Rohingya communities from across the globe have demanded that the Rohingya refugees sheltering in Bangladesh be guaranteed security of life and property and peaceful coexistence as equals with all other people in Myanmar before they are repatriated.

"There is no change of attitude of the Myanmar government and its military towards Rohingya; still they identify Rohingya as recent 'Bengali interlopers' from Bangladesh," they said in a joint statement issued January 17.

Rohingyas continue entering Bangladesh due to continuing violence and brutality against them in Rakhine, says the statement that comes a day after Myanmar and Bangladesh signed terms of reference of physical arrangement in Nay Pyi Taw, on

January 16. Earlier on November 23, the two countries signed a repatriation deal amid global outcry against military crackdown on the Rohingya in Rakhine that forced over 655,000 Rohingyas to flee to Bangladesh since August 25 last year.

Dhaka wants peaceful solution: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said Bangladesh · seeks a peaceful solution to the Rohingya crisis.

"Bangladesh and Myanmar have already signed an agreement for the repatriation of Rohingyas. As a next door neighbor, Bangladesh always wants a peaceful solution to the problem," she said.

The premier said this when Director General and CEO of Opec Fund for International Development (OFID) Suleiman Jasir Al-Herbish met her at her office.

He said Suleiman praised the prime minister for giving shelter to the refugees saying she has accomplished a humanitarian obligation by doing so. He also enquired about the · progress of Rohinya repatriation.

Kalyan Trust (Freedom Fighters Welfare Trust) to give Tk 99.21 crore to the owner of the then Moon Cinema Hall in Waizghat area of Old Dhaka by July 30. The cinema hall issues involve a case regarding the constitution's fifth amendment which had legitimised the then

The Supreme Court yesterday directed the Muktijoddha

Mohammad Sayem and General Ziaur Rahman. Bangladesh Italian Marble Works Ltd (BIMWL), a private company, the owner of the cinema hall, will get the money (Tk 99.21 crore) in three installments following the apex court's order, Attorney General Mahbubey Alam told The

Daily Star. A five-member bench of the Appellate Division headed by Justice Md Abdul Wahhab Miah, who is performing functions of the chief justice, passed the order after disposing of a contempt of court petition filed by Maqsudul Alam, managing director of BIMWL.

He filed the petition in January, 2013 saying that the officials concerned of the government and Muktijoddha Kalyan Trust have not taken any step to hand over the ownership of the then Moon Cinema Hall to the company although the apex court had directed for doing so.

Ownership of all properties of Moon Cinema Hall was

handed over to Muktijoddha Kalyan Trust as an abandoned property during the martial law regime between August 15, 1975 and April 9, 1979 when a ban was imposed saying that the legality of the government's decision to declare any property abandoned cannot be challenged before any court. The High Court in August 2005 lifted the ban through scrap-

ping the fifth amendment of the constitution. The Appellate Division of the Supreme Court upheld the HC order.




