Stranded in no man's land UN worried

UN chief calls for giving Rohingyas security, assistance; UNHCR urges Bangladesh to open border

Expressing deep concern at reports of the killing of civilians in security operations in Rakhine State, UN Secretary-General António Guterres has reiterated Myanmar's responsibility to provide security and assistance to those in need.

He has also appealed to the Bangladesh authorities to open the borders for the Rohingyas fleeing violence.

The latest round of violence, which erupted after Rohingya insurgents attacked Myanmar security forces on August 25, prompted thousands of Rohingyas to leave home in fear of their lives and seek safety in Bangladesh.

Earlier, 87,000 Rohingyas were displaced during a

Several thousand Rohingyas from Myanmar, mostly women, children and elderly people, are waiting in no man's land along the Naikhyangchhari border to enter Bangladesh territory.

Though Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) remains active against trespassing, more

than 10,000 Rohingyas have already managed to get into Bangladesh through several points of the 274km Bangladesh-Myanmar border of Cox's Bazar and Bandarban.

Violence erupted in Myanmar's Rakhine State on Friday triggering a fresh influx of refugees towards Bangladesh.

Rana Plaza owner jailed for graft

A Dhaka court yesterday sentenced Sohel Rana, owner of the Rana Plaza, to **Sohel Rana** three years' simple imprisonment in a case filed against him for not submitting his wealth statement to the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC).

The court also fined him Tk 50,000, in default of which, he will have to suffer three months more in jail.

After cross-examination of all eight prosecution witnesses, Judge KM Imrul Kayes of the Special Judge Court-6 handed down the verdict in Sohel's presence in a packed courtroom.

This is for the first case in which Rana has been


