GMB Akash's portrait exhibit underway

Eminent photographer GMB Akash is exhibiting a series of his works at the La Galerie of the Alliance Française de Dhaka (AFD). The exhibition, titled "Faces of Empowerment" and organised jointly by AFD and the Embassy of Denmark, was inaugurated on February 20.

Cultural Affairs Minister Asaduzzaman Noor graced the occasion as chief guest while Mikael Hemniti Winther, Ambassador of Denmark to Bangladesh attended the programme as special guest. In cooperation with the

Embassy of Denmark in Bangladesh, GMB Akash has captured 20 photos as part of the "Faces of Empowerment" series are portrayals of some of the poorest and most stigmatized people in Bangladesh. These are people, who have all been enrolled in Danishfunded development programmes in rural Bangladesh under Danida.

"Faces of Empowerment" shows the faces and tells the stories of people who prevailed when life was unlivable. They are stories of injustice, torture and broken families, but also stories of salvation, strength and economic empowerment.

Akash, with his signature style of striking portraits combined with touching, personal essays, gives these people a voice, offering a rare look into the lives and destinies that do not hit the headlines.

The guest of honor of the inauguration ceremony was 29-year old Rotna from rural Rajshahi. Rotna

endured mental and physical abuse at the hands of her husband and her in-laws for years. With help from a One-Stop-Crisis Centre at the local public hospital, she managed to escape the violence. Her husband was brought to justice through the One-Stop-Crisis Centre, which is supported by Danida. Today, Rotna owns a beauty parlour in her village and her children attend school.

The exhibition is open to all till February 26, from 3pm-9pm Monday to Thursday, and 9am-12 noon and 5pm-8pm on Fridays and Saturdays.

Zayn Malik teases new music on Instagram

British pop star Zayn Malik has dropped hints about new music on the horizon, in a series of Instagram posts. The former One Direction member uploaded five clips of him playing the piano on the social media app. The first video is simply captioned "Singing", the second reads "Part 2", and the third says "No mic", reports Complex. The other two are uploaded without a caption, adding to the cryptic rollout.

It's been two years since Malik dropped his debut solo album, "Mind of Mine". Back in September, he said he 'kind of finalized'

his sophomore album but he's still coming up with new ideas.

At the time, Malik also shared that he didn't have a title for his forthcoming album, but he plans on releasing it in an unorthodox way.

"It's kind of going to be something weird with it—I don't want to say more," he said. "It's not your usual way of putting out an album, let's say that."

It's been five months since Malik's last single, the Sia-featured track "Dusk Till Dawn" was released, which nabbed a Grammy Award for Producer of the Year (Non-Classical).

Joss Whedon exits DCEU's "Batgirl"

Joss Whedon has left as writer and director of the "Batgirl" movie for Warner Bros. and DC Entertainment, citing story issues as the reason for his departure.

"Batgirl is such an exciting project, and Warners/DC such collaborative and supportive partners, that it took me months to realize I really didn't have a story," Whedon said in a statement.

Whedon thanked DC president Geoff Johns and Warners Picture Group president Toby Emmerich, saying, "I'm grateful to Geoff and Toby and everyone who was

so welcoming when I arrived, and so understanding when I... uh, is there a sexier word for 'failed'?" Variety first reported

last March that Whedon had come on to "Batgirl" following a meeting between Whedon, studio exec Jon Berg, and Johns. Sources close to the

situation told Variety that the decision for Whedon to depart was a mutual one and reflects the studio's desire to seek more female directors - particularly on projects centered on female characters.

"Batgirl" has been a popular superhero for more than 50 years, but has never gotten her own movie. The movie was to be based on the Batgirl story that was first unveiled in DC Comics in 1967, when Barbara Gordon, the daughter of Gotham City police commissioner James Gordon, appeared as the character in "The Million Dollar Debut of Batgirl!" by writer Gardner Fox and artist Carmine Infantino.

With Whedon's departure, it's uncertain whether Warner Bros. will continue development of a "Batgirl" movie, says Variety. The project would be the second movie from DC Films to feature a female lead after Gal Gadot's "Wonder Woman" - one of the biggest box office hits of 2017. The studio is moving ahead with a "Wonder Woman" sequel with Gadot and director Patty Jenkins returning and has set

a November 1, 2019, release date. Warner Bros. has also been developing a "Gotham City Sirens" project with Margot Robbie

starring as her Harley Quinn character from "Suicide Squad" and David Ayer directing.

Whedon had seen considerable success in the Marvel Cinematic Universe, having written and directed 2012's "The Avengers" and 2015's "Avengers: Age of Ultron" for Disney-Marvel. He also created the television series "Buffy the Vampire Slayer", "Angel", "Firefly", "Dollhouse" and "Agents

of S.H.I.E.L.D." Whedon stepped in last spring to handle the

reshoots and finish "Justice League" for Warner Bros. last spring after director Zack Snyder publicly excused himself from the project, following his daughter's suicide in March.

"Aquaman", starring Jason Momoa, is the next title in the DC Extended Universe with a December 21 release date. "Wonder Woman 2" is the only other film in the DCEU that has been set for release.
