Tottenham Hotspur striker Harry Kane scored a hat-trick against Southampton, his second in two games, yesterday to finish as the leading scorer in Europe's top five leagues for the year. He also broke Alan Shearer's single-year scoring record in England's Premier League.

Kane betters Shearer, Messi

Tottenham striker Harry Kane shattered a Premier League record yesterday with a hat-trick in a 5-2 rout of Southampton while Manchester United came from two goals down to rescue a dramatic 2-2 draw against Burnley, thanks to Jesse Lingard's double.

Kane said beating Alan Shearer's Premier League record for most goals in a calendar year was a "great feeling", his three goals guaranteed he finished as Europe's leading scorer for 2017.

"It was hard not to think about it, being level going into the game," said Kane. "I wanted to win the game but of course I wanted to score. Getting that record was a great feeling."

Kane has 39 Premier League goals in 2017, three more than Shearer's previous Premier League record of 36, set in 1995.

"They are fantastic players here. I said to them before the game to try and

set me up and they did that, so I'll have to take them out for dinner."

Former England captain Shearer was quick to congratulate Kane: "You've had a magnificent 2017 @HKane. You deserve to hold the record of most @premier league goals in a calendar year. Well done and keep up the good work," he tweeted.

Kane's third goal took him to 56 for club and country in 2017 -- lifting him above Barcelona's Lionel Messi to become Europe's top-scorer over the past 12 months in the five major countries.

"To get compared to those players -- the Messis and Shearers -- is what it is

all about," he said.

Meanwhile, with Manchester City not in action until Wednesday's trip to Newcastle, United are now 12 points behind the runaway leaders.

Burnley had not won at Old Trafford since 1962 but by the 36th minute they were 2-0 up.

Substitute Lingard finished as United's hero though as he scored with a sublime back-flicked finish from Ashley Young's cross in the 53rd minute before firing into the bottom corner in the first minute of stoppage-time to seal the draw.

Elsewhere, Alvaro Morata returned to lift Chelsea to a 2-0 win over Brighton that took the champions to within a point of second placed Manchester United.

Bournemouth salvaged a controversial 3-3 draw against fellow strugglers West Ham at Dean Court.

Watford ended a six-game winless run as Marco Silva's team came from behind to beat Leicester 2-1 at Vicarage Road.

KANE'S CANING

With 56 goals for the calendar year, Harry Kane surpassed Lionel Messi (54) to finish as the top scorer across Europe's top five leagues this year.

Messi, Cristiano Ronaldo, and Kane are the only players in Europe's top 5 leagues this century to score 55+ goals in a calendar year.

Only two players had previously outscored both Lionel Messi and Cristiano Ronaldo in a calendar year: Edin Dzeko and David Villa, both in 2009.

Kane's hat-trick against Southampton yesterday was his eighth of the year. He has more hat-tricks in 2017 than Messi, Ronaldo,

Robert Lewandowski, Sergio Aguero and Edinson Cavani combined.

Only five players in Premier League history have scored more hat-tricks in their entire Premier League career than Harry Kane has in 2017 alone. He finished with six Premier League trebles in the calendar year.

LOOKING BACK ON 2017 YEAR OF THE VETERANS

Evergreen Federer, who will turn 37 in 2018, took his majors tally to 19 with a fifth Australian Open title, which was secured by a five-set triumph over Nadal, and a record eighth Wimbledon with a stroll past a tearful Marin Cilic.

Nadal, 32 in June next year, was not to be out-done, claiming a 10th French Open, a third US Open crown and the year-ending world number one spot.

Federer finished the year at number two in the world, having started at 16, and a season-leading seven titles -- including three Masters at Indian Wells, Miami and Shanghai -- despite having skipped the entire clay court season.

"It's been an amazing year for me," said Federer who had missed the last six months of the 2016 season through injury.

Nadal added two Masters titles at Monte Carlo and Madrid to his triumphs at Roland Garros and Flushing Meadows, finishing the campaign with six trophies.

The 16-time Grand Sam champion also

secured the year-ending top ranking for a fourth time.

"I never would have imagined I would end up as number one at the end of the season again," said the Spaniard.

"It wasn't one of my goals going into the season -- far from it. After returning from a difficult period in my career and battling through injuries, this wasn't on my mind."

Nadal will go into the new season without his uncle Toni who has been his coach since childhood.

But one thing will be familiar -- his career-long battle with knee injuries.

Injury permitting, Nadal will start 2018 as top seed in Brisbane from next weekend with the Australian Open due to get underway on January 15.

On the women's circuit, Serena Williams started the year with an Open-era record 23rd Slam triumph in Melbourne.

The achievement was made even more remarkable when the American star revealed she had won the title while pregnant. Williams, who hasn't played since her Australian Open win, two months after the couple celebrated the birth of their baby daughter in September.

In Williams's absence, a power vacuum in the women's game opened up as Jelena Ostapenko and Sloane Stephens became two of the most unlikely champions at the Slams.



Abahani go top, Ctg Abahani held

Title contenders Abahani came from a goal down to hand a 2-1 defeat to Muktiyoddha Sangsad in their crucial Bangladesh Premier League encounter at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

Fit-again Towhidul Alam put Muktiyoddha Sangsad ahead in the first half before Nigerian duo Emeka Darlington and Sunday Chizoba struck one goal apiece for Abahani in the second half to extend the Sky Blues' winning streak to seven matches. The victory put the Dhanmondi outfit in pole position with 45 from 19 matches. Muktiyoddha Sangsad were in 10th position with 14 points from the same number of games.

Having blown open the title race by beating Chittagong Abahani in their previous match, a spirited Muktiyoddha Sangsad posed a heavy threat to Abahani and took a deserved lead in the 17th minute when Towhidul found the back of the net from a free-kick from the edge of the box. Abahani goalkeeper Shahidul Alam Sohel got a hand to it, but could not stop the ball from embracing the net after hitting the inside of the crossbar.

Abahani stepped up to intensify their attacks but were denied by the woodwork in the 22nd minute when a header from Sunday on a Wali Faisal cross came off the crossbar while Muktiyoddha Sangsad wasted a good chance from a counter attack as Towhidul drove wide off target despite getting the opposition goalkeeper on a one-on-one situation.

Muktiyoddha Sangsad goalkeeper Azad Hossain thwarted two efforts from Sunday

before Abahani made two changes to strengthen their attacking line-up by bringing on Emeka in place of defender Samad Yussif and defender Raihan Hasan in place of winger Nabib Newaj Jibon. The decision paid off as Emeka levelled the margin in the 67th minute by nodding in an Emon Babu corner.

The Sky Blues kept on pressing but Muktiyoddha Sangsad's goalkeeper made two brilliant saves on 76 and 87 minutes before Sunday headed inches over the cross-piece two minutes from time.

With the clock counting down to the end, Abahani earned a penalty from a planned attack in the 90th minute when Muktiyoddha's captain-cum-defender Abbas Inusah handled a goal-bound drive from Emon, with Sunday sending the goalkeeper the wrong way to wrap up the victory.

Meanwhile, early pace-setters Chittagong Abahani wasted an opportunity to join their Dhaka namesake after being held to a -1 draw by Brothers Union in the day's second match. The draw left the Chittagong outfit in third position despite being equal on 43 points with Sheikh Jamal DC, who will play their 19th match today.

Striker Towhidul Alam broke a six-match goalless streak to score his eighth goal of the campaign after as Chittagong Abahani took the lead in the 26th minute, but Saiful Bari's charges went into a shell after that. The strategy eventually made them pay heavily as Brothers Union's substitute striker Siyo Zunapio scored the equalising goal in the 89th minute with a powerful diagonal shot after defender Udoka Alison failed to clear a long ball.

The win took Brothers Union to 16 points from 19 matches but they remain in eighth position on the 12-team table.
