Federer stays cool in searing heat

Defending champion Roger Federer coolly swept into the Australian Open third round Thursday as Novak Djokovic survived a gruelling fitness

test under the brutal Melbourne sun.

But with temperatures touching an energy-sapping 40 Celsius (104 Fahrenheit) and ice-towels in use, third seed Garbine Muguruza and 2014 winner Stan Wawrinka both wilted and were knocked out.

Maria Sharapova, in contrast, laid down her title credentials with dominant win against 14th seed Anastasija Sevastova.

World number one Simona Halep was also convincing in her straight demolition of Canadian Eugenie Bouchard. Swiss 19-time Grand Slam champion

Federer disposed of Jan-Lennard Struff 6-4, 6-4, 7-6 (7/4), avoiding the worse of the furnace-like conditions in his night match. "I practice with him so I had the information I needed," he said, adding that the heat

doesn't bother him. "If you want to get to the top, you've got to play in all conditions."

It was never going to be easy for the German. While Federer had made at least the third round each year since his Melbourne Park debut in

2000, Struff had failed to go further than the second round at any Grand Slam.

Six-time Melbourne champion Djokovic had a much tougher time, coming through a four-setter against Gael Monfils in a thorough examination after being out for six months with an elbow injury. He lost the first set before Monfils began struggling in the second and was heard at one pointtellingtheumpire: "I'm tired and dizzy."

The Frenchman remarkably recovered to make a fight of it before a relieved Djokovic, seeded 14, came through 4-6, 6-3, 6-1, 6-3. "It was tough conditions, brutal, espe-

cially the first 90 minutes," he said. "I'm still not 100 percent, but building. I have a lot of faith and self-belief."

The heat took its toll on a host of players, including Wimbledon champion Muguruza, who suffered with heat-blistered feet.

She was knocked out by 88-ranked Hsieh Su-wei from Taiwan 7-6 (7/1), 6-4 but refused to make excuses.

Wawrinka also failed to progress, clearly still struggling from a lengthy knee injury lay-off in his straight sets defeat by American Tennys Sandgren.



Neymar booed off the Parc

Despite scoring four times, world record signing Neymar found himself on the receiving end of heavy jeers from supporters during Paris Saint-Germain's 8-0 win over Dijon on Wednesday night after he denied Edinson Cavani the chance to become the French club's all-time top scorer.

The Brazilian had been cheered only minutes earlier when he scored a sensational third goal, dribbling past sever Dijon defenders before unleashing a low shot from the edge of the area.

However, Cavani had drawn level with Zlatan Ibrahimovic's 156-goal record tally for the club with his solitary first-half strike.

With the Uruguayan just one goal away from becoming Les Parisiens' all-time record scorer, supporters urged Neymar to give Cavani the responsibility of taking a late penalty in the match, which could have led to Cavani scoring his second goal of the match.

The former FC Barcelona man, however, stepped up to take the spot-kick himself, seemingly upsetting many fans at the Parc des Princes.

"It was a very, very good PSG against a Dijon side that unfortunately didn't put up much resistance. We were almost perfect today," PSG defender Thomas Meunier said. However, the right-back went on to back Neymar after

the game, suggesting that the fans should be more thankful for the 25-year-old's performance. "It was a little ungrateful from the supporters," he said. "We sense the excitement each time Neymar touches the

ball but I know that they also appreciate Edinson. "However, you have to weigh up the pros and cons and put water in the wine, so when a player scores four goals and provides two more assists in a match... The team in general should be cheered and not just individual players."



Oscar Melendo slotted home a neat finish with two minutes remaining of a temperamental derby cup tie, racing onto Marc Navarro's low cross to punish Messi for missing a 62nd-minute penalty and send the home crowd into raptures.

In a match of few chances Barca's penalty, which came after a foul on Sergi Roberto, looked to be the decisive moment for the away side, but Espanyol keeper Diego Lopez dived superbly to his left to push Messi's powerful shot wide.

Navarro set up the winner on the 88th minute, giving Espanyol their first win over Barcelona in nearly nine years. Diego Costa's third goal in four matches wasn't enough


for Atletico Madrid as Sevilla twice scored late to stun their hosts 2-1 in the first leg at the Wanda Metropolitano.
