## 20 YRS OF CHT PEACE ACCORD

### Govts cool on its full execution

Sultana Kamal tells discussion

The Chittagong Hill Tracts Treaty is not being implemented fully due to a lack of interest of the successive governments, said former adviser to a caretaker government Sultana Kamal.

"Those who were supposed to implement the treaty didn't do so. It has become difficult to implement the accord due to a lack of political interest of the successive governments," she said. "Almost 20 years have passed since the treaty was inked. But still there is no significant achievement in its implementation," the rights activist told a discussion in the capital's Cirdap auditorium yesterday.

The Association for Land Reform and Development and the International Chittagong Hill Tracts Commission jointly organised the programme marking 20 years of the CHT treaty.

Goutom Dewan, convener of Chittagong Hill Tracts Nagorik Committee, in the keynote paper said it is necessary to mention a specific timeline for implementation of the accord.

He also suggested holding Zila Parishad elections at three hill districts immediately. "Preparing a voter list of permanent residents in Chittagong Hill Tracts areas is also necessary in this regard," he added.

Nijera Kori Coordinator Khushi Kabir said hill people are eagerly waiting for a complete implementation of the treaty.

National Human Rights Commission member Banchita Chakma, Bangladesh Adivasi Forum General Secretary Sanjeeb Drong, and ALRD Executive Director Shamsul Huda, also spoke.

On December 2, 1997, Chittagong Hill Tracts Peace Accord was signed between the government and the Parbatya Chattagram Jana Sanghati Samity (PCJSS), an organisation of indigenous communities in the CHT.

## ENSURING BASIC RIGHTS OF HAOR CHILDREN

### Govt, NGOs should work hand in hand

Both the government and non-government organisations (NGOs) should work on a priority basis to meet basic needs like education and healthcare of the children living in Haor areas, said speakers at a dialogue in the capital yesterday.

They said the children in Haors get limited access to various fundamental rights and needs, comparing to the children of other areas.

Save the Children, JAAGO Foundation and The Daily Star organised the dialogue on "Our Deprived Children in the Thoughts of Youth: Policy Action to Overcome the Existing Difficulty" at Shilpakala Academy.

The event was organised under a programme called "Bridging the Gap" as part of the global "Every Last Child" campaign by Save the Children to ensure basic rights of marginalised and deprived children of Bangladesh.

A team of young volunteers visited two most disadvantaged areas - a haor in Habiganj and a slum in Rayerbazar. They talked to children, learnt about their conditions. At the dialogue, they narrated their experience.

Zayem Bin Tajdid, a volunteer, said, "Children in those areas have little access to education... and they do not get sufficient medical services."

"Children (in the haor area) have to go to school by boats... many of them are not even aware of water-borne diseases..." he added.

Speaking at the discussion, Md Mujibur Rahman, director general (DG) of Directorate of Bangladesh Haor and Wetland Development, said at least 24 percent people live under poverty line in the country.

Of them, 18 percent are from Haor areas, he said, adding that most of these children do not have access to education and other facilities.

"NGOs need to work on primary education in Haor areas," he suggested, adding that the government is also trying to take different measures to help the people in the areas.

Emphasising the importance of cultural activities, Anir Liton, director of Bangladesh Shishu Academy, said children living in the cities can participate in different cultural activities but those who are living in the remote areas cannot.

Underscoring the need for investing in children, Afrin Ara Begum, additional secretary (budget) of Finance Division in the Ministry of Finance, said none should be left behind, not even children, if the country wants to gain the status of a middle-income country.

Kazi Rowshan Akhter, DG of Department of Women Affairs, said a concerted effort is needed to ensure the rights of the deprived children in remote areas.

Dr Ishtiaq Mannan, deputy country director (programme operations) of Save the Children, called upon the youths to be vocal and work together to ensure the rights of the children.

Prof Abul Kalam Azad, DG of the Directorate General of Health Service, and SM Haroon-or-Rashid, DG of Bangladesh Television, also spoke.

### Undergraduate math Olympiad held

Shovon Sourav Datta, a student of applied mathematics department of Dhaka University won the 1st position in the 9th Dhaka South Regional Undergraduate Mathematics Olympiad 2017 held at the University of Asia Pacific (UAP) yesterday, said a press release.

Some 76 participants from different universities of Dhaka South zone took part in the contest.

## Govt forced public servants to join rally

Alleges Rizvi

BNP Senior Joint Secretary General Ruhul Kabir Rizvi yesterday alleged that the government is using the public servants for political purposes.

The government has committed a mistake by forcing the public servants to join the Suhrawardy Udyan rally marking the international recognition of the historic March 7 speech of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, he said.

In a statement, issued on Tuesday, Cabinet Division asked all the public servants to join the rally. Terming it unlawful, Rizvi said public servants are not forced to join a political programme in any democratic country.

He was speaking at a human chain organised by Pirojpur Nationalist Forum in Dhaka in front of Jatiya Press Club in the capital.
