Saving Halda's broodfish

Vigilantes patrol river to stop indiscriminate fishing, help natural spawning

As residents of Uttar Madarsa village in Hathazari upazila settle in for the evening, a group of 30 vigilantes gear up to keep an eye on the Halda River to stop the indiscriminate fishing of broodfish. Two teams of 15 members each patrol a 40-kilometre

stretch of the river -- from Sattar Ghat to Moduna Ghat -from dusk till dawn.

These teams set off on their mission to save the fish on their own in January last year.

In 2010, the Department of Fisheries had imposed a ban on fishing in the 40-km river stretch that crosses through the Hathazari and Raozan upazilas, to help the natural spawning of fish.

But with little to no monitoring, some locals took advantage and fished in seclusion and at night when no one was As a result, fish yield and variety were both negatively

impacted.

Historic show of Koreas' unity

Winter Olympics open with hope; two Koreas march under one flag, Kim Jong Un's sister, South's president shake hands

The two Koreas marched together under one flag and South Korea's president shared a historic handshake with Kim Jong Un's sister as the Pyeongchang Winter Olympics opened in a spirit of intense rapprochement yesterday.

At a glittering ceremony, South and North Korea brought the crowd to its feet as they entered behind the blue-and-white Korean unification flag. South Korean President Moon Jae-in

shook the hand of a smiling Kim Yo Jong, the powerful sister of North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, as he entered the VIP seating section, and again as the Korean athletes marched.

It cemented what has been a rapid improvement in Korean ties since North

Korea -- after months of fierce nuclear rhetoric and missile tests -- agreed last month to attend its first Olympics in the South.

Kim Yo Jong, the first member of the North's ruling dynasty to venture South since the Korean War, forms part of the highest level delegation ever to cross the border.

South and North Korea last marched together at the 2006 Winter Olympics in Turin. They also made the symbolic gesture at the opening of the 2000 and 2004 Olympics in Sydney and Athens.

"You will inspire us all to live together in peace and harmony despite all the differences we have," said International Olympic Committee president Thomas Bach, before Moon declared the Games open.

Warns top UN official; pro-opposition broadcaster shuts

A senior UN official warned the Security Council on Thursday that the situation in the Maldives where the president has declared a state of emergency may deteriorate even further.

The top UN body met behind closed doors to discuss the crisis sparked by President Abdulla Yameen's decision to arrest judges who had ordered the release of his political opponents.

UN Assistant Secretary-General Miroslav Jenca told the top UN body that while there were no reports of violent clashes, "the

Mars on Earth!

Astronauts simulate Martian life in remote desert of Oman

Astronauts are spending a month in isolation on a simulated 'red planet' in the desolate Dhofar desert in Oman to help prepare humanity for a future mission to Mars. Using a drone, robotic rovers and an inflatable

greenhouse, the astronauts will carry out 19 experiments on this baron area, picked for its resemblance to Mars.

Seen from space, the Dhofar Desert is a flat, brown expanse and few animals or plants survive its temperatures that can top 125 degrees Fahrenheit, or 51 degrees Celsius.

On the eastern edge of a seemingly endless dune is the Oman Mars Base -- a giant 2.4-ton inflated habitat surrounded by shipping containers turned into labs and crew quarters.

More than 200 scientists from 25 nations have chosen it as their location to field-test technology for a manned mission to the red planet which Nasa




