

## Rajshahi city to get flyover for first time

Rajshahi City Corporation is going to construct a flyover for the first time in the city for improving its traffic system.

It will be constructed at Budhpara railway crossing with an estimated cost of around Tk 29.29 crore under the Tk 182.68 crore Rajshahi-Naogaon-Natore four-lane road construction project.

RCC authorities revealed this while signing contracts with two construction firms at the City Bhaban on Thursday. Under the contracts, the road and flyover will be constructed simultaneously. Superintendent Engineer Khandakar Khairul Bashar signed the contracts on behalf of the city corporation while Towhid Al Masud and Khorshed Alam on behalf of their respective firms.

City Mayor Mosaddique Hossain Bulbul addressed the signing ceremony as the chief guest with Chief Executive Officer Shah Mumin in the chair.

## HC set to hear petition on CJ post vacancy

The High Court is scheduled to hear tomorrow a writ petition that challenged the legality of keeping the post of chief justice vacant and not appointing a successor to former chief justice Surendra Kumar Sinha.

The bench of Justice Zinat Ara and Justice Kazi Md Ejarul Haque Akondo on January 18 fixed Sunday for hearing the petition, as four separate HC benches had earlier refused to deal with the same petition, writ petitioner Advocate Eunus Ali Akond told The Daily Star yesterday.

He also said the HC benches did not mention any specific reason behind their refusal to hear the petition.

Advocate Eunus submitted the writ petition as public interest litigation to the HC on January 3, seeking an HC rule asking the respondents to explain why their action of keeping the post vacant and not appointing a new chief justice should not be declared illegal.

Secretaries to the cabinet division, president's office, law ministry, prime minister's principal secretary and registrar general of the Supreme Court were cited as respondents in the petition.

Quoting from the petition, Eunus said the post of chief justice cannot be kept vacant even for a day under the constitution, but the respondents have not appointed a new chief justice after Justice SK Sinha resigned on November 10 last year.

In the petition, Eunus also prayed that the HC orders the respondents to appoint him the chief justice until disposal of the rule.

Justice Md Abdul Wahhab Miah of the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court has been discharging the duties of chief justice since October 3 last year, when then chief justice SK Sinha went on leave before finally stepping down.

## LPG PRICING

# Amid policy vacuum, people paying extra

It has been three years since the government decided to set the LPG (liquid petroleum gas) pricing, but the effort remained futile due to influences of some vested interest groups.

As a result, consumers are paying more for LPG cylinders with no policy whatsoever in place.

The move was initiated by the Energy Division to formulate a LPG pricing policy to reduce the price.

But each LPG cylinder (12.5kg) is now being sold in the local market at Tk 1,100-1,200 whereas, a committee of the government's Energy Division had calculated that the price should not cross Tk 730.

Three years back, the Energy Division moved to formulate the LPG pricing policy as per the government's order. The government was trying to promote LPG as cooking gas replacing piped natural gas, distributed by the state-owned Titas and other gas companies.

Identifying high market price of LPG as a barrier to its promotion, the Energy Division held a stakeholders' meeting with the participation of the LPG marketing companies.

Taking their opinion into consideration, it formed a committee to draft a formula to fix the pricing at the retail market.

The committee, headed by the then additional secretary Kazi Zebunnesa Begum, found that after all the expenses a 12.5kg LPG cylinder should not be sold at above Tk 703.

The committee, comprising representations from public and private sectors, made a recommendation to introduce labelling of maximum retail price (MRP) on the cylinders and make it mandatory for traders to sell it at the fixed rate.

"But some... blocked the move by their influence on the political level," said a senior official at the Energy Division preferring anonymity. Also, the recommendation of fixing the price could not be implemented due to opposition from some major companies.

A good number of companies, including two from the public sector, are operating in the LPG business in the country. The major private operators are Omera, Bashundhara, Beximco, Total Gaz, Klean Heat, Jamuna, Orion, Bin Habib and Super Gas (TK Gas).

Disagreeing with the concept of fixing the price, Jakaria Jalal, general manager (strategic planning) of Bashundhara LPG, said it would be unrealistic to fix the LPG price for retail market as the price of the product is linked with the oil price in global market, where it fluctuates all the time.

## Padma Bridge to be completed by December: Quader

Road Transport and Bridges Minister Obaidul Quader on Thursday told the parliament that the construction of Padma Bridge is expected to be completed by December 2018.

"Efforts are on to complete the bridge by December 2018 through installation of the remaining spans in phases alongside pile driving and installation of pair columns," Quader said in response to a starred question from Awami League lawmaker Salina Begum (Reserved seat-6).

Fifty percent of the overall physical progress of the project is done. One span (superstructure) of the bridge has already been installed while another will be installed this month, he added.

## Wild elephants kill Rohingya

A Rohingya refugee was killed in an attack by two wild elephants in Ukhiya upazila of Cox's Bazar yesterday morning.

The deceased is Yakub Ali, 45. Five other Rohingyas were injured and six tents were destroyed at the Modhurchora Rohingya camp in Balukhali area, said police.

The injured were admitted to the upazila health complex.

## Child bride found dead in Faridpur

A child bride was found hanging in her Dumain house in Madhukhali upazila of Faridpur early yesterday.

The deceased, Marufa Begum, 15, was married off to Saiful Islam, 22, just four months ago. It was difficult for her mother to raise her daughter alone after her husband Jafor Sheikh had died.

Dipali Begum found her daughter hanging with a scarf hours after Marufa and Saiful went to sleep.

Meanwhile, the villagers handed Saiful of Arpara village over to police when he tried to flee.

## Two robbers held with 30 gold bars in Jhenidah

Police arrested two robbers with 30 gold bars, which they earlier looted from smugglers, at Kotchandpur in Moheshpur upazila of Jhenidah early yesterday.

On January 4 night, Harunur Rashid Milon, 28, of Kotchandpur Adarshapara, and Asrafal Alam alias Potla, 47, of Post Office area, looted 47 gold bars from two passengers, who were travelling in the same bus, at gunpoint when the vehicle reached Sundarpur.

The bars, worth Tk 1.3 crore, were being smuggled to India, police said.

Police are trying to recover the other bars.
