

Kyrgios ousts Tsonga

Wozniacki kept their Grand Slam hopes alive on a hot draining day.

But French Open champion Jelena Ostapenko's tournament is over, with the Latvian seventh seed crashing out in three sets to Estonian Annet Kontaveit.

Spanish world number one Nadal showed no mercy to 28th seed Damir Dzumhur on Margaret Court Arena, as he rediscovers his best form after ankle trouble. The top seed raced through the match in

just 1hr 50min, wasting as little energy as possible in the 6-1, 6-3, 6-1 rout. Third seed Dimitrov, who could meet Nadal in the semis, had plenty to prove after

a huge second-round fright from a qualifier,

who pushed him to five sets. And the Bulgarian delivered in a testing 6-3, 4-6, 6-4, 6-4 win over Russian rising star Andrey Rublev as temperatures touched 40

Celsius (104 Fahrenheit). He will next face Australian Nick Kyrgios who beat French veteran Jo-Wilfried Tsonga in four close and entertaining sets in a primetime evening match on Rod Laver Arena.

Second seed Wozniacki has not impressed so far, but she put in a better performance to beat Dutch 30th seed Kiki

Bertens 6-4, 6-3, finally getting over the line on her fourth match point.

It sets her up with a clash against 19thseeded Slovak Magdalena Rybarikova.

Fourth seed Elina Svitolina also kept her title dreams alive by ending the hopes of young teenage pretender Marta Kostyuk.

At just 15, Kostyuk was the youngest Melbourne Park third-round contestant since Martina Hingis in 1996. But she still has a lot to learn with fellow Ukrainian Svitolina handing out a 6-2, 6-2 lesson.

She now plays another qualifier -- bigserving Czech Denisa Allertova who romped past Magda Linette 6-1, 6-4 -- for a place in the quarter-finals on Sunday. In a tournament shorn of seeds, 81st-

ranked Petra Martic also swept into the round of 16, celebrating her 27th birthday by holding off a gritty three-set challenge from Thai qualifier Luksika Kumkhum. Her reward is a match against Belgium's

Elise Mertens, who beat struggling Alize Cornet of France in two tough sets.

Cornet was among players wilting in the heat, with a doctor taking her blood pressure early in the second set as she succumbed to the baking weather.

No matches have been called off or roofs closed at the opening Grand Slam of the year despite the soaring temperatures, with tournament organiser Craig Tiley defending the decision.





FC Barcelona shelled out more than 200 million euros (\$245 million) for Neymar including his salary and the "countless hidden clauses of the transfer," Spain's El Mundo daily said

If confirmed, this would be greatly superior to the 57.1 million euros the club said it paid for his 2013 transfer, or even the 83.3 million euros later estimated by Spanish authorities probing irregularities in the move.

The 25-year-old and his parents have been ordered to stand trial over the transfer, as have Barcelona president Josep Maria Bartomeu and his predecessor Sandro Rosell.

El Mundo based its information on documents handed over to Spanish prosecutors by Brazilian authorities, which are also probing the football star for tax evasion.

A judicial source, who refused to be named, confirmed to AFP that prosecutors had indeed received those documents.

But the source wasn't able to give any concrete figures, adding prosecutors received the documents in August last year.

The Spanish judge in charge of the case has still not set a date for the trial and has to decide whether he can accept the latest information as evidence, as it arrived after the probe was closed, the sources say.

divided into two parts.

On the one hand was "the footballer's salary, which went up to 71 million euros before tax in five years," and on the other hand "many fictitious contracts... that reach 134 million."

Among these contracts, El Mundo includes an agreement to play friendly matches with Santos, Neymar's former club, which never took place.

The case against Neymar initiated with a complaint from Brazilian investment company DIS, which owned 40 percent of Neymar's sporting rights at the time of his transfer.

DIS received just 6.8 million euros -- 40 percent of the 17 million euros fee paid to Santos -- with the company claiming it was cheated out of its real share because part of the transfer fee was concealed by Barcelona, Santos and the Neymar family.
