RIBANA — NATURAL NOURISHMENT FOR THE SKIN

For organic handmade soaps, only a few reliable brands are available in the market; the imported varieties can pretty much break someone's beauty budget. A three-year-old local handmade soap brand is, however, determined to transform this very scene! Ribana (stylised as RiBANA), the labour of dreams of Md Wahiduzzaman Sadi, is offering handmade soaps to fit the needs of the beauty forward individuals, sans the negative side-effects.

Wahiduzzaman, from his undergrad years in pharmacy at University of Development Alternative, saw how harsh chemicals were being used in everyday cosmetics. What hit him was that there were viable organic alternatives and those could be just as good, if not better than the mass-produced products.

Of course, the beginning was not as easy as it reads. Trial and error almost became his second motion as he sought to find a good marketable product. When he finally started in 2014, the setbacks were only beginning. While people were aware of organic products, the 'handmade' adjective did not quite hit the mark.

Standing in 2017 now, the story gets better. Ribana now receives over seventy to eighty messages per week with constant queries over Facebook on their products and offerings. Organic products are finally getting through to the users as many have suffered directly from years of mass marketed products.

Ribana at present has three different varieties of soaps — activated Carbon for cleansing and getting rid of acne, Goat's Milk for moisturising sensitive

skin and Saffron Goat's Milk Soap for nourishing brightness.

All three are fully hand-made through the Cold Process Method, which ensures that the soap is free from typical additives and preservatives. This also produces a rich lather that penetrates better into the skin for lasting benefits.

All soaps are made with the best possible ingredients. Wahiduzzaman leaves no stone unturned as he sources his saffron from Iran, and the activated carbon base from Merck — the world's leading chemical and pharmaceutical company, to name a few of the ingredients.

For now, Ribana is expected to include castor oil, coconut oil, Extra virgin olive oil soap and coconut cleanser soap as part of their newer offerings within November.

Wahiduzzaman understands the difference in skin types and acknowledges that some of the products may not have the expected result, but emphasises that they will NEVER harm the skin. He personally undertakes the testing for pH levels as well as seeing his products through from mixing to curing to packaging.

As more brands are popping up, Wahiduzzaman is eager to see people embracing organic products into their daily routine. In the near future, Ribana targets to be one of the brands that will become synonymous with quality local, organic, handmade cosmetic products.
