Forging his own path

Well educated youth in Tangail quits seeking jobs, starts poultry farm, reaps success

Beyond its inherent value, pursuing tertiary education is often considered the best way to land a plum job. When a new graduate encounters difficulty in securing suitable employment, it is understandably frustrating. Jahidul Islam, 28, from Sakrail village in Tangail sadar upazila found himself in just such circumstances. Rather than waiting for his job market fortunes to change, he decided to start his own poultry business.

"Even with higher education getting a good job without any work experience is really tough," says Jahidul, who graduated with an Honours degree in social work in 2014, and subsequently completed his Masters.

"My family is financially insolvent so I couldn't wait for a good opportunity," the youngest of the four children of a small-scale farmer recalls. "I am not engaged in politics. My family has no powerful relatives who could've helped me lobby for a job. Considering such limitations I started to plan."

In 2015 with his meagre savings, Jahidul decided to establish a poultry farm on 41 decimals of ancestral land. "I also took a little money from my two elder sisters, both of whom were already married, to get me started," he says. Jahidul subsequently took a bank loan of Tk 8 lakh, which enabled him to increase the number of chickens to 3,000. The situation, it would seem, was looking up.

Apple unveils three new iPhones

Apple has unveiled three new iPhone models, including a top-of-line handset described as "the biggest leap forward" since the original iPhone 10 years ago.

Apple chief executive Tim Cook announced yesterday the premium iPhone X -- pronounced 10 -- as well as a new iPhone 8 and 8 Plus.

Cook, speaking at the first event at the new campus theatre named for the late Apple co-founder Steve Jobs, said the latest flagship handset is a milestone for the company a decade after the first iPhone release.

"Ten years later it is only fitting that we are here in this place, on this day to reveal a product that will set the path for technology for the next decade," Cook said, calling the iPhone X "the biggest leap forward since the original iPhone."

The iPhone X has an edge-to-edge screen 5.8 inch and uses facial recognition to unlock the device, and improved "super retina" display with improved graphics and resolution.

The new flagship device will be available November 3 at a starting price of \$999, while the iPhone 8 and 8 Plus will be available later this month starting at \$699 and \$799, respectively.

All three new iPhones will offer wireless charging using the Qi global standard.

Angry locals set ablaze a bus and vandalised eight other vehicles as reckless driving killed a schoolgirl on the spot on the capital's Begun Rokeya Sarani yesterday.

UN SANCTIONS N Korea vows to make US suffer

North Korea yesterday condemned "vicious" new UN sanctions imposed over its sixth and largest nuclear test, warning it would make the US "suffer the greatest pain" it has ever experienced.

The new sanctions imposed unanimously by the UN Security Council Monday ban North Korean textile exports and restrict shipments of oil products.

The resolution, passed after Washington toned down its original proposals to secure backing from China and Russia, came just one month after the council banned exports of coal, lead and seafood in response to the North's launch of an intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM).

North Korea yesterday categorically rejected the new measures, with UN ambassador Han Tae-Song saying in Geneva that the US had "fabricated the most vicious sanction resolution" and warning of retaliation.

"The forthcoming measures by DPRK (North Korea) will make the US suffer the greatest pain it has ever experienced in its history," he told a disarmament conference in the Swiss city.

US ambassador Nikki Haley said Monday at the UN the tough new measures were a message to Pyongyang that "the world will never accept a
