The tests were done over the last one year at BRRi's compound and the fertiliser is now on trial at farmers' fields in Barisal, Patuakhali, Rajshahi and Kishoreganj.

Umme Aminun Naher, a BRRi principal scientific officer (PSO) and mastermind behind the bio-organic fertiliser, told The Daily Star yesterday that the blend has 10 beneficial bacteria.

About 15 percent of it is biochar (charcoal used as a soil amendment) and five percent rock phosphate, she said, adding that the rest was decomposable household vegetable waste.

She said their trials had shown that the use of bio-organic fertiliser did not have any impact on rice yields and was at par with production level achieved through chemical fertiliser usage.

Naher pointed out that the fertiliser would help reduce carbon emissions. Greenhouse gasses are emitted during chemical fertiliser production and its use, she said.

Research revealed that the production of one kg of urea and TSP fertiliser emits about six kg of CO2 in the air, said the Unesco-ISTIC (International Science, Technology and Innovation

Centre for South-South Cooperation) award-winning scientist.

She said, "We are using the same rock phosphate, which is a key ingredient in TSP, but in our process the beneficial bacteria make the rock phosphate soluble. Other bacteria that we are using help compost waste, fix nitrogen from the air and help the paddy plant grow."

The biochar is produced by burning rice husk, she added.

Neither Naher nor Jatish Chandra Biswas, the head of the BRRi Soil Science Division, could give a clear idea on the cost of the fertiliser.

They, however, said the cost of production should be much lower than chemical fertilisers as "we are using household wastes, cheap biochar and bacteria and little amount of rock phosphate, which is available in the market for Tk 5 per kg".

They said the fertiliser would add organic matter and beneficial microbes to maintain soil health. Soil quality would increase with direct application of carbon via biochar.

Research findings indicate that application of chemical fertilisers for a long time decreases the populations of free-living nitrogen fixing bacteria,

organisms that solubilise phosphate as well as other beneficial bacteria.

Md Imran Ullah Sarkar and Afsana Jahan are the two other soil scientists of the BRRi team that developed the fertiliser after several years of research, lab tests and field trials.

Jatish told The Daily Star that to move forward with the product, BRRi would first make a patent application. Once they had the patent, they would provide interested enterprises with the technology so that the fertiliser reached all farmers in the country.

The decomposing process of the waste, bacteria, biochar and phosphate would generate a considerable amount of biogas and people would be able to tap into it, once it is produced commercially on a large scale, he said.

BRRi Director General Md Shahjahan Kabir told The Daily Star yesterday that as a first step, BRRi would soon approach the Gazipur City Corporation to go for bio-organic fertiliser production.

"We are (BRRi headquarters) located in Gazipur and we will approach the local city authorities to make the best use of the decomposable waste collected each day. That will have a demonstrative effect on other places in the country," said Kabir.

UN to work with Asean to resolve crisis

human rights and the rule of law.

Under the Asean-UN Comprehensive Partnership, both sides can intensify and integrate efforts to ensure peace and security, sustainable development, human rights and humanitarian action, Antonio Guterres said.

Given the threat of terrorism and violent extremism worldwide, including in Southeast Asian nations, he pointed out that the new UN Office of Counter Terrorism and the UN as a whole stand ready to support the Asean in addressing these complex threats through regional cooperation.

MALAYSIA DISSOCIATES FROM ASEAN STATEMENT ON RAKHINE VIOLENCE

Meanwhile, Malaysia on Sunday said it "would like to disassociate itself" from a statement issued by the Asean on the situation in Myanmar's Rakhine state, reports cable television news agency, Channel News Asia.

The Asean chairman in a statement issued on the sidelines of the UN general assembly condemned the Aug 25 attacks on Myanmar security forces, as well as "all acts of violence which resulted in loss of civilian lives, destruction of homes and displacement of large numbers of people".

Malaysia's Foreign Minister Anifah

Aman in a separate statement said his country felt the Asean statement was a "misrepresentation of the reality of the situation".

"The statement also omits the Rohingyas as one of the affected communities," he said.

Malaysia urged Myanmar to immediately implement recommendations made in an advisory commission's final report on the Rakhine state, Anifah added.

The Asean statement called the situation in Rakhine a "complex inter-communal issue with deep historical roots", and "strongly urged" all parties to avoid actions that could worsen the situation on the ground.

APRRN URGES INTL COMMUNITY TO PRESSURE MYANMAR

The Asia Pacific Refugee Rights Network (APRRN), meanwhile, urged the international community to apply all possible measures to pressure Myanmar into halting military operations, protecting civilians and ensuring unfettered humanitarian access to Rakhine State.

In a statement by APRRN Programme Coordinator Evan Jones, the Thailand-based rights body demanded implementation of all recommendations of the Rakhine Advisory Commission led by Kofi Annan.

"Nations cannot stand aside and watch hundreds of thousands of people

being forcibly displaced, thousands indiscriminately killed, in a government-sponsored operation amounting to ethnic cleansing," it said.

It also urged the international community to rally around Bangladesh that is under extreme pressure in the face of this humanitarian emergency.

HRW SLAMS INDIA
Human Rights Watch has slammed India for "mistreating" the Rohingya refugees.

It referred to Indian Home Minister Rajnath Singh who said in a recent tweet that his government is "not violating any international law" if it deports Rohingya refugees as India is not a signatory to the 1951 Refugee Convention.

"If India had not signed the Convention against torture, would Indian authorities have carte blanche to torture and ill-treat anyone in custody?" said Bill Frelick, HRW's refugee rights programme director in a statement on Sunday.

Indian government says it is worried about the entry of refugees with links to Rohingya militants. "If that's the case, they should produce evidence and prosecute individual suspects," Frelick said.

"When your neighbour flees his burning house, you are not at liberty to push him back into the flames because

During visits to several puja mandaps in the capital yesterday, artisans were seen having a busy time putting the final touches to the idols.

The mandaps have been decorated with colourful lights, artificial flowers, festoons, banners and paintings, with colourful arches at the entrance of a number of them welcoming devotees and guests.

"All works are almost done and whatever is left will be completed within midnight," said Ratal Paul while working at Ramna Kali Temple in the capital.

Meanwhile, security measures have been beefed up at temples and mandaps with the deployment of additional squads of Ansar, police, Rapid Action Battalion and other law enforcement agencies for peaceful celebration of the festival.

In separate messages, President Abdul Hamid and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina conveyed greetings to members of the Hindu community, reports BSS.

The prime puja mandap in the capital is at Dhakeshwari National Temple. Large mandaps have also been put up at Jagannath Hall of Dhaka University, Ramakrishna Math and Mission, Ramna Kali Mandir, Siddheshwari Kali Mandir, Tanti Bazar, Shashankhari Bazar, Bangla Bazar, Banani, Dhanmondi and Farmgate.

With Mahalaya, marking the homecoming of Goddess Durga, having been observed a week ago, today's celebration will begin early morning with Shashthi Puja, Kalpambha and

Bihit Puja following Bhodon (invocation) to the deity yesterday evening.

Throughout the day devotees will pray for her appearance on earth again after a year and seek forgiveness.

Mahasaptami will be celebrated tomorrow followed by Mahashanti on Thursday. Mohanabami and Bijoya Dashami will be observed on Friday and Saturday.

According to Hindu scriptures and the Bangla almanac, Durga Puja is observed in sync with the moon's movement. The five-day festivity and prayers begin on the sixth day of the full moon and ends on the tenth day or Bijoya Dashami.

Durga, the slayer of demon Mahishashur, appears to be riding on the back of a lion and accompanied by her children Ganesh, Kartik, Lakshmi and Saraswati with 10 weapons in her 10 hands.

At the invocation of the devotees, she descends on the earth, stays for the next four days and leaves after slaying all evil forces and blessing the devotees.

Every year, Goddess Durga arrives on a specific carrier and chooses another bearer for her departure. Her choice is seen to predict how the following year will fare for the world and its inhabitants.

Milon Chakraborty said Durga this year would arrive on a boat foretelling good harvests and floods and leave on a horse spelling doom for the world.

SECURITY

There is no specific security threat but security has been reinforced considering the present national and international situation, Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) Commissioner Md

Asaduzzaman Mia told journalists yesterday.

"I want to make it clear that there is no lack of security in the city," he said at Dhakeshwari Temple while inspecting security arrangement there.

Puja mandaps were brought under camera surveillance. People will have to go through archways to enter major puja mandaps, he said and advised people not to carry handbags, vanity bags, packets, metal objects and any sharp items including knives to temples and mandaps.

After a meeting of the cabinet committee on law and order at the home ministry at the secretariat on Sunday, Industries Minister Amir Hossain Amu said law enforcers took all necessary measures so that the Hindu community could celebrate their biggest religious festival peacefully.

The police headquarters instructed people not to upload any contradictory, objectionable and provocative videos or posts on the social media centering on Durga Puja in order to retain social peace.

Citizens have been asked as well to inform the law enforcing agency if anyone is found to be spreading contradictory messages to foil social harmony.

Meanwhile, Ain o Salish Kendra yesterday expressed deep concern over the incidents of idols of the goddesses being desecrated in different parts of the country and that in most of the cases the culprits remain untraced.

In a press release, the rights body urged the government to take necessary security measures to stop the recurrence of such incidents and urged people to remain alert.

Youth held for 'raping' minor girl

and Ali are suspected muggers while the rest of the arrestees are mobile phone sellers and repairmen.

Additional Deputy Commissioner Humayun Kabir said the gang has been changing IMEI numbers of mugged or stolen phones before selling them to unsuspecting customers.

"Police arrested Nabi and Ali in the city on Sunday with two stolen phones and interrogated them about the places where the phones are sold," Humayun said.

Based on information gleaned from them, a police team raided a mobile phone store in Fatikchari in the evening and arrested Ajit with 15 phones. IMEIs of 12 of the 15 phones were already changed.

Humayun added that police then raided three other stores and recovered many stolen phones.

"During the drive, more phones with changed IMEIs were recovered," said the ADC.

Inspector Priton Sarkar said a gang of muggers sell stolen phones to crooked store owners who have the IMEI numbers changed before selling those to customers.

Some criminals also change IMEI numbers of their phones before committing crimes to avoid detection, he added.

Man arrested over London train bomb attack

Hare Road the previous day. The secretary was in the vehicle that day as well.

During the two-hour drive from 5:00pm yesterday, law enforcers also fined and sued the driver of a special superintendent of police of Criminal Investigation Department (CID) and six bikers.

Another motorcycle was impounded.

A traffic police team led by Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) Additional Commissioner (traffic) Mosleh Uddin Ahmed and Deputy Commissioner Rifat Shameem conducted the drive to check traffic rules violation, said officials who joined it.

Mosleh Uddin told The Daily Star that they would continue such drives.

On Sunday, setting a rare instance, police filed cases against the drivers of 57 vehicles, mostly carrying VVIPs, and fined them for using the wrong side of Hare Road.

A state minister, a lawmaker and several top bureaucrats were inside the vehicles.

"About 70 percent of the vehicles were carrying bureaucrats, 10 percent police and the rest were carrying media personnel, an army officer and others," said a traffic police officer who participated in the drive.

Using the wrong side of the road defying traffic laws during rush hour is a common practice of ministers, government officials, VVIPs, lawmakers, ruling party leaders and media personnel.

Police were hardly ever seen taking any action against them.

17 more bodies found

Rohingya "extremist terrorists".

Seventeen more bodies were found yesterday, said government spokesman Zaw Htay.

Ni Maul, a Hindu leader who joined the search alongside soldiers and police, said the new corpses were of Hindu men aged between 30-50 and buried in two pits near the other grave sites.

"We are still searching together with soldiers and police as we believe more than 100 people were killed at that time," he told AFP.

Displaced Hindus from that area, known as Kha Maung Seik, have told AFP that Rohingya fighters stormed into their communities on August 25, killing many and taking others into the forest.

They showed AFP a list of 102 people from two villages -- Ye Baw Kyaw and Taung Ywar -- who are feared dead by distraught relatives now sheltering in camps.

Several Hindu women were also abducted by the militants, according to the displaced Hindus, who wept as they recounted the bloodshed.

With the government blocking access to the conflict zone, it is difficult to verify the range of accusations that have intensified ethnic hatreds in Rakhine.

But the army has steadfastly blamed violence on the Rohingya -- a Muslim minority it has been trying for years to eject from Myanmar -- while highlighting the suffering of other ethnic groups swept up in the violence.

ETHNIC TIES SHATTERED

The focal point of the unrest, northern Rakhine's Maungdaw district, was once home to a fragile mosaic of religious communities, dominated by the Rohingya.

But vast swathes of the border region are now completely emptied of Muslim residents, with nearly 40 percent of Rohingya villages abandoned in under a month.

Frightened and dispossessed ethnic Rakhine Buddhists and Hindus, who have largely fled south, say they see no future alongside their former Muslim neighbours.

"I do not dare go back to the village," said Kyaw Kyaw Naing, one of hundreds of displaced Hindus sheltering in a derelict football stadium in Rakhine's state capital Sittwe.

"We still do not know yet how many of those dead bodies include relatives from our camp," added the 34-year-old, whose Hindu name is Shu Bown.

In Bangladesh, relief agencies are struggling to meet the vast needs of the Rohingya cramming into shanties in Cox's Bazar, an influx the UN has described as the "fastest and most urgent refugee emergency in the world".

Yet there is little sympathy for the Muslim minority inside Myanmar, where Islamophobia has been stewing for years among the overwhelmingly Buddhist population.

Even before the latest eruption of violence, the 1.1 million-strong Rohingya were relegated to precarious and impoverished lives, with hundreds of thousands trapped in refugee camps following previous persecution.

Those outside the camps were subject to laws that stripped them of citizenship and severely restricted their movements and access to jobs, schooling and healthcare.

Analysts say the repression helped give rise to the Arakan Rohingya Salvation Army, whose raids plunged the region into crisis.

villagers of remote Shalgram in Munsur Nagar union of Kazipur upazila, his dream high school opened its doors in 1999.

That first year the school had just 35 students with Hafizur as both founder and head teacher. Nowadays, there are 550 students, among them 247 girls, enrolled in classes six through to 10. The high school has 13 staff including the 10 teachers.

"For the past 18 years Shalgram High School has given children from the Jamuna shoals the chance to be educated," says Abdur Razzak, president of the school's management committee.

The first students of the school appeared for their Secondary School Certificate examinations under the Rajshahi Board in 2010. "Results have been good since then," says Hafizur. "Now the students, many of whom are from poor families, have reasonable access to secondary education.

They can pursue higher education more easily too."

Nonetheless, Hafizur is worried about his school. "We are yet to become a beneficiary of the government's monthly payment orders despite repeated requests to the authorities concerned," he sighs. "The teachers and other staff are working hard but suffering from severe financial hardship. At times I cannot pay them fully because our students can't always pay their tuition fees."

Sometimes Hafizur uses money from his freedom fighter allowance to keep the school running. "I can do that until October this year which is when I have to retire," he says. "I don't know what will happen to the school after that."

Hafizur yet hopes the government will support the school via monthly payment order. "If that could happen before I retire, my lifelong dream will be secure," he says.
