Can Arambagh break final jinx?

Take on defending champions Chittagong Abahani in final today

Lightweights Arambagh will look to break their tournament final jinx

when they square off against defending champions Chittagong Abahani in the final of the Walton Independence Cup at the Bangabandhu National Stadium today.

Since the establishment of the club in 1958, Arambagh have never won any silverware despite playing in four finals so far -- finals of the Federation Cup in 1997, 2001 and 2016 and the final of Victory Day Football tournament organsied by Mohammedan in 2008. Interestingly, Arambagh lost three of those four finals against Abahani except for the 2001 Federation Cup final where they lost against Muktijoddha Sangsad.

The youthful Arambagh side are now up against another Abahani -one from Chittagong, who won the tournament last year. The question is whether the Motijheel-based outfit can break their final jinx, with high expectations on them following victories over heavyweights Dhaka Abahani and Sheikh Jamal in the quarterfinal and semifinal respectively.

The charges of UEFA A licensed coach Maruful Haque were not up to the mark at the start of the season, but they started playing well from the second leg of the premier league,

eventually finishing eighth in the 12team table. They have now reached the final of the season-ending tournament playing some enterprising football. Now they are seemingly upbeat about breaking the final jinx to win the first silverware in club history.

"The boys took time to understand my coaching but they have now adapted to the system and we are getting the results in the

Independence Cup," Maruful said. "If we can implement the system we have developed and the strategy we have applied in the final match, we can become champions."

Maruful also tipped his side as favourites and believes the lacking his side have will be overcome through fitness and confidence.

The veteran coach Maruful has been playing his youthful side in

counter-attacking system, keeping the defence solid and players like winger Arif, striking duo of Abu Sufian Sufil and Mohammad Jewel and midfielder Shahriar Bappy are playing key roles in this system.

Maruful's counterpart, Zulfiker Mahmud Mintu -- who once worked as his deputy -- is also confident about defending the title as consolation after missing out on the Federation Cup and Bangladesh Premier League titles.

"Arambagh are a good and spirited side. They have good players, plan and strategy but we know all about those. We have also worked on those points in the practice sessions and we know what we have to do to stop them in the final," said Mintu, who is seemingly a bit worried over the fatigue of his players following their action round the year.

Both Arambagh and Chittagong Abahani were in the same group of the tournament and the port-city outfit came from a goal down to secure a 1-1 draw during the group stage to ensure their last eight berth. The team's captain-cum-goalkeeper Ashraful Islam Rana considered Arambagh as the favourites for the final.

"Arambagh have been playing good football as they came to this stage by beating two big teams. They also dominated us in the group stage match. Tomorrow's final will be a fifty-fifty affair, so it is not going to be an easy encounter for either side. I think the best side on the pitch will come out victorious," said the national team's goalkeeper.

Coutinho opens his Barcelona account

Philippe Coutinho came off the bench to score his first goal for Barcelona in a 2-0 win at Valencia on Thursday that saw his new club ease into another

Copa del Rey final.

Coutinho broke the deadlock in the 49th minute of the semifinal, second leg at Mestalla, having only come on at the start of the second half.

It was the first time the Brazilian had found the net since his blockbuster 160 million-euro move from Liverpool in January.

Ivan Rakitic then swept home the second goal eight minutes from the end as holders Barcelona secured a place in the final for the fifth season running, becoming the first side to achieve such a feat.

Winners of the trophy in each of the last three campaigns, the Catalans will face Sevilla in the final set for the weekend of April 21 and 22. Sevilla beat Leganes 2-0 on Wednesday to go through 3-1 on aggregate.

"For me it is my first final, so it is a very special moment," Coutinho told Spanish TV station Gol. "I am very happy. I had been searching for this goal in my first few matches. Today I got it and it helped the team get through to the final."

Valencia had been hoping to reach the final for the first time since they won the trophy under Ronald Koeman in 2008, beating Barcelona in the last four on the way.

"Barca have been used to playing finals in recent years, but not so much in my case," said Barcelona coach Ernesto Valverde, for whom the win came on the eve of his 54th birthday.

With Barcelona nine points clear at the top of La Liga and still in the Champions League, he remains on course to win what would be a remarkable treble in his first season at the club since arriving from Athletic Bilbao.

"Of course we want to try to win everything we can, but I don't like to talk about trebles until they happen. For the moment all we have is the possibility of playing in a final," he said.

Trailing 1-0 from the first leg after Luis Suarez's strike separated the teams at the Camp Nou last week, Valencia did almost level the tie on aggregate early on. However, Rodrigo's header beat Jasper Cillessen in the Barca goal only to come back off the bar.

Lionel Messi had come close on a couple of occasions for the visitors in the first half, but it was the introduction of Coutinho that swung the tie decisively their way. Valverde sent his recent recruit on in place

of Andre Gomes, and Coutinho quickly made his mark, turning in a Suarez cross at the back post. Valencia had centre-back Ezequiel Garay carried off and then saw Cillessen make an

incredible save to deny Jose Gaya from pointblank range in the 74th minute. They were condemned to a sixth straight

defeat in all competitions as Suarez pounced on a Gabriel Paulista error and set up Rakitic to make it 2-0 on the night. The only slight setback for Barca was the

sight of centre-back Gerard Pique coming off hurt late on, with Colombian international defender Yerry Mina coming on for his debut.

Valverde later admitted that he was suffering from muscle fatigue having gambled on his fitness at the start of the game.

Winter Olympics begin minus 10C at the opening ceremony.

The opening ceremony of the 23rd Winter Olympics unfurled in frigid temperatures and high spirits on Friday, as athletes from the two Koreas marched into the stadium together less than 50 miles from the heavily-fortified border between their nations, offering hope of a break-

stirred fears of nuclear conflict. The festivities started what organizers say is the largest Winter Olympics yet, with 92 countries participating. The North and South Korean delegations, marching under one flag, embodied the hopes of a peninsula

through in a tense, geopolitical standoff that has

Kim Yu-na, South Korea's former gold medal-winning figure skater, wore skates as she lit the Olympic cauldron, after being handed the torch by two members of the joint Korean women's ice hockey team -- one player from the North and one from the South.

divided by history and ideology.

Lee Hee-beom, head of the Games organising committee, said "the North and South have become one through the Olympics".

"Pyeongchang Olympics will become the hope and light for everyone that hopes for peace, not only on the Korean peninsula but in northeast Asia and the entire world," said Lee. In contrast, Russia's athletes entered the

ceremony behind a neutral flag after their team was suspended over a doping scandal. Despite the ban, 168 "Olympic Athletes from Russia" will compete in Pyeongchang. Just hours earlier, 47 Russians lost a court

bid to take part in the Games after they were left off the list of athletes deemed clean from doping.

Shivering athletes and spectators are bracing for one of the coldest Winter Olympics on record, with real-feel temperatures plumbing

Japan's speed skaters are among the ath-

letes who decided it was too cold to brave the open-air ceremony, while organisers handed out heat packs, blankets and hats to keep spectators warm.

But Tonga's Pita Taufatofua, echoing his

eye-catching entrance at the Rio Olympics, happily braved the chill as he appeared stripped to the waist and with his chest heavily oiled. Expectations are sky-high for an array of stars at Pyeongchang, including American

skiers Mikaela Shiffrin and Lindsey Vonn, while the drama in figure skating centres on whether Japan's "Ice Prince" Yuzuru Hanyu can recover from injury to retain his crown.

Potential winners also include French flagbearer Martin Fourcade in biathlon, hoping to add to his two gold medals in Sochi in 2014.


Alpine giant slalom great Marcel Hirscher of Austria is also among the gold medal hunters.

The sensational 15-year-old Alina Zagitova of Russia will take the spotlight in women's figure skating, where a showdown is expected with her fellow Russian teen, Evgenia Medvedeva.

Another teenage breakout star could be Chloe Kim, 17, the American whose parents are Korean and who is tipped for gold in snowboard as well as adulation by the host nation.

For the South Koreans, major home hopes rest on the slender shoulders of yet another teenage girl. In short-track speed skating, 19year-old Choi Min-jeong is among the favourites for a gold-medal sweep of all four races.

Competition gets into full swing on Saturday with five gold medals available, in ski jumping, cross country skiing, biathlon, speed skating and short-track speed skating.
