

Rohingyas face forced starvation

Says new report of Amnesty Int'l

Myanmar security forces continue the ethnic cleansing of the Rohingyas in Rakhine, Amnesty International says in a new report. The report was prepared on the ongoing forced starva-

tion, looting and sexual violence, which coerced hundreds of people to flee in the recent weeks. Nineteen Rohingya men and women, who have arrived in Cox's Bazar recently, described how they faced forced

starvation, abductions and looting of property in their home in recent weeks when humanitarian agencies too have documented thousands of new arrivals over the course of December and January. Nearly 700,000 Rohingyas fled the atrocities since

August 25 last year after the Arakan Rohingya Salvation Army reportedly attacked around 30 security force outposts in Rakhine, where the Rohingyas have been denied citizenship and other basic rights though they have been living there for generations. The crimes committed by the military include wide-

spread killing of women, men, and children; rape and other forms of sexual violence against women and girls; mass deportation; and the systematic burning of villages.

Facing sharp global criticism, Myanmar signed a repatriation deal with Bangladesh and were preparing for return of SEE PAGE 17 COL 2

The day that started with the shining comeback of veteran left-arm spinner Abdur Razzak, who claimed four wickets on his Test return after a four-year absence, was full of action from start to stumps, which

HRW urges govt to stop arbitrary arrests, detention

The Bangladesh government should stop the arbitrary arrests and detention of opposition BNP supporters and others, Human Rights Watch has said.

Hundreds have been arrested or placed under preventive detention ahead of the verdict in the graft case against BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia, and five others, including her son, the global rights group said in a statement yesterday.

The government should publicly order the security forces to abide by international standards on policing

MALDIVES POLITICAL CRISIS

Yameen sends envoys to China, Saudi for support

Shuns European diplomats as UNSC to host meeting on crisis

The embattled president of the Maldives has sent envoys to friendly nations such as China, Pakistan and Saudi Arabia to brief them on a political crisis in the Indian Ocean nation that spurred the imposition of a state of emergency, his office said.

Abdulla Yameen left out key regional power India, which had joined Britain, the United States and the United Nations in calling for the lifting of the emergency and the freeing of two supreme court

judges whose ruling against Yameen sparked new instability.

The Maldives, best known for luxury tourist resorts, has become another arena of contest for India and China after it signed up to Beijing's Belt and Road initiative to build trade and transport links across Asia and beyond.

India, which has had longstanding political and security ties to the islands about 400 km away, has sought to push back against China's expanding




Number of deer falls in Rajshahi Zoo
