Thrashed by trash

City AL factions clash at Azimpur over dumping of garbage at venue of rival's programme

The residents of Azimpur yesterday woke up to a bizarre sight: heaps of garbage dumped in front of the gates of a community centre.

While the bewildered people looked for answers, some leaders of Dhaka city's Awami League (AL) claimed that the trash was left there by their rival group to foil a programme scheduled to be held inside Pearl Harbour Community Centre, the location in question.

Party insiders said the rivalry between Dhaka South City Corporation Mayor Sayeed Khokon and AL's Dhaka South City Unit's general secretary Shahey Alam Murad led to this situation.

Murad blamed the city corporation for the dumping, terming the incident "unexpected". He, however, said their programme was held successfully.

Angered by the apparent slight, AL men loyal to Murad began chanting slogans against the mayor and blamed him for the incident. However, the

HOLDING TAX INCREASE
MPs want it reconsidered

Senior lawmakers, including a minister, in parliament expressed anger over the government's move to increase holding tax in Dhaka and Chittagong cities.

The MPs of treasury and opposition benches yesterday asked the government to reconsider the move and said the hike would have an adverse effect on the next general elections.

People were angered due to the government's decision to increase the tax to an "irrational" level, they said.

Commerce Minister Tofail Ahmed and Jatiya Party MPs Sayed Abu Hossain Bablu and Ziauddin Ahmed Bablu spoke on the issue taking the floor on a point of order.

"It is normal that holding tax will increase after a certain period of time. But increasing holding tax by nine times at one go cannot be acceptable. People will not accept it. The move needs to be reconsidered," said Tofail.

He said if the holding tax was increased, for example to Tk 72,000 from Tk 8,000

COUP IN ZIMBABWE Mugabe resists pressure to quit

Meets envoys as military pushes ways for his graceful exit

President Robert Mugabe is insisting he remains Zimbabwe's only legitimate ruler and is refusing to quit after a military coup, but pressure is mounting on the 93-year-old former guerrilla to accept offers of a graceful exit, sources said yesterday.

A political source who spoke to senior allies holed up with Mugabe and his wife, Grace, in his lavish "Blue Roof" Harare compound said Mugabe had no plans to resign voluntarily ahead of elections scheduled for next year.
