### Ferdousi Priyabhashini passes away

Another tragedy struck the nation deeply as Freedom Fighter, eminent sculptor and outstanding personality Ferdousi Priyabhashini passed away yesterday at 12:45pm. Cultural Affairs Minister Asaduzzaman Noor, MP; writer-researcher and Ekattorer Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee

President Shahriar Kabir and others shared many aspects of her life and art.

"Ferdousi Priyabhashini was a free will. During her twilight months, she went through many physical complications. She always held the conscience of Liberation War in all the phases of her art and life. She was an active voice for the justice of war criminals and human rights. A piece of Bangladesh is represented in every work by her. We have lost a vital voice of our Liberation War," said Cultural Affairs Minister Asaduzzaman Noor.

"Ferdousi Priyabhashini was with us from the very beginning of the Ekattorer Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee movement, where she was the vice-president. We paid her citizens' ovation at Bangladesh National Museum in 1999, when she decided to publicly describe the atrocities she went through by the Pakistani occupational forces in 1971 and none could hold their tears. Thus she established the status of Birangonas as Freedom Fighters in our society, and we published the

testimony of her persecution. She held war children close to her heart and proudly declared that she was their mother. As a sculptor she took her artwork to new heights. She transformed many left-over materials of nature into art. Her passing was untimely and her absence will never be filled," shared Shahriar Kabir.

Shilpacharya Abanindranath Tagore," said Rabiul Hussain, art critic and architect.

"Ferdousi Priyabhashini was the first one to publicly announce herself as a Birangona, a term coined by Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. This shook the world. As an honest and courageous personality, she struggled through her entire life

February 1947 in Khulna,

Kamal, and anchored by Syed
Shamsul Haque. Priyabhashini married Ahsanullah Ahmed in 1972.
Together they have three sons and
three daughters.

the Shadhinata Padak by the Government of Bangladesh in 2010.

#### Dwindling audience results in the closure of 17 cinema halls

Seventeen cinema halls in Faridur district have recently stopped screening films due to a dwindling audience.

On a recent visit in Rajbari town, The Daily Star correspondent found that the district's largest cinema hall, Bushundhara at Boropul Mor area, had been brought down as the cinema hall authorities had sold out. The hall will make way for a multi-storied building.

Other movie theatres are also in trouble. Tofajjal Hossan Mia, owner of Sadhona Cinema Hall said, "I used to own seven cinema halls in the district but had to close them all due to the lack of audiences."

He added that he made profits only during Eid. He had several other grouses: one was the popularity of YouTube films that people could view on their mobile phones. "On the other hand, our films cannot draw audiences, because the stories are not up to the mark. However, Indian films draw a crowd and are greatly enjoyed. The government and film producers should take initiatives to make better films." he said.

Chitra cinema hall in Rajbari town said, "Chitra was the first cinema hall in Rajbari town. After that four other halls came up in the town. But now only one movie theatre screens films regularly. I lost my job four years ago as Chitra cinema hall building was declared unsafe. After that my family faced much hardship. Now I run a small betel leaf shop.

Monowar Hossan, a resident of Baliakandi upazila, said, "Film shows began in Baliakandi Upazila at Lolita Cinema hall in 1984. After that cinema halls gathered momentum. Post 2006, there was a major slump. Lolita cinema hall closed down in 2010 due to lack of audience, while the upmarket Modhumoti cinema hall stopped screening films for two and half years because the owners ran into trouble. Most of the cinema halls are now being used as jute godowns."

Similar stories have unravelled in other areas of the district as well.


# From Experimental Theatre Hall to Theatre Olympics in India
