

Upcoming grand biopics



With the upcoming rush of biopics in Bollywood, the years 2018 and 2019 might come to be known as 'the years of biopics' in Bollywood history. 2018 and 2019 are going to see a bunch of biopics on different Indian personalities – from politicians to legendary actors to former sports superstars. Shraddha Kapoor will be seen in the role of Saina Nehwal in an upcoming biopic which is scheduled to be released in 2019. Aishwarya Rai has been approached to play Shehnaz Hussain in an upcoming biopic which is still in the planning stages. Priyanka Chopra who has formerly impressed viewers in *Mary Kom* is being considered to play PT Usha in an upcoming untitled biopic. Ali Fazal from last year's film *Victoria and Abdul* has been in talks with a Hollywood director to star in important role in a biopic.


