Road crashes kill 9

At least nine people were killed in road accidents in five districts yesterday.

Six-year-old Monira was killed in Thakurgaon Sadar upazila when a battery-run autorickshaw hit the girl while she was crossing the road, police said.

In Pabna, Chobi Khatun, 27, was killed after a brick-laden tractor hit her in Pabna Sadar upazila, reports our correspondent. She was seriously injured and died on her way to hospital, police said quoting locals.

Police arrested the driver and seized the tractor.

In Chittagong, Manik Chakraborty, 55, was killed after a truck hit him while he was crossing the road on Chittagong-Dhaka highway, police said quoting locals.

In Shariatpur, three men including Saddam Hossain, 22, and Halim Hossain, 22, were killed and seven others injured after a truck carrying them plunged into a ditch in Vedarganj upazila, UNB reports.

The Shariatpur-bound truck was carrying construction materials and 10 labourers, police said. The injured were admitted to a local hospital, police added.

Also, head-on collision between a bus and a microbus on Dhaka-Khulna highway in Gopalganj Sadar upazila killed Jewel Ahmed, 24, and Imran Mollah, 20, on the spot, UNB said.

An injured, whose identity could not be known immediately, succumbed to his injuries at a local hospital, police said.

Coast Guard seizes smuggled Indian sarees, clothes

Remain alert to threats

PM asks army while addressing the force's event at Qadirabad Cantonment

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday directed the Bangladesh Army personnel to stay ready to face any external and internal threat to the country's constitution and sovereignty.

"You'll have to keep a constant vigil to... safeguard the country's constitution and sovereignty," she said.

The premier was addressing a parade of the sixth reunion of the Corps of Engineers of Bangladesh Army at the Engineer Centre and School of Military Engineering (ECSME) at Qadirabad Cantonment in Natore.

Hasina said the army will have to play an important role in building a developed and prosperous country.

She also emphasised maintaining peace and discipline. "You must remain alert so that the country's law and order is maintained."

Praising the army, she said their role in the UN peacekeeping missions has brightened the country's image. They have set a unique example in facing natural disasters as well as providing the affected people with assistance.

She also appreciated the army's role in

rendering services to the forcibly displaced Rohingyas.

Hasina described the engineer corps as an important and traditional organisation of the army.

To further strengthen the corps, she said the government has already constituted Engineer Construction Brigade and Engineer Battalion. Besides, the formation of RE Battalion, Engineer Construction Battalion and DIV Engineer Battalion is under process.

She expressed her optimism that experiences, guidelines and advices of the seniors at the reunion will inspire the army personnel to work with honesty, patriotism and dedication.

At the event, the prime minister was given a guard of honour by a smartly turned out army contingent.

Earlier on her arrival, she was received by Chief of Army Staff General Abu Belal Muhammad Shafiqul Huq and the colonel commandant and the commandant of the ECSME.

Later, she attended the annual commanders' conference of the engineer corps.

End child poverty to achieve SDGs

Prothom Alo discussion told

To achieve sustainable development goals (SDGs), immediate steps need to be taken to curb multidimensional poverty of children, said speakers at a seminar yesterday.

They also urged separate budget allocation for children.

They were addressing a roundtable titled "Multidimensional Poverty of Children" organised by Prothom Alo at its Karwanbazar office. Dr Shamsul Alam, member of General Economics Division of Bangladesh Planning Commission, said the education system needs to be remolded to eradicate multidimensional poverty.

Executive Director of Power and Participation Research Centre Hossain Zillur Rahman said for the eradication of multidimensional poverty, rural and urban children are needed to be differentiated as nature of their poverty is different. "It's more challenging to address multidimensional poverty of urban children," he said.

Carlos Acosta, country representative of Unicef Bangladesh, said the country has strong and clear policy in eradicating poverty. About 46 percent of children are poor but only 8 percent of social safety net is allocated for them, he added. Director (Safety) of Save the Children Laila Khandakar, social policy expert of Unicef Hasina Begum, and Associate Editor of Prothom Alo Abdul Qayyum, among others, spoke.
