Ex-ASP jailed in graft case

A Dhaka court yesterday sentenced a retired assistant superintendent of police (ASP) of City Special Branch to two years' imprisonment in a case filed for not submitting his wealth statement in due time to the ACC.

The court also fined the ASP, Abdul khaleque Bhuiyan, Tk 1 lakh. In default he will have to suffer three months more in jail.

The court sent the convict, now on bail, to jail with a conviction warrant.

According to the prosecution, the Anti-Corruption Commission sent a notice asking Khaleque to submit his wealth statement on December 2 of 2014. But he did not submit the statement to the ACC in time.

Khaleque built a six-storey building in his name while a 10-storey building in his son's name at Tilpapara in Khilgaon, it said.

Later, the ACC filed the case against Khaleque with Ramna Police Station on March 29, 2015. After investigation, the ACC pressed charge against Khaleque in December the same year.

The court framed the charges against Khaleque on November 3 last year.

Three killed in Kurigram road accident

Three motorcycle riders were killed as their motorbike hit a roadside tree in Pathari area on Nageshwari-Bhurungamari road at Nageshwari upazila of the district yesterday morning.

The dead are Motaleb, 35, son of Khairul Alam, and Sujon, 23, son of Shamsul Haque, residents of Baparhat area and Sohel, 25, son of Ebrahim of Nilurkhamar village of the same upazila.

Officer-in-Charge of Nageshwari Police Station Afzal Islam said the accident occurred when the motorcycle hit a roadside tree in the area about 9:30am, leaving Motaleb dead on the spot and two others injured.

The injured were taken to Nageshwari Health Complex where Sohel succumbed to his injuries.

Later, Sujon died on the way to Rangpur Medical College Hospital.

5 MOULVIBAZAR WAR CRIMES ACCUSED

Verdict any day

The International Crimes Tribunal-1 will deliver verdict any day in a case filed against five Moulvibazar men for allegedly committing crimes during the Liberation War in 1971.

The three-member tribunal led by Justice Md Shahinur Islam yesterday placed the case in the waiting list for delivery of verdict after it completed hearing of closing arguments from the prosecution and the defence.

The accused -- Yunus Ahmed, 71, Ujer Ahmed Chowdhury, 63, Samsul Hossain Tarafder, 65, Nesar Ali, 75, and Mobarak Mia, 66 -- are facing five charges.

Of them, Yunus and Ujer are now in jail while the rest are on the run.

Wrapping up their arguments, Prosecutor Tapas Kanti Baul sought capital punishment for all the accused claiming to have been able to prove all charges.

Defence counsel Muzahedul Islam Shahin, however, said the prosecution could not prove any charge "beyond reasonable

doubt" and thus the accused should be acquitted.

The prosecutors pressed five charges against the accused on May 26 last year. They alleged that Samsul was an Al-Badr commander while the rest were members of the Razakar Bahini. The prosecution produced 15 witnesses along with documents proving the charges against the five.

PROSECUTION REBUKED

The tribunal, meanwhile, rebuked the prosecution for exhibiting a book as evidence even though it was not "authoritative".

The prosecution submitted a book named "Sylheti Ganohatya" written by one Tajul Islam as evidence. The book was first published in 1989.

When Prosecutor Tapas was placing rebuttal of defence counsel's submission yesterday, Justice Shahinur Islam asked him whether the book was "authoritative".

As Tapas replied in the negative, the judge said, "Then why are you relying on it? Why

Three transport workers held with 1.2 lakh Yaba pills

The Detective Branch (DB) of Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP) arrested three transport workers and seized 1.20 lakh Yaba pills from their covered van in the city's Bakalia early yesterday.

They are Mamun Bepari, the driver, and his helpers Shahjahan, and Anwar.

On a tip-off, a team of DB intercepted the Dhaka-bound vehicle in Shah Amanat Bridge area.

A secret chamber was found in the body of the covered van where the contraband pills were hidden in small packets, said DB's Additional Deputy Commissioner (ADC) (West) AMM Humayun Kabir.

It is impossible to make such a chamber inside the van without the concern of the owner, said Deputy Commissioner (DC) (DB-Port) Md Shahidullah.

They seized the covered van which also contained 130 cartons of imported fish from Myanmar.

Man to die for killing wife in Ctg

A Chittagong court yesterday sentenced a man to death for killing his wife at Hathazari upazila in Chittagong in 2010.

The condemned convict, Md Mostafa alias Sukkur, was tried in absentia, said Public Prosecutor AKM Sirajul Islam Chowdhury.

According to the prosecution, Mostafa strangled his wife Rojina Begum on April 6, 2010 in their Notunpara residence. Later, he hanged the body from the ceiling.

Rojina's family filed a murder case with Hathazari Police Station against Mostafa.

Couple jailed for drug peddling

A Chittagong court yesterday sentenced a fugitive couple to five-year rigorous imprisonment each for peddling Yaba pills.

The court also fined the convicts -- Mosammat Arju Begum, 20, and her husband Sagar Mia, 25 -- Tk 1,000 each. In default, the two will have to suffer one more month in jail, said court sources.

Officials of the Department of Narcotics Control (DNC) arrested Arju with 600 Yaba pills in her house in Chittagong city's Bakalia area on December 12, 2013.

272 students get Duke of Edinburgh's Gold Award

The fifth Gold Award Ceremony under The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award was held in the capital on Sunday.

This year, the Gold Award went to 272 students of ABC International School, Bangladesh International Tutorial, Maple Leaf International School, Stride International School, The Aga Khan School Dhaka, Basiratnayak High School, Cantonment College Jessor, Chittagong Grammar School-Chittagong, Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET), Independent University Bangladesh, Jahangirnagar University, Chittagong University, Dhaka University (DU), and University of Liberal Arts Bangladesh.

The ceremony was hosted by British High Commissioner to Bangladesh Alison Blake in her residence. This year, the Countess of Wessex graced the ceremony as chief guest for the first time and handed over the certificates to the heads of the institutions on behalf of the awardees, said a press note.

Syed Ashraful Islam said Tk 6.48 crore was spent for "gas and fuel" while Tk 32 crore for "petrol and lubricant". Tk 1.45 crore was spent for petrol and lubricant for water transport.

The minister said that the government's transport directorate allocates a sedan car for fulltime use to privileged government officials starting from the post of deputy secretary to senior secretary.

The amount of fuel for allocated transport was fixed to check misuse, he said.
