Ferries, pontoons rusting away

Useless 13 ferries, 11 pontoons under open sky getting damaged in Patuakhali

Thirteen ferries, 10 pontoons and two gangways, which have been out of operation, are getting damaged in different ferry terminals in the district.

There are nine terminals in the district, of which four are not operating as bridges have been built over the rivers. The bridges are all

on the Kuakata-Barisal highway.

Lawkathi river opened in 2005, and Sheikh Kamal Bridge over the Andharmanik river, Sheikh Jamal Bridge over the Sonatala river and Sheikh Russel Bridge over the Shibbaria river, all in Kalapara upazila, opened in 2015.

Though bridges were built and ferry services stopped, the ferries,

pontoons and gangways are still Shamimul Haque. There are two ferries each in

Boga and Galachipa terminals, three ferries and one pontoon each in Kalapara and Hajipur, two ferries and three pontoons in Mohipur, one ferry and five pontoons in Patuakhali, and two gangways in Hajipur, said district Ferry Division Executive Engineer

terminal area said the ferries are getting damaged by the salt water.

Sabbir Rahman of Hajipur area said parts of the ferry have been stolen as there is no guard. The authorities concerned should take immediate steps to repair the ferries or sell them to get revenue, he suggested.

"We sent several letters to the Patuakhali Bridge over the kept at those terminals. Md Jasim Uddin of Kalapara higher authorities about the matter, but in vain," said engineer Shamimul. "We will take steps after getting decision from the higher authorities," he added.

Teachers' shortage in Barguna primary schools

Academic and administrative activities at government primary schools in Barguna are being seriously hampered due to acute crisis of headmasters and assistant teachers.

According to district primary education office, 310 out of 810 government primary schools in six upazilas of the district are running without any regular headmaster for long.

Moreover, 337 posts of assistant teachers are also lying vacant, much to the sufferings of students and fellow teachers in the institution.

Of the 310 headmaster posts, 98 posts of headmasters are lying vacant in Barguna Sadar upazila, 79 in Amtali, 56 in Pathorghata, 39 in Taltali, 25 in Bamna and 13 in Betagi upazila, sources at the district primary education office said.

Besides, 75 posts of assistant teachers remained vacant in Pathorghata upazila, 65 in Sadar, 61 in Taltali, 56 in Bamna, 42 in Amtali and 38 in Betagi upazila.

While visiting Nishanbaria Government Primary School in Sadar upazila this correspondent saw only two teachers against five posts are running the academic activities of 105 students of the institution. Assistant teacher Nazma Begum, who has been serving as

acting headmaster of the school, often has to go to upazila and district education offices for administrative work and a single teacher runs all the five classes during that time, which is quite difficult.

Academic and administrative activities at the institution are greatly hampered due to shortage of a headmaster and assistant teachers, she said.

Headmaster Porimol Chandra of Deshantorkathi Government Primary School in Betagi upazila said they cannot teach their students properly due to acute crisis of teachers.

Headmaster of Uttar Gerabunia Government Primary School in Amtali upazila said it is very difficult to run an educational institution with only two teachers. Barguna District Primary Education Officer Md Robiul

Hossain said he has already informed the higher authorities about the vacant posts but yet to get any response.

Missing schoolboy found dead in Mymensingh OUR CORRESPONDENT,

A 10-year-old schoolboy

was found dead in Phulbaria upazila of the district on Tuesday, four days after he went missing on Friday. The deceased,

Muklesur Rahman, son of Ashraf Ali of Koyerchala village, was a Class III student at a local primary school in the upazila, police said. Police quoted victim's

family members as saying that Muklesur along with some of his friends went to attend an Urs, a religious gathering, about a kilometre away from his house on Friday evening and did not return home.

Failing to know his whereabouts, Muklesur's family members filed a general diary (GD) with Phulbaria Police Station on Monday, said Sheikh Kabirul Islam, officer-incharge (OC) of the police station.

Villagers spotted his body floating in a ditch at the village and informed police, who recovered the body and sent it to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital for autopsy, the OC said, adding that no injury mark was found on the body.

Motor parts trader turns successful farmer

A battery and motor parts trader in the city has turned into a fruit and vegetable farmer as he wanted to give his son fruit and vegetables that have not been treated by chemi-

"Rajin, my eight-year-old son, always wanted to eat fruits but I could not give him any because the fruits in the market are treated with chemicals. Then I started malta farming on some of my three acres of inherited land four years ago. Now I cultivate mango and bottle gourd. I have also started fish farming there," said Sadik Hossain, 40, of Dinar village in Sadar upazila.

"I have been farming bottle gourd for the last three years. I cultivated at least 300 plants in my farm and earned Tk 30,000 by selling the produce. I sell 80 to 100 gourds every week for Tk 40 to Tk 60 each. The season will continue up to March," he added.

"I do not use any chemicals in my garden because I know they are harmful," Sadik

District Department of Agricultural Extension (DAE) Deputy Director Fazlul Haque said over a hundred farmers of Sadar, Banaripara and Ujirpur upazilas have cultivated bottle gourd and earned huge profit.

He said DAE block supervisors advise farmers to cultivate vegetables, and cultivation is increasing.

Sadik told this correspondent that people, especially marginal farmers, are being benefited by bottle guard farming in this

According to DAE officials and farmers, bottle gourd farming has gradually gained popularity in the area in the last two or three years. Suitable weather, low production cost and good demand encouraged the farmers, they said.

One to die, 30 others jailed for killing in Bagerhat

The court also fines them Tk 20,000 each

A court here yesterday sentenced a man to death, and awarded life imprisonment to another and five years' imprisonment each to 29 others for killing Sohrab Hossain in Morrelganj upazila of the district in 2001.

The court also fined all of them Tk 20,000 each, in default, to serve one more year in jail.

Judge Md Zakaria Hossain of Bagerhat Additional District and Sessions Judge's Court-2 announced the verdict yesterday.

A gladiolus flower land in Piarpur area of Faridpur Sadar upazila.

Atahar Ali, alias Poran Babu, son of Yusuf Tarafdar of Dema village in Sadar upazila, was given death sentence and Abdur Rashid was given life time imprisonment, said Assistant Public Prosecutor Shita Debnath.

According to the case statement, a gang of 30 to 40 criminals, led by Poran and Yusuf, attacked the village home of Sohrab Hossain on June 18 in 2001 over a land dispute. They held the family members at gunpoint and exploded bombs to create panic.

When Sohrab tried to escape, the criminals shot and hacked him to death.

Victim's wife Kohinur filed a murder case with Morrelganj Police Station the same day.

Two alleged rapists land in jail

Two men accused in a gang-rape case were sent to the district jail yesterday. Senior Judicial Magistrate Waheduzzaman gave the order after police produced them before his court with a five-day remand prayer. The magis-

trate fixed February 18 for the hearing. The accused are Mahabub Hasan Samrat, 30, son of Zulfikar Haidar of Junail Pakkhimari village, and Hamidul Islam Likhon, 30, son of Farhad

Hossain of Gabergram Jhalupara village in Madarganj upazila. They were arrested in the upazila on Tuesday, said Officer-in-Charge of

Madarganj Police Station Rafiqul Islam. On Monday night, Samrat along with one of his accomplices on a motorbike picked up a 20-year-old married woman of Balijuri Panditpara village from in front of Brac office in the upazila and took her to his house. Samrat and six other people raped her overnight, said the OC.

Following a complaint filed by the victim's family members, police arrested the duo on Tuesday evening. The victim later filed a gang-rape case, accusing six people including Samrat and Likhon.

The other accused include Kabil, 33, Monohor, 32, Sohag, 35, and Shahinur, 30, of the upazila.

Flowers boon for farmers

The cultivation in Faridpur is getting popular as it is commercially profitatle

Profitable cultivation of flower is gaining popularity among farmers in Madhukhali and Sadar upazilas. They are now commercially cultivating gladiolus and marigold on their farmlands.

Gladiolus flower is harvested within 90 days and grows all the year round, said grower Md Anwar Hossain of Ghonoshampur village in Sadar upazila.

"I have been cultivating gladiolus on 16 decimals of land for four years and marigold on 60 decimals of land for three years," he said.

"At first Department of Agriculture Extension (DAE) in Faridpur gave me 2,000 seed of gladiolus four years back, but now I

can sell seed of gladiolus. I get Tk 2,000 profit from one decimal of land by farming gladiolus and marigold every year," said "Flower cultivation needs a good amount interested in cultivating flowers as it is more

started rose cultivation on 10 decimals of land from this year," he said. Moslam Uddin of Piarpur area said he

than traditional agricultural items. I also

has been cultivating gladiolus for three years after he did not get profit from his paddy field.

"I am now cultivating gladiolus on seven acres of land. I sell my flowers in the local market and Dhaka," he said. Sadar upazila Agriculture Officer Md

Abul Bashar Mia said flower cultivation has become very popular among the farmers of Ghonoshampur, Molikpur, Piarpur and Poranpur areas in Sadar upazila and Paikgachi and BoroGopaldi areas of Madhukhali upazila.

Deputy Director of Faridpur DAE Kartik Chandra Chakraborty said flowers are being cultivated on around 5 hectares of land in the district.

Farmers of different upazilas have been of investment as it is much more profitable profitable than other items.
