No Shaheed Minar in 284 madrasas

There are no Shaheed Minars in all the 284 madrasas in the district and a few of them observe Language Martyrs' Day and International Mother Language Day on February 21 by erecting Shaheed Minar with banana trees and holding doa mahfil (prayer meeting).

"We arrange only doa mahfil on the day but do not place wreaths at a Shaheed Minar as it is not allowed in our religion," said ANM Bazlur Rahman, principal of the 106-year-old Wayazabad Mostafavia Fazil (degree level) Madrasa in Sadar upazila. The madrasa does not have a Shaheed Minar.

Pangashia Nesaria Kamil (post graduate level) Madrasa in Dumki upazila was set up in 1940, but there is no Shaheed Minar on its premises.

"Our students observe the day by making temporary Shaheed Minar with banana trees as we have no fund to build a permanent structure," said Kazi Shah Jalal, principal of Dakkhin Muradia Mohila Fazil Madrasa.

Not only madrasas but also many primary schools, high schools and colleges in the district do not have Shaheed Minar.

Auliapur Sabina Akhter High School in Sadar upazila does not have a permanent Shaheed Minar, and the students observe Language Martyrs' Day and International Mother Language Day by making temporary Shaheed Minar with banana trees.

Monitoring Officer of the Primary Education Office M Ruhul Amin said they do know not how many schools and colleges in the district do not have Shaheed Minar.

Assistant District Education Officer Md Ruhul Amin said they asked every institution to observe the day with proper honour, but they have no data on how many educational institutions do not have Shaheed Minar.

Additional Deputy Commissioner for ICT and Education Nurul Hafij said they have asked all institutions to observe all national days properly, including Language Martyrs' Day and International Mother Language Day.

Missing trader's body found

The body of a man was recovered in Basail upazila yesterday, three days after he went missing.

The victim was Shamsuzzaman Khan Poton, 50, son of late Khorshed Ali Khan of Kanchanpur Paschimpara village and a sand trader.

Poton, who had an arrest warrant against him in a case filed with Basail Police Station, went to sleep at his cousin's house in the village on Friday night, said Tuhir Ali, OC (investigation) of the police station.

As Poton could not be traced since then, his family lodged a GD in this regard on Monday, he added.

Informed, police recovered the body from the well of an abandoned toilet beside Poton's cousin's house and sent it to Tangail General Hospital morgue for autopsy, he said, adding that injury marks were found on the body.

Withdraw land grabbing case or leave village

UP member threatens a Hindu family

A Hindu family in Fakiritokeya Balapara village of Sadar upazila is living in panic as they continued receiving death threat from a gang of land grabbers led by a union parishad member.

Mahfuz Alam, officer-in-charge of Sadar Police Station, confirmed the incident, saying that a general diary was filed in connection with the incident on Monday.

Contacted, UP member Sirazul Islam said if the Hindu family does not withdraw the case, they cannot stay in the village.

Victim Dinonath Chandra Barmon, 55, of the village, said a gang of land grabbers, led by Sirazul, continued giving death threat to him and his family members to withdraw the case.

Sub-Inspector SI Mainul Islam, also the investigation officer (IO) of the case, said some locals, allegedly led by UP member Sirazul, grabbed seven decimals of land belonging to Khagendranath Barman, son of Dinonath, and built a temporary tinshed house on it forcibly on January 29 this year. They also took away 120 bamboos after felling them, he said.

"The land grabbers put pressure on Khagendranath to sell his land but he

did not agree. Later, they demanded Tk 50,000 from him but he refused. They finally grabbed the land," the IO said, adding that a case was filed, accusing 10 people.

The accused include Majnu Miah, 40, of the same village, and UP member Sirazul. Police arrested Majnu on February 3 while other accused are on the bail.

"After inquiry, we will send the report to the court appealing to cancel the bail of the accused and then police will arrest them following the court order," said the OC.

They have already provided security to the victim family, he said.

4 'robbers' held with bombs

Police arrested four alleged robbers with bombs and swords at Hogoldanga in Chuadanga's Damurhuda upazila on Monday.

The arrestees are Hossain Ali, 27, of Jibonnagar upazila, Lavlu, 32, of Sadar upazila, Selim Uddin, 25, and Abdus Samad, 33, of Damurhuda upazila.

Ashraf Islam, sub-inspector of Detective Branch of police in Chuadanga, said informed that a gang were taking preparation to commit robbery on Chuadanga-Jhenidah highway around 11:30pm, the law enforcers raided the area and arrested four robbers.

They also recovered four swords and five bombs from the possession of the arrestees, said the SI.

2 held with fake Indian notes

Members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) arrested two brothers with counterfeit Indian currency from a mango orchard at Sat Roshia village in Shibganj upazila on Sunday.

The arrestees are Mohammad Ujjal, 28, and Mohammad Sujal, 24, sons of Mainul Islam of Housenagar village.

A team of Rab-5 from the district camp raided a mango orchard in Sat Roshia and arrested Ujjal and Sujal. Rab recovered around Rs 7 lakh counterfeit Indian currency, said Squadron Leader Mohammad Sayeed Abdullah Murad, commander of the Rab camp.

Rab handed them and the currency over to Shibganj Police Station.

Indian held with 2 kg gold

Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) arrested an Indian with four gold bars weighting two kg (worth Tk 1 crore) from Amrakhali area under Benapole Port Police Station yesterday.

Bird poacher fined

A mobile court fined a bird poacher and destroyed a huge quantity of nets and equipment used for trapping birds in Polobhangha water body in Hakaluki Haor area of Barlekha upazila under the district yesterday.
