Girls ready to stop stalkers

The mere act of going to school is a struggle for many girls across Bangladesh. Catcalls, lurid remarks and eve teasing are all too common. This curtails their desire to continue studies while guardians fear for the security of their daughters.

"We just want to go to school without being teased," said Falguni Khatun, a grade seven student at Barobazar Secondary Girls School at Jhenidah.

Researchers have pointed out that eve-teasing is one of the reasons for the high rates of school drop-out among girls, along with having many other negative effects.

Apart from the mental toll eve-teasing brings, there is also a chance of physical harm. Rebuked, the perpetrators can turn aggressive.

Although the girls understand that changing the perpetrators' mentalities overnight is impossible, they have found a way to boost their own sense of security.

It was the vision of Bangladeshi expatriate in South Korea Sukanto Kumar Biswas and three of his friends to make the change.

"Why should our girls be deprived of an education for eve teasing? It is our duty to do something to change this situation," said Sukanto, over the phone.

Merkel's fourth term in doubt

Coalition talks fail; snap elections on the cards

Efforts to form a three-way governing coalition in Germany collapsed yesterday, pitching Europe's biggest power into political crisis, and its president told parties they owed it to voters and European neighbours to form a government.

The major obstacle to a deal was immigration, according to Chancellor Angela Merkel, who was forced into negotiations after bleeding support in a September 24 election to the far right in a backlash at her 2015 decision to let in over 1 million migrants.

Ruling party moves to impeach Mugabe

Resignation deadline comes and goes as Zimbabwe crisis deepens

Zimbabwe's President Robert Mugabe came under increasing pressure to quit after his ruling party said yesterday it was prepared to force the defiant leader from power by moving to impeach him.

In a televised address late Sunday, the 93-year-old president flouted expectations he would step down after a military takeover, pitching the country into a second week of political crisis.

Lawmakers from his ruling ZANU-PF party said that they would take the first steps

on Tuesday necessary to push Mugabe from office after the veteran leader ignored their ultimatum he resign by 1000 GMT yesterday.

"We want to get rid of this animal called Mugabe, he must go. We have the numbers, the opposition is also going to support us," said ZANU-PF MP Vongai Mupereru.

"We have got a clear position, we are going to impeach -- the man has to go," said another government MP, MacKenzie Ncube, speaking to AFP after a key meeting of ruling party lawmakers.

Once a simple majority of parliamentarians

After a picture of the 17-year-old lion posted on social media went viral recently, many users accused the zoo keepers of starving him being irresponsible.

Veterinarians, called in by the zoo authorities after the backlash, concluded that Juboraj's health had
