, Rizvi said, "Why will he (CJ) go abroad? Do you want to occupy his land property by threatening him to go abroad...?"

He said the ruling party leaders are issuing threats to the CJ and the government is launching an investigation into his wealth only to demoralise him. "I would like to tell the chief justice that they (govt) are trying to defeat you. History will consider you as a hero if you remain strict to your stance overcoming the pressure."

The BNP leader also criticised Commerce Minister Tofail Ahmed for his comments that if anyone tries to get involved in caretaker government issue his hands would get burnt.

supposed to have two separate discharge pipes -- one for chromium or chrome waste and the other for all other liquid waste, the factory owners are not complying with the requirement. Rather, many of them are using a common pipe to discharge liquid waste to the CETP, Dr Bazlul alleged.

During his study conducted in May and June, he found that 95 percent of the relocated workers were not provided with any compensation and 92 percent of them said that they are incurring losses in income and their standard of living deteriorated after they relocated to Savar.

However, Abdul Quayum, former project director of the tannery relocation project, claimed that all the work related to the CETP has been finished and the installation work of a drainage system was going on at Savar.

Quayum, also a resident engineer of

the Bureau of Research, Testing and Consultation (BRTC) at Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (Buet), said before Eid-ul-Azha, they expect to activate four modules of the CETP.

Aside from it, they allocated nearly 200 acres of land for school, college and other facilities for tannery workers at the estate and they will submit a plan to the ministry concerned shortly, he added.

Dr Zaidi Sattar, chairman of Policy Research Institute of Bangladesh, said leather export from Bangladesh is currently US1.5 billion dollars, but the country has the potential to export US5 billion dollars.

Among others, Prof Abu Eusuf of development studies at Dhaka University and Dabaraj Dey, a research associate of Bangladesh Environmental Lawyers Association, addressed the discussion.

In the rule, the court also asked the EC to show causes why it should not be directed to accept the committee of PDP led by Md Delwar Hossain and Md Ehsanul Huq Selim as its chairman and secretary general respectively.

The HC passed the rule following a writ petition filed by Md Ehsanul Huq Selim.

Petitioner's lawyer, Eunus Ali Akond, told The Daily Star that Ferdous Ahmed is reportedly ill as he has been suffering from paralysis and therefore, he is disqualified to hold the office of the chairman of PDP as per its constitution.

The executive committee of PDP had been formed long ago and was led by Ferdous Ahmed Qureishi and MA Hossain without holding any council.

On the other hand, the executive committee with Delwar Hossain and Ehsanul Huq Selim as its chairman and secretary general was formed through holding a council of the party, according to the petitioner's lawyer.

Eunus Ali also said the EC on June 22 this year allowed the committee led by Qureishi and MA Hossain in violation of the constitution.
