Resistance to abuse behind madrasa student murder

Says Rab after arresting the suspect

Rapid Action Battalion yesterday arrested a 16-year-old student who allegedly killed a junior at a madrasa in Gulistan on Saturday.

The arrestee primarily admitted that he murdered the 12-year-old boy as the victim resisted his sexual advance, said Lt Col Emranul Hasan, commanding officer of Rab-3, at Rab Media Centre in Karwan Bazar yesterday.

The teenager also got furious because the boy refused to wash his cloth and bring food for him.

A Rab team arrested the teenager at Sadarghat terminal around 9:00am.

In early Saturday, the 16-year-old slit the throat of the boy and dumped his body in a septic tank of the institution -- Madinatul Ulum Madrasa. He then fled to his village home in Barisal. Yesterday, he came to Dhaka, probably with a plan to go to somewhere else, the Rab official said.

He said the teenager, who was the most senior student of the madrasa, often made other students do his chores. On November 16, he slapped the victim when the latter refused to obey his order.

The boy had informed it to a teacher and the teenager was rebuked for it. All these made him angry and led him to make a plan to kill the boy.

Maternal death rate rises

Shows govt survey; the upward trend seen despite more mothers accessing healthcare

Though Bangladesh has achieved much progress in reducing maternal mortality ratio in the last two decades, a government study shows the rate has gone up in recent time.

According to Bangladesh Maternal Mortality and Health Care Survey 2016, the ratio has increased to 196 deaths per 100,000 live births from 194 in 2010.

The finding is in stark contrast to the percentage of women taking maternity care and safe delivery facilities nowadays. The number of women receiving maternity care has increased to 43 percent in 2016 from 19 percent in 2010, while births in health facilities have increased to 47 percent from 23 percent in the same period.

The researchers involved with the survey identified that poor quality of healthcare, lack of capacity of health service providers, and shortage of readiness to provide the existing facilities are the major reasons for the increase of the mortality rate.

The National Institute of Population Research and Training (NIORT), under the health and family welfare ministry, conducted the survey through interviewing 3,21,214 married women, aged 13-49, in 2,98,284 households across the country in three years since 2013.

The findings were revealed during a seminar at a hotel in the capital yesterday.

The government, USAID and UK-based Department for International Development (DFID) funded the survey, while MEASURE Evaluation and icddr,b provided technical support.

The report says haemorrhage and eclampsia (convulsions) are responsible for about 55 percent of maternal deaths, which accounts for around 13 percent of all adult female deaths.

Meanwhile, the percentage of caesarean deliveries in the country has increased to 31 in 2016 from 12 in 2010, which is alarming, says the preliminary report of the study.

The private sector dominates the market in providing delivery care.

About 83 percent of the total caesarean deliveries take place in private facilities.

According to the report, C-section delivery rates in Bangladesh now greatly exceed the levels expected to be medically necessary.

(WHO) suggests that a reasonable rate of medically necessary C-section is between 10 percent and 15 percent of all births, but in Bangladesh, the rate is twice as high (31 percent).

Over the years, the government has given a lot of effort to reduce maternal deaths and achieved remarkable success.

While the rate was 574 per 100,000 live births in 1990-91, it fell to 194 in 2010. Bangladesh aims at a maternal mortality target of 105 by

2022.

Talking to The Daily Star, Kanta Jamil, one of the key researchers, said that although the percentage of accessing maternal care and institutional delivery had increased, the quality of healthcare was not up to the mark.

There are many private clinics built across the country, which give most of maternal care. Who are they? How much quality service do they provide?" she asked.

The researchers, however, claimed that the mortality ratio had not increased; rather it "remained stalled". A few government officials said the rate was going downward.

Speaking at the seminar, Director General of Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) Prof Abul Kalam Azad said, "The study was conducted with the data of 2013-2015, but the situation has improved in 2017."

"We need to focus more on institutional delivery and ensure proper

SC reinstates admission of 88 IU students

The Supreme Court yesterday upheld a High Court verdict that directed the authorities concerned of Islamic University in Kushtia to reinstate the admissions of 88 students of mathematics and statistics departments under 2016-2017 academic year.

A five-member bench of the Appellate Division of the SC headed by Justice Md Abdul Wahab Miah, who is carrying out responsibilities of the chief justice, by its majority view dismissed an appeal filed by Kushtia Islamic University challenging the HC verdict.

Barrister Ruhul Quddus Kazal, a lawyer for the 88 students, said his clients can continue their academic functions following the apex court order.

He said in a statement that the syndicate of Islamic University during a meeting on March 6 cancelled the admission of 100 students on charge of their involvement in question leak in the admission test held on December 7 last year.

Eighty eight of the 100 students filed a writ petition with the HC challenging the syndicate's decision to cancel their admission. The HC on April 17 this year scrapped the syndicate's decision and ordered the authorities concerned to reinstate their admission.

The university then filed an appeal with the Appellate Division challenging the HC verdict, he added.

Based on the probe and testimony of witnesses, the court

announced the verdict yesterday. The neighbours were acquitted from the case.
