Ctg fire kills 1, injures 7



A man was killed and seven others were injured in a fire that broke out at an IPS (instant power supply) manufacturing factory in Chittagong city yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Shubhro Das, 50, owner of the factory housed on the third and fourth floors of a fivestorey building at Andarkillah intersection. All the injured are workers at the factory.

Purno Chandra Mutsuddi, deputy assistant director (DAD) of Fire Service and Civil Defence, said the fire broke out at a room on the fourth floor around 7:35pm and spread to other rooms.

All the eight injured persons were taken to Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH) where the doctors declared Shubhro dead.

Punish attackers of VC

Demand DU students at press confce DU CORRESPONDENT

Those who allegedly assaulted DU vice chancellor and destroyed university properties have to be punished, demanded

a group of Dhaka University students yesterday. Under the banner of "Sachetan Sadharan Shikkharthibrindo", the students were addressing a press con-

ference at Madhur Canteen on the campus. They also sought punishment for Bangladesh Chhatra League men if a probe finds them guilty over an attack on dem-

onstrators on Tuesday. Although the students claimed themselves as general students,

some of them have affiliation with a student organisation. Of them, Benojir is social welfare affairs secretary of

Masterda Surja Sen Hall unit of BCL while Mahmudul drama and debate affairs secretary of Haji Muhammad Mohsin Hall unit of the pro-Awami League student body.

Meanwhile, BCL held another press conference there under the banner of "Chhatra Sangram Parishad".

BCL President Saifur Rahman Sohag, reading out a written statement, said, "The attackers were introducing themselves as

general students." The participants demanded investigation into Tuesday's incident and immediate announcement of Ducsu polls schedule.

Seven student bodies -- including BCL (Jatiya Samajtantrik

Dal) and Chhatra Maitree -- expressed their solidarity with the demands. On Tuesday, a group students and activists of some left-leaning

student organisations demonstrated inside the VC office, demanding punishment for the BCL men for allegedly harassing some female students during their January 15 sit-in.

Several hundred BCL activists swooped on the protesters to "rescue" DU VC Prof Akhtaruzzaman as he was kept confined before his office by the demonstrators, leaving 50 of them injured.

Malaysian field hospital catering to Rohingyas

On Friday afternoon, eight-year-old Basir Mia broke his arm while playing with his friends at Kutupalong refugee camp in Cox's Bazar.

The next morning, his father Ziaur Rahman took him to a hospital in Ukhia upazila.

The doctor X-rayed Baisr's arm and found that it was broken. He put the arm in a plaster cast and also fixed February 24 for a follow-up.

Like Basir, around 100 patients have received treatment at the 55-bed field hospital, which is set up by the Malaysian government in response to the Rohingya humanitarian crisis.

A total of 4,326 patients, 41 percent of whom are Rohingya refugees while others are Bangladeshis, have received treatment at the hospital since its inauguration on December 1.

The temporary hospital has seven specialised doctors, five medical officers, including psychiatrists for rape and trauma victims, 18 nurses, 140 staff and one operation room.

Team leader of the hospital, Dr Fatahul Laham Mohamed, yesterday told The Daily Star that a total of 140 operations, mostly hernia surgeries, had been performed at the hospital till now.

The healthcare facility regularly receives hernia and maternity cases while the outpatient section, which remains closed on Friday, mostly gets gastroenteritis cases.

The tents, in three rows, have medicine, paediatric, general surgery, orthopaedic, gynaecology and obstetrics and emergency sections. Besides basic medical equipment, the field hospital has air-conditioned facility.

FOCUS ON HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE

A special delegation, led by Chief of Malaysian Armed Forces Tan Sri Raja Mohamed Affandi Raja Mohamed Noor and Hollywood actress Michelle Yeoh, yesterday visited the

Malaysian field hospital and talked to the patients. The delegation also distributed relief items like medical

equipment, medicines and food in response to the escalating need of medical care among the refugees.

The delegation made the visit to evaluate the impact of aid provided till date and ensure that the Malaysian field hospital is equipped with adequate resources to tackle and provide good care to the Rohingya refugees.

Talking to the media, Affandi said the Malaysian prime minister is concerned over the humanitarian issue and the plight of the Rohingyas.

When asked whether he would contact the Myanmar

generals to solve the problem, he said, "My concentration is purely on assistance, humanitarian assistance. We are here today just to pursue what we can do in this regard."

UNDP Goodwill Ambassador Michelle Yeoh said. "I would like to extend that our prime minister wants to send his sincere gratitude to all our Malaysian heroes who have been coming in and out of the field hospital here."

"I think it is very important for us to see the exchange, the holding out of the hand and to show that there is hope because together we can build a better future, but we have to do it together."

Road accidents kill 6 5 injured in 3 districts

At least six people were killed and five others sustained injuries in separate road accidents in Chittagong, Munshiganj, Bagerhat and Faridpur yesterday.

In Chittagong, two motorcyclists identified as Mahbubul Alam, 45, and Mozammel Haque, 36, were killed as a passenger bus hit their bike in Kagajipara area on Chittagong-Cox's Bazar Highway around 8:30am, said Sub-inspector Mosharraf Hossain of Patiya Police Station.

Locals rescued the duo and took them to Patiya Upazila Health Complex where the doctors declared them dead.

The driver of the bus, Belal, 26, was arrested, the police official added. In another incident in Akabar Shah area in the port city, Saidul Haque, 61, was killed and Md Hossain, 18, was injured as a bus ran them over, said Assistant Subinspector Alauddin Talukder of Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH) Police Camp.

Our Munshiganj correspondent added, Shafiq, 50, an auto-rickshaw driver was killed when a covered van hit the auto-rickshaw in Chanabari in Srinagar upazila on Dhaka-Mawa highway, said Sub-inspector Md Aminul of Srinagar Police Station.




