TANVIR MOKAMMEL announces new film

"Rupsa Nodi'r BaNke" to chronicle life of a leftist politician

Eminent Bangladeshi filmmaker Tanvir Mokammel is all set to begin work on a historical feature film titled "Rupsa Nodi'r BaNke" (English title "Quiet Flows the River Rupsa"). The filmmaker announced his latest big screen project in a press conference at the Bangladesh Film Institute on Tuesday.

The film, which chronicles the life of a leftist politician who was killed by Razakars during the 1971 Liberation War, will begin principal photography later this month in Khulna, and will also shoot in Dhaka Central Jail, Tangail and Comilla. The film is expected to complete production in July and is slated for a December 2018 release, Mokammel

informed at the press conference.

The film, which has a government grant of 50,00,000 taka, is also running a crowdfunding campaign to raise another 46,00,000 taka to fulfill its budget. The two-hour film has cast Zahid Hossain Shovon, Ramendu Mazumdar, Khairul Alam Sabuj, Ataur Rahman, Chitralekha Guha, Keramat Mowla, Jhuna Chowdhury, Rajib Salehin, Naziba Basher, Masum Basher, Bijon Sarkar, Baishakhi Ghosh and others in its various roles.

Uttam Guha will be the chief assistant director and art director for the project, while Syed Sabab Ali Arzu and Rana Masud are assistant directors. Arzu will also direct music for it, while Mahfuzur Rahman Khan will serve as DOP, and Chitralekha Guha as cast-

ing and costume director. Adnan Ahmed Imtiaz will serve as executive producer for the film, which is being produced under the banner of Kino-Eye Films.

Tanvir Mokammel, an Ekushey Padak laureate with nine National Film Awards to his credit, is equally prolific as a feature and documentary filmmaker and has a penchant for historical films. His most notable works include features "Nodi'r Naam Modhumoti" (1995), "Chitra Nodi'r Paare" (1999), "Lalsalu" (2001), "Lalon" (2004), "Rabeya" (2008) and "Jibondhuli" (2014), while some of his most remarkable documentaries include "Smriti Ekattor" (1991), "Karnaphuli'r Kanna" (2005), "1971" (2011) and his most latest work "Seemantorekha" (2017).

Noted educationist, writer and cultural activist Anwara Bahar Chowdury's birth centenary was observed on February 13 at the Sufia Kamal Auditorium of Bangladesh National Museum. The evening began with the screening

of a documentary made by Iqbal Bahar Chowdhury on the life and achievements of his mother Anwara Bahar Chowdhury. Nasreen Shams, eldest daughter of Anwara Barhar chowdhury, then sang "Tumi Kon Kanoner Phool", followed by Sadi Mohammad's rendition of "Tumi Ki Keboli Chhobi". Shama Rahman sang "Modhuro Tomar Shesh Ja Nai Pai".

Prominent personalities remembered Anwara Bahar Chowdhury and her achievements and sacrifices at the memorial programme. "Anwar Bahar Chowdhury helped create a culturally rich nation by patronizing women's education and motivating cultural activities for

much she did for the society," he said. "Anwara Bahar Chowdhury was one of

those persons who did for the society more than they did for themselves," said Professor Dr. Anisuzzaman. The struggle she had to undergo taking care of her husband and eminent political personality Habibullah Bahar Chowdhury - who was ailing for thirteen years - and looking after four children was remarkable, he added.

Iqbal Bahar Chowdhury concluded the programme with recitation of a poem by Anwara Bahar Chowdhury and thanking all who attended the event.

Born on 13th February in 1918 to a noble Muslim family, Anwara Bahar Chowdhury became a torch-bearer of female education. After obtaining a BA degree with first division and then passing BT, a graduation in teaching she started her career as a teacher. She worked as the headmistress of four prominent schools -Sakhawat Memorial Girls' School in

them," Professor Rafigul Islam said. Pranotosh Bandopadhyay, a social worker from West Bengal, India said he was happy as the celebration of Bashanta had coincided with Anwara Bahar Chowdhury's birthday celebration.

Professor Dr. Parvin Hasan said: Anwara Bahar Chowdhury was a simple person, yet did remarkable work for the society. She maintained a family bond despite her busy life as a teacher and social worker.

Mafidul Haque proposed that an alumni association be formed by those who got Anwara Bahar Chowdhury as a Kolkata, Kamrunnesa Girls' High School in Dhaka, Bangla Bazar Government Girls' High School in Dhaka and Vidyamoyee Girls' High School in Mymensingh. She also worked as a Special Officer for Women's Education in the Education Directorate. Chowdhury became Secretary of Anjuman-e-Khawatin-e-Islam, or the All Bengal Muslim Women's Association established by Begum Rokeya. She was one of the founders of Bulbul Academy of Fine Arts (BAFA), and wrote books for children. Her collection of poems, "Amar Chetonar Rang" was published just before she passed away on October 27, 1987.

National Anthem competition held in Pabna

Swift shakes off copyright lawsuit

Taylor Swift's song about players playing and haters hating doesn't infringe on an earlier work addressing the same catchy behavior, a California federal judge ruled Tuesday.

The songwriters behind 3LW's 2001 hit "Playas Gon' Play" sued Swift in September, claiming "Shake It Off" infringes on their lyrics. At the time, a rep for the superstar said the complaint was nothing more than a ridiculous money grab.

US District Judge Michael Fitzgerald granted Swift's motion to dismiss the suit but is giving plaintiffs Sean Hall and Nathan Butler one shot to amend their complaint by February 26.

There's no dispute over whether Hall and Butler owned their lyrics, or that Swift's team had access to the song. There's also no allegation of copying the underlying musical composition. So Fitzgerald's analysis centers on whether there is substantial similarity between

protectable lyrics. Fitzgerald seems unconvinced Hall and Butler will be able to change his mind in the future, but he's allowing them to amend their complaint in case they intend to allege other similarities between the two works.

Sanjay Dutt returns as the gangster in "Saheb Biwi Aur Gangster 3" and the look is ever-too-familiar for his fans. The film is the third in the "Saheb Biwi Aur Gangster" franchise by Tigmanshu Dhulia. The first film, made in 2011, saw Randeep Hooda essaying the negative role while Irrfan Khan was roped in for the next one. Dutt will now play the negative role in the third film.

Sanjay Dutt made a name for himself playing grey characters in films such as "Khalnayak" (1993), "Vaastav" (1999), "Kaante" (2002), "Musafir" (2004) and "Agneepath" (2012).
