# Wheelchair-bound Neymar arrives in Brazil for surgery

Brazilian superstar Neymar flew into Rio de Janeiro early Thursday ahead of an operation on his fractured foot that

will sideline him for up to three months, casting a long shadow over Paris Saint-Germain and Brazil's World Cup preparations.

The world's most expensive player, 26, arrived on an Air France flight from Paris and left in a wheelchair, a photo taken by one of his fellow passengers showed.

Dressed in a black hoodie, a black baseball cap and wearing sunglasses, the PSG star smiled and took selfies with passengers, before leaving on a private jet to an undisclosed destination.

Surgery is booked for Saturday, said national team surgeon Rodrigo Lasmar, who will lead the procedure. But despite the hurry to put Neymar's right foot under the knife in Belo Horizonte, he won't be back on the field soon.

"The [recovery] period will be around two and a half to three months," Lasmar told journalists after arriving with the player on the same Air France flight.

"It's not a simple fracture, but a fracture in an important bone in the middle of the foot, "Lasmar said.

The injury has not only ruled Neymar out of PSG's do-or-die Champions League clash with Real Madrid on March 6, but now threatens the much fancied Brazilian national side's build-up to the World Cup, which starts in Russia on June 14.

The initial prognosis did not appear

quite as serious on Sunday, when run that risk." Neymar suffered a hairline fracture of the fifth metatarsal, as well as a twisted ankle in PSG's 3-0 win over Marseille in Ligue 1. On Tuesday, the Brazilian's father

"There was no doubt left regarding the treatment. We were unanimous in agreeing that it would have to be surgical treatment. More conservative treatment, without surgery, would present a far greater risk for refracture. We can't

PSG lost 3-1 to Real in the first leg of their European tie in Spain two weeks ago and are in danger of being knocked out of the competition in the last 16 for the second season running.

The drama is also a big personal setback for Neymar who has been at the centre of the world's footballing attention since his 222 million-euro move from Barcelona last August.

He has scored 28 goals in 30 appearances for PSG since arriving. But on Sunday he looked to be in tears as he was stretchered off the Parc des Princes.

Brazilians care little about the impact on PSG. Their attention is entirely trained on the World Cup, where they have ambitions of walking away with a sixth title.

"We just might have lost the World Cup last Sunday," one radio commentator, Milton Neves of Bandnews FM, said Wednesday.

Images of Sunday's fateful duel between Neymar and Marseille player Bouna Sarr were being shown incessantly on TV, often in slo-mo, before he was stretchered off.

"I don't think we can really talk about fears of him not being at the World Cup. But there is a noticeable haste to find a solution so that Neymar will have recovered in time," ESPN Brasil sports commentator Mauro Cezar Pereira told AFP.

# Floodlight familiarity

The national team yesterday began training under the newly-installed floodlights at the Maulana Bhasani Hockey Stadium with the aim of getting accustomed before possibly playing three matches in the

Qualifying Tournament of the Asian Games in Oman under lights. Bangladesh are scheduled to play one of

four Pool A matches against Hong Kong under floodlights while both the semifinal and final are also scheduled to be held at night in Oman, who will host the nine-team Qualifying Tournament from March 8 to 17.

Although the team started their preparations on January 13, yesterday's was their first training under floodlights and it will continue till the team departs for Oman on March 6. It was also the national team's first training

session under floodlights since the completion of the Asia Cup on October 22 last year. The home team could not practice under lights then due to late installation of the floodlights and had to practice in daylight.

"We will have a practice match under floodlights tomorrow [Friday], and then the players will have two more training sessions on March 4 and 5. Practicing under flood-

lights will help the boys become accustomed to playing the group match against Hong Kong," said coach Mahbub Harun before training at the Big Bowl yesterday.

Bangladesh will play a practice match against Kazakhstan on March 7 under floodlights before starting their campaign against Afghanistan on March 9. The Bangladesh Hockey Federation

attempted to bring South Korea to Dhaka for a few practice matches, but they did not respond due to their domestic engagements. The hockey team were also supposed to go to India for preparation matches but the plan was dropped due to 'huge expenditure'.

However, Harun believes the practice match against Kazakhstan will be good for his charges as they are from the Russian bloc.

"We chose Kazakhstan because they are a good side and their players once played for Russia. In the 1993 Asia Cup, Kazakhstan drew 2-2 with India but Bangladesh beat Kazakhstan in group stage. Interestingly, Bangladesh then lost to Kazakhstan in the fifth-sixth placing-deciding match. So, they are expected to be a good team," said Harun.

Bangladesh were drawn in Pool A alongside Indonesia, Afghanistan, Thailand and Hong Kong while Pool B consists of hosts Oman, Sri Lanka, Chinese Taipei and Kazakhstan.



The referee was merely doing what was asked of him by those who have authorised the trial of VAR in some FA Cup and League Cup ties, but it opened the official to heavy criticism.

# Griezmann hits Leganes for four

Frenchman sets sights on Barca

Antoine Griezmann made it back-to-back hat-tricks by putting four goals past Leganes and now Atletico Madrid's star striker has Barcelona in his sights.

Atletico and their French maestro go up against the La Liga leaders on Sunday and will arrive brimming with confidence after subjecting Leganes to a 4-0 demolition, with Griezmann again the star of the show. His quadruple, fired off in 32 minutes either side of half-

time, means he now has seven goals in two games following last weekend's treble against Sevilla, and 12 in his last nine. For comparison, Lionel Messi has hit five goals in the same period. Atletico have cut the gap at the top of La Liga to four

points, but Barcelona have a game in hand at Las Palmas. However, Griezmann will be the player in focus before the weekend. "I've never scored at Camp Nou. I want to score and to celebrate," Griezmann said. "I want to do some-

thing big with my club and my opportunity." In the 25th minute, a defence splitting pass from Koke set Griezmann away and, after shrugging off the scrambling Gumbau, he slid the ball past Ivan Cuellar. Ten minutes later he was celebrating his second. Again he had Koke to thank, the midfielder winning the foul after a brilliant flick on the edge of the area and this time Griezmann dispatched

the free-kick with a curling shot into the corner. Leganes' early impetus was now extinguished and 10 minutes into the second half, Griezmann completed his hattrick.

After nonchalantly allowing Costa's pass to run through his legs and reach Filipe Luis, Griezmann darted into the box, jumped high and met the cross with a bullet header into the net.

If his first three goals demonstrated speed, technique and movement, Griezmann's fourth owed much to a slice of luck, a mishit finish from Costa's cross.
