173 Lawacherra trees felled

At least 173, out of 348 marked trees, beside the road in Lawacherra National Forest in Kamalganj upazila have been felled under social forestry project. The forest department planted the trees on a two-kilometre stretch along the roadside 24 years ago under the project, locals said. Rajkandi Range Forest Officer under Lawacherra Forest Department Abu Taher said 348 roadside trees were divided into five lots and around 173 trees of three lots have been sold for Tk 10 lakh and 61,959 under a tender floated in 2011-2012. Bangladesh Paribesh Andolon

(Bapa) Sylhet unit General Secretary Abdul Karim Kim said the trees like akashmoni, koroï, mahogany, kadam, chikarashi, jarul, pakiyara, gamari, lohakath, champasundori, bonak, rata and jam were cut down. Bapa central committee member Tofazzal Sohel said, "During our visit, we saw that around 300 large trees had been felled. We demand a halt to such a callous act." Tofazzal said this while he was talking to this reporter on Saturday. He said they want an immediate halt to the selling of chopped-down trees of the forest and cancellation of the project in the area.

"We receive foreign funds in the name of climate change adaptation projects but we fell down trees in our natural forests," Tofazzal said. He alleged that some ministries, directorates, and the district administration are directly and indirectly encouraging felling of trees, killing of animals and destruction of forests. Kamalganj Upazila Parishad Chairman Md Rafiqur Rahman said they have cut three lots, out of five, from Magurcherra to Phulbari, adding that they will start cutting the other two lots soon. Assistant Conservator of Wildlife at the district forest department Tabibur Rahman said they were not informed about the mat-

ter even when the trees were marked. Divisional Forest Officer (wildlife) Mihir Kumar Doe said if a tree is marked for the social forestry project then it will be cut. However, they are trying to stop cutting of trees, he added. Divisional Forest Officer of Sylhet Forest Division RSM Monirul Islam told this correspondent that he asked for a report about the trees from Rajkandi Range. After investigation, it was found that a large number of fruit trees were included in the remaining lots, he said, adding that they are trying to totally stop cutting of trees in the forest.

Two arrested in AL leader Swapna killing

Police yesterday arrested two people in connection with the killing of a woman leader of Awami League in Nabinagar upazila. The arrestees are Sayeed, 35, son of Dhon Mia of Charpara village, and Abu Jaher, 32, son of Abul Kalam of Karabari village in the upazila. The two were held from Jinodpur village, said Additional Superintendent of Police Md Iqbal Hossain. On Wednesday night, unidentified miscreants shot dead Swapna Akhter, women's affairs secretary of Nabinagar upazila unit of AL. On November 24, CNG-run auto-rickshaw driver Jahangir Mia was detained for interrogation.

Towel in woman's belly!

The object brought out through surgery after 3 months of caesarean

Believe it or not, a delivery patient carried a towel inside her abdomen for three months after her caesarean section at a private hospital in Habiganj town. The victim, Mollika Das, 38, wife of Sanjeeb Sarkar of Kakailseo village in Azmeriganj upazila of Habiganj, was saved from a life threatening situation as the towel was brought out after an operation on Saturday. "My wife was admitted to Chander Hasi Hospital for a caesarean on August 23. There Dr SK Ghosh conducted her operation. After a few days, she started feeling severe pain in her abdomen and was again taken to the hospital," said Sanjeeb Sarkar, now residing in the district town. "The doctor gave several tests for Mollika and the results showed something inside her belly. On Saturday afternoon, Dr Abul Kalam conducted an operation and brought out a towel from her belly," he said. "We were surprised to find a whole towel inside the patient's belly," said Dr Kalam. Dr SK Ghosh said, "It may have happened mistakenly." Habiganj Civil Surgeon Suchinto Chowdhury said, "I have not received any complaint regarding the incident yet. If complaint is lodged, action will be taken after investigation."

Sugar mill workers for wage hike

Workers of Rangpur Sugar Mill in Gaibandha yesterday demanded declaration of new wage structure. The demand was made at a rally in front of the mill. Rangpur Chinikal Sramik-Karmochhari Union organised the programme. Speakers said the mill authority is paying only Tk 4,200 per month which is too little to maintain a family in these hard days. Moreover, the workers have been rendering overtime services without getting any extra benefit. Sugar mill workers in the country have been fighting for declaration of a reasonable wage structure of Tk 8,750 to Tk 13,500 per month so that they can maintain their families properly, said the speakers. The speakers called upon the government to declare wage structure for the mill workers affecting from July 1, 2015. They urged the government for immediate implementation of the demand, otherwise agitation would be intensified all over the country. SM Jalal, president of Chinikal Workers' Union, and its secretary Tofazzal Hossain spoke at the rally.

Titu's bail prayer rejected

A Rangpur court yesterday rejected the bail prayer of Titu Chandra Roy, an accused under ICT Act, on charge of demeaning Prophet Muhammad [pbuh] in a Facebook post. The court fixed December 10 as the next date for hearing of the case. Police produced Titu, 40, son of late Khagen Chandra Roy of Thakurbari village under Rangpur Sadar upazila, before the Court of Senior Judicial Magistrate Ariful Islam around 1:00pm, said Court Inspector Monoj Kumar. At the hearing on Titu's bail prayer, Noresh Chandra Sarkar, who led 12 lawyers giving legal support to Titu, said, "Titu did not give any post in his Facebook demeaning the Prophet. The ID used for the alleged Facebook post does not belong to Titu." The court rejected the bail prayer and ordered sending the accused to jail. Police arrested Titu on November 14 and produced him before the court that granted eight days' remand for him in phases. Earlier on November 6, a case against him was filed with Gangachara Police Station under ICT Act. On November 10, hundreds of zealots attacked the Hindus at Thakurbari village protesting the Facebook post. Eleven houses were burnt and nine more were damaged. A man was killed and 20 others were injured when police fired bullets to repel the attackers. Two cases were filed with Gangachara and Rangpur Sadar police stations on November 11, accusing 2,000 people for the attacks.

Transport strike called off

Transport owners and workers of the district called off their indefinite strike on the fourth day yesterday. All sorts of vehicles started plying around 2:00pm yesterday. Road Transport Owners' Group and Transport Workers' Union called the strike which began on Thursday morning after some students of Hajee Danesh Science and Technology University (HSTU) burnt two buses following a clash. They demanded compensation for the buses burnt by the students, treatment expenses of injured workers and ensuring that students will not become unruly if something similar happens in future. The transport workers and owners yesterday agreed to call off the strike when HSTU authorities at a meeting assured them of meeting their demands. DC Mir Khairul Alam and SP Hamidul Alam arranged the meeting.

Try Jamaat for crimes

committing war crimes. "Jamaat should be tried in a similar way. It's the need of time," Shahriar added. He requested foreign experts to write on what had prompted them to support Bangladesh in 1971 and tell those stories to the country's future generations. He also urged the Bangladesh government to grant honorary citizenship to the experts. Also president of Ekatturer Ghatok Dhaka Nirmul Committee, Shahriar reiterated that the government should launch an official initiative to gain UN recognition of the 1971 genocide. The Nirmul Committee was working to set up an international commission to bring the perpetrators of "Rohingya genocide" to book and it was collecting testimonies from Rohingyas, he added. Historian Prof Muntassir Mamoon, also the president of 1971: Genocide-Torture Archive and Museum Trust, said people have to possess a similar kind of spirit like that of freedom fighters' during the Liberation War, which had inspired the war heroes to liberate the country and achieve a goal. US social worker Thomas A Dine, Prof Jayanta Kumar Ray of India, Julian Francis of the UK, and Brig (retd) RP Singh of India shared their fond Liberation War memories with the audience. RP Singh said they had fought side-by-side with Bangladeshi freedom fighters during the war and they now want to be a friend of Bangladesh during peace time. More than 100 Pakistani military personnel, who had committed genocide in 1971, can still be put on trial, he added. Lt Col (retd) Quazi Sajjad Ali Zahir Bir Protik and Cambodian war crimes researcher Man Sokkoeun also spoke. Later, the 4th annual conference of Bangladesh Itihas Sammilani was held at the same venue.
